St. Clair College Saints Athletics Sept 18, 2021

Saints Women's Softball Move to 4-0 after Pair of Wins in London

London, ON – The St. Clair College Women's Softball team bumped their OCAA record to 4-0 after earning two more wins on Saturday in London. The Saints bested Durham College (Oshawa) by a score of 5-4 and then rolled over Mohawk College (Hamilton) 16-0 in a mercy shortened 3-innings.

St. Clair trailed Durham 4-3 in the 5th inning but scored a pair to overtake the lead and hold on down the stretch. 3rd year pitcher Rya Cowan (LaSalle, ON/Sandwich) picked up the win with 4 innings of relief work giving up just two hits an no earned runs while striking out one Durham batter and issuing two free passes. Cowan also had a double in the pivotal 5th inning to drive in the tying run.

Starting pitcher Amy Claydon (Cambridge, ON) moved over to first base defensively but had a big day at the plate with three hits and two RBI's. 2nd year transfer Jacklyn Yewchyn (Windsor, ON/St. Thomas of Villanova) pinch hit and drove in the go-ahead run in the 5th inning.

In the lopsided win over Mohawk rookie chucker Allison Dufour (Amherstburg, ON/General Amherst) only had to pitch three innings but surrendered just a pair of hits while striking out two batters.

Offensively St. Clair's hit total finished at 20 for the contest with centerfielder Judy Lafleur (Essex, ON/Essex District) leading the parade reaching base four times including a double and two RBI's while scoring three times. Shortstop Shae-Lyn Murphy (Windsor, ON/Holy Names) had three hits and three runs to go with two RBI's.

Claydon kept her hot bat going with a pair of hits and four RBI's while 1st year catcher Julia Brusseau (Lakeshore, ON/St. Anne) had three singles and an RBI for the Saints.

St. Clair remains in London to complete the league round robin event on Sunday facing Seneca College (North York) at 10:30am at Fanshawe College and then move


over to Stronach Park to face Humber College (Etobicoke) at 2:00pm.

St. Clair College Women's Softball Christen New Diamond with Sweep

Windsor, ON – The St. Clair College Women's Softball team broke in the new SportsPark diamond with a doubleheader sweep of Humber College (Etobicoke) Friday night by scores of 11-1 and 14-5.

The Saints wasted no time in the opener and put up 8 runs in the first inning forcing a pitching change. After a pair in the second inning and a single in the fourth St. Clair needed only the minimum 5 innings to create a mercy shortened final. Humber could only muster 1 hit off Saints starting pitcher Amy Claydon (Cambridge, ON) that led to their lone run in the second inning. Claydon threw four strong innings and struck out 5 Humber batters with just one walk.

Shortstop Shae-Lyn Murphy (Windsor, ON/Holy Names) was a catalyst for the Saints with three hits including an opening at bat double and scoring two runs to go with an RBI. Third baseman Sarah Vellinga (Chatham, ON) also notched three singles and a drove in a pair with second baseman Riley Csabai (LaSalle, ON/Holy Names) getting two hits and two RBI's. Centerfielder Judy Lafleur (Essex, ON/Essex District) had a big triple in the first inning that drove in three of her four RBI's in the game.

In game two, St. Clair started strong again with five runs in the opening frame and another two in the second inning. Humber scored three of their own in the second to keep it close, but the Saints were on their way to another 10-hit game and were never really in trouble. Murphy was brilliant again with four hits including an inside the park homerun accounting for her two RBI's as part of her four runs scored.

Claydon started the second game on the rubber again for the Saints getting the win but contributed two doubles and four RBI's at the plate. Julia Brusseau (Lakeshore, ON/St. Anne) had two hits including a triple and scored three runs while adding an RBI for St. Clair.

The Saints travel to London Saturday to play a round robin league event over the weekend that sees them face four different opponents in two days. Durham College (Oshawa) and Mohawk College (Hamilton) are on the schedule Saturday with Seneca College (North York) and Humber College on Sunday. The games will be

split between the campus diamond at Fanshawe College and Stronach Park each day.

London, ON – In the early stages of the OCAA season the St. Clair College Women's Softball team have established themselves as the team to beat finishing their opening weekend 6-0 after two more wins on Sunday in London. In the morning, the Saints beat Seneca College (North York) 12-2 in a mercy shortened five innings at the Fanshawe College campus diamond and then shutout Humber College (Etobicoke) in the afternoon by a score of 6-0 at Stronach Park.

In the am game Sunday, St. Clair put the game out of reach early scoring all 12 of their runs in the first inning. After they relinquished two runs to Seneca in the 3rd inning the mercy still became effective in the fifth inning. 3rd year pitcher Rya Cowan (LaSalle, ON/Sandwich) went the distance giving up two runs on six hits while striking out two batters with no walks. 4th year transfer Amy Claydon (Cambridge, ON) and 2nd year transfer Jacklyn Yewchyn (Windsor, ON/St. Thomas of Villanova) each had three hits in the contest. Claydon had two RBI's while Yewchyn cashed in three runs which included a first inning double that scored a pair. In the afternoon win over Humber the Saints relied on rookie Allison Dufour (Amherstburg, ON/General Amherst) who pitched a complete game shutout and only allowed one hit while striking out nine batters with just one walk. St. Clair had 12 hits in the game scoring twice in the 3rd inning, three times in the 5th and a single in the 6th. Half of the Saints hits came from Judy Lafleur (Essex, ON/Essex District) and Claydon who pushed her league leading average to 0.667. Lafleur had a double and an RBI while Claydon pushed across four runs and had a double also.



Dufour helps lead the Saints into provincials


The accolades were aplenty for a St. Clair softball team that finished 17-1 during the regular season.





St. Clair College Women's Softball Settle for Silver at Home

Windsor, ON – Durham College (Oshawa) was able to hold off host St. Clair College for their 21st gold medal Saturday with a 9-inning 8-7 victory at the Ontario Colleges Athletic Association Women's Softball Championship. This was the 9th time the two schools have met in the championship final since 2005.

The Saints needed a 10-0 win over Humber College (Etobicoke) in a mercy shortened five innings on Saturday morning to advance to the gold medal round. St. Clair scored four runs in the 1st inning and never looked back tacking on two runs in the 4th along with the deciding four runs in the 5th. The Saints allowed just four hits but six errors by Humber led to their demise. Amy Claydon (Cambridge, ON) clubbed two homeruns to pick up Player of the Game honours for St. Clair as part of her three RBI's. Judy Lafleur (Essex, ON) proved to be a catalyst with two hits adding two RBI's and scored three times for the Saints. Allison Dufour (Amherstburg, ON) spread out four hits over her five innings with a walk and a strikeout to pick up the pitching win for St. Clair. Jorja Berney (Mississauga, ON) had a hit for Humber on her way to Player of the Game award for Humber.

In the afternoon gold medal final Durham jumped ahead 5-0 after two innings forcing the Saints to get into comeback mode. St. Clair scored twice in the 4th inning, but Durham added a run in their half for a 6-2 lead. The Saints pulled within 6-3 in the 5th inning setting the stage for some late game heroics. Just when they needed it most St. Clair produced five hits in the 7th inning with the big blow coming from Jacklyn Yewchyn (Windsor, ON) who drove in a pair on a double to the wall that tied the game at 6-6. The teams traded runs in the 8th inning, but St. Clair was held scoreless in the top of the 9th. In their bottom half Durham loaded the bases and were able to manufacture a sacrifice fly to score the go-head walk-off run.

Yewchyn was named St. Clair's Player of the game finishing with two hits and three RBI's. Shae-Lyn Murphy (Windsor, ON) had two singles and a double with an RBI while teammate Lafleur also collected three hits to go with an RBI.

Natalie Clemens (Mormora, ON) was the Durham Player of the Game after scoring twice on a single and a walk, but teammate Alexis Pereira (Newmarket, ON) was five for five including a double with an RBI while Grace Hearns (Napanee, ON) was three for four with an RBI and a run scored.




