St. Clair College Saints Athletics Monday at 10:21 Women's Softball Open OCAA Season with Four Wins

Windsor, ON – The St. Clair College Women's Softball team collected four wins to open their 2022 OCAA season including a pair on Saturday in Hamilton and two victories on Sunday at the SportsPark campus diamond.


Saturday's first win came over host Mohawk College in the morning by a 12-2 margin followed by a 17-2 defeat of Conestoga College (Kitchener) in the afternoon. Rookie pitcher Mckenna Copley (Dover Centre, ON) collected the win over Mohawk as the starter but was helped by Rya Cowan (LaSalle, ON/Sandwich) in relief as the duo surrendered only two hits combined while striking out 9 batters. Offensively the Saints battered 21 hits total with outfielder Tiana LaChance (South Woodslee, ON/Essex) leading the way in a 4 for 4 game while adding 3 runs scored. Shortstop Shae-Lyn Murphy (Windsor, ON/Holy Names), outfielder Judy Lafleur (Essex, ON/Essex District), third basemen Bryanna Kressler (Kitchener, ON) and centerfielder Sierra Baltzer (LaSalle, ON/Sandwich) all had 3 hits apiece with Murphy driving in 4 runs.

In the Conestoga win, the Saints needed just three innings to force the mercy as Claydon took the win on the pitching strip while adding a home run at the plate with 3 runs driven across the plate. LaChance moved her consecutive hit streak on the season to 6 with a double and a single to go with 3 RBIs with teammate Kressler knocking in 6 runs with three hits including a pair of triples.

In the home openers on Sunday St. Clair held their opponents scoreless with a 14-0 morning win over Lambton College (Sarnia) and finished off the day with an 11-0 victory over Fanshawe College (London) in the afternoon. Baltzer and Claydon each clubbed a home run in the Lambton win with Baltzer collecting 4 RBIs on a 3-hit day. Cowan earned her first pitching win of the season in short work over 3 innings.

Copley carried a no-hit bid into the 5th inning in the Fanshawe victory but settled for a shutout as the offense forced 2021 OCAA Pitcher of the Year out of the game after seven runs crossed the plate in the first four innings. Kressler cleared the bases with a double as Claydon and Jacklyn Yewchyn (Windsor, ON/St. Thomas of Villanova) each notched a pair of hits and RBI's.

The Saints take their OCAA leading 4-0 record on the road next weekend continuing their league schedule with doubleheaders at Humber College (Etobicoke) on Saturday and Sheridan College (Brampton) on Sunday.





## Host St. Clair plays into CCSA National Championship Final Against UWO





Windsor, ON – Day 2 of the Canadian Collegiate Softball Association National Championship hosted by St. Clair College saw the Saints (3-0) and the University of Western Ontario Mustangs (3-0) finish in the top spot of their pools to create a collision course on their way to the Gold Medal final on Sunday. See below a recap of each game played on Saturday of the National tournament.



#### University of Toronto vs. Durham Lords

The first game of the day at the SportsPark Diamond was critical for both teams as Toronto and Durham were fighting to stay in medal contention, with the winner advancing to the Championship Quarterfinal. In a tightly contested matchup, both teams exchanged blows early leaving the game all tied up at 2-2 after three innings of play. In the bottom of the 5<sup>th</sup> inning, Durham took the lead on an RBI from Player of the Game Jocelyn Shelton (Aylmer, ON) before tacking on another run in the 6<sup>th</sup> inning to take a 4-2 lead. Lords Pitcher Emily Glendinning (Plattsville, ON) threw a complete game 6 hitter, giving up 2ER and recording 4 Ks for the victory. Player of the Game for the Varsity Blues went to Pitcher Katie Humhej (Surrey, BC) in a losing effort. With the win, Durham advanced to the Championship Quarterfinals to take on the Calgary Dinos at 4pm at the SportsPark

Diamond. With the loss, Toronto will face off with the Ottawa Gee Gees at 3pm at Acumen Stadium to determine seeding for 7th and 8th place in the tournament.

The Ottawa Gee Gees will take on the Toronto Varsity Blues in the 7<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> place game.

#### St. Clair College vs. University of British Columbia Okanagan

In a rematch of last year's National Championship Final, the St. Clair Saints went toe to toe with UBCO for top spot in Pool A and a bye to the semi-finals tonight at 8pm. Pitchers Bryanna Kressler (Kitchener, ON) and Sheyanne Lawrence (Kelowna, BC) came out throwing gas, holding these powerful lineups scoreless through 2 innings. In the 3<sup>rd</sup> inning, the St. Clair lineup gave Kressler all the support she would need, tallying 6 runs in the top half to take a commanding 6-0 lead. In the final pool play game of the tournament, the Calgary Dinos defeated the Humber Hawks 7-5 to earn 2<sup>nd</sup> place in the pool. The Dino bats were feasting early scoring all 7 runs in the first 4 innings as they never gave the Hawks a chance to settle into the contest. Humber was able to score 4 runs in the 4<sup>th</sup> to narrow the gap to 2 but that was as close as they would get in this one, dropping the game to Calgary to finish 3<sup>nd</sup> in Pool B. Chloe Maher (Delta, BC) of Calgary went 2-3 at the dish with 2Rs and 1RBI to earn herself the Player of the Game for the winning side. Shea Hilpert (Waterloo, ON) had a stellar performance for the Hawks going 3-4 with 3RBI in a loser effort, as she was awarded Player of the Game for Humber. With little time to lick their wounds, the Humber Hawks will quickly move diamonds to take on the defending CCSA Champs UBCO in a loser leaves town quarterfinal contest. The UBCO Heat clinched a berth into the semifinals with a wild 6-5 victory over the Humber Hawks. Both teams traded blows over the first 6 innings, but the drama ensued in the top of the 7<sup>th</sup>, as UBCO held onto a 6-3 lead going into the last frame. The Hawks put together quality at-bat after quality at-bat before Alexis Ferreira (Mississauga, ON) came to the dish with the bases loaded and only 1 out. Ferreira roped a single into left field to score 2 runners and advanced to second base on the throw home to pull the Hawks within 1 run.

1B Jessica MacPherson (Essex, ON) came to the plate with the tying run on 3<sup>rd</sup> and the go-ahead run on 2<sup>nd</sup> with a chance to pull Humber even in the national quarterfinal. UBCO called upon star pitcher Meagan Muir (Okotoks, AB) to slam the door for the Heat and that is what she did in epic fashion. MacPherson hit a rocket comebacker to Muir on the mound who caught it for the out and doubled off the runner at third base to clinch the game for her squad. Middle Infielder Cheyenne Simicak (Surrey, BC) was named Player of the Game for the Heat going 2-4 at the plate with 1R, 1RBI and some very timely defense for her squad. Ferreira was named Player of the Game for the Hawks going a perfect 4-4 at the plate with 4RBI and 1R. The UBCO Heat continue their quest to defend their National Championship as they look ahead to their semifinal matchup with the Western Mustangs at 6pm on the SportsPark Diamond.

In the second quarterfinal matchup of the afternoon, the defending OCAA Champion Durham Lords defeated the Calgary Dinos 7-2 to secure a spot in the CCSA semifinals against the host St. Clair Saints.

Durham opened up the scoring in the top of the 1st inning with a Abi Suffel (Whitby, ON) RBI single to give her squad the 1-0 lead and the Lords never looked back from there. The Lords went on to tally 3 more runs in the 3rd inning courtesy of a Hannah Oke (Brooklin, ON) RBI double and a Kaylen Wilson (Pickering, ON) 2 run single to stretch the lead to 4-0. #### University of British Columbia Okanagan vs. University of Western Ontario



DAY 2 COMPLETE AT 2022 OCAA WOMEN'S SOFTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP....Posted: Oct 21, 2022

LONDON, Ont. - On the second day of the 2022 OCAA Women's Softball Championship, the top four teams in the province took to Alumni Field in London to battle for a spot in Saturday's medal games.

In the first game of the day, the Durham Lords struck first with an RBI double from **Jocelyn Shelton** to open the scoring. Teammates **Sydney Redick and Hannah Oke** singled to make the score 3-0. The Hawks came back in the bottom of the second inning with **Rilee Devries** scoring on a wild pitch followed by **a Hannah Koziolek** RBI single to make the score 3-2. A sacrifice fly from Shelton gave Durham another run on the board in the top of the fourth frame, but Humber quickly responded with one of their own to make the score 4-3. Humber pitcher **Meagan Muir** caught a line drive to close out the top of the fifth inning to keep the Hawks within reach. The Hawks had the bases loaded in the bottom of the sixth, but they were unable to capitalize. Durham relief pitcher Oke was able to hold Humber scoreless in the seventh to give the Lords the 4-3 victory. Oke was named the Player of the Game for Durham and their winning pitcher was Redick. Koziolek was named the Player of the Hawks. Humber pitcher Muir took the loss.

Friday's second game saw host Fanshawe face the undefeated OCAA league champion St. Clair saints. St. Clair scored one in the first inning to get on the board first. Fanshawe's **Morgan Lowry** then struck out three straight Saints in the second frame. St. Clair extended their lead in the third with a two-RBI double by OCAA Women's Softball Player of the Year, Bryanna Kressler. Lowry then had a huge triple to centerfield to score **Madeline Pappas**. Lowry continued to be a force on the mound, striking out multiple Saints to keep the Falcons within striking distance. Unfortunately, excellent pitching from St. Clair's Player of the Game Kressler secured the 3-1 victory for the Saints. Despite having 10 strikeouts, Lowry suffered the loss for the Falcons but was named the Player of the Game for the home team. The Falcons gave the undefeated Saints their closest game of their season, but their hard-fought efforts ultimately fell short of the upset.

The third game of the day would see the Falcons and Humber battle in an elimination game. Humber came out strong in the first inning, scoring on a pair of errors and an **Amelia Russo** RBI single to take an early 3-0 lead off of Fanshawe starting pitcher **Jada Doxtator**. Sara Reading singled to left field in the top of the second frame to score one for the home squad. Lowry came on in relief to start the third inning for the Falcons and held the Hawks to two hits the rest of the way, striking out nine. Humber was able to extend their lead with a run in the sixth frame to make the score 4-1. Muir held the Falcons offence to only three hits to advance to Saturday's medal games. The loss for Fanshawe eliminated them from the tournament. Muir was the Player of the Game for Humber. Reading was named the Player of the Falcons.

In the final game of the day, with a ticket directly to the gold medal game on the line, St. Clair's Kressler set the tone early against Durham. Her two-RBI triple off of Lords pitcher **Morgan Salter** got the Saints out to a quick start. Kressler then scored on a wild pitch to make the score 3-0 in the first inning. St. Clair's **Sierra Baltzer** scored on an error to get the offence going again in the second frame. A Kressler sacrifice fly then scored OCAA All-Star **Shae-Lyn Murphy**. Baltzer crossed the plate for the second time that inning to make the score 6-0 on a wild pitch. With the bases loaded in the bottom of the third, Murphy and Baltzer had back-to-back singles. Then OCAA batting champion **Amy Claydon** stepped to the plate and hit a bases clearing double to extend the lead to 11-0. The Saints won the game in five innings. The win secured a berth in Saturday's OCAA gold medal game for the Saints. Durham starter Salter took the loss and **Ryleigh Easton** was named the Player of the Game for the Lords. The winning pitcher for St. Clair was OCAA Rookie of the Year, **Mckenna Copley** and Murphy was named the Player of the Game for St. Clair.

The championship wraps up on Saturday, where St. Clair will play the winner of Durham and Humber, who meet in the bronze medal game at 10 a.m. The OCAA bronze medal will be awarded to the loser of the game and the winner will advance to the gold medal championship at 1 p.m. and 3 p.m. (if necessary) in the double knockout format. 

#### SAINTS TAKE IMPROBABLE ROUTES TO OCAA SOFTBALL TITLE AS WELL AS BASEBALL TITLE

The St. Clair Saints took improbable routes to both an OCAA softball title as well as a baseball title.

The softball team completed an unbeaten season by rolling through the OCAA championship to win gold in London. Meanwhile, the baseball team became the first OCAA club to record three-straight wins on the final day to rally to take the title in the double-knockout tournament.



"I think this is going to be a moment in history," Saints' outfielder Judy Lafleur said of the two titles.

Lafleur, who is from Essex, had two hits and drove in two runs to earn game MVP honours in the gold-medal match, which St. Clair took 4-0 over the Durham Lords.

"It's great team to be a part of," Lafleur said. "I don't think I've ever seen this much talent on a team. It's amazing to be a part of this experience."

St. Clair rolled through regular-season play with a perfect 24-0 record. The team went 5-0 to claim its first Canadian Collegiate Softball Association national title since 2015 earlier this month.

At the OCAA tournament, the Saints added another three wins to push the team's record to 32-0. St. Clair opened with an 11-0 win over Durham on Saturday and then edged Fanshawe 3-1 to go directly to the gold-medal final. Durham needed to beat the Saints twice in the double-knockout tournament to claim the title, but St. Clair took care of business immediately.

"I definitely felt it was the most talented team we've ever assembled and now you can put a stamp on it as the best ever assembled," said Saints' head coach Doug Wiseman, who saw the team claim its first title since 2014. "They play with respect, class and give 100 per cent effort all the time."

Pitcher Bryanna Kressler allowed just four hits over seven innings while striking out seven to earn tournament MVP honours. Shortstop Shae-Lyn Murphy and first baseman Amy Claydon were named to the tournament all-star team. It was a far more daunting road for the baseball team to its seventh OCAA title in the least nine years and it started early Saturday with a comeback 10-9 win over Fanshawe just to get a crack at the gold medal.

St. Clair trailed 5-0 in the game, but first baseman Colin Robinson homered twice and drove in three runs to spark the rally. "I've got to give a lot of credit to the guys," Saints' manager Roberto Duncan said. "They stood out and did things properly on the last day. "A lot of guys were injured, we were running out pitchers, but we had a lot of guys do a little bit of everything." That put the Saints up against Humber, which had reached the final by beating St. Clair 12-3 on Friday. The second-seeded Saints, who hosted the event at Lacasse Park, needed to beat the top-seeded Hawks twice in order to secure the gold medal in the double-knockout tournament.

"We had some scary moments," Robinson said. "Beating Humber's hard, but we knew, if anyone was doing it, it was us. "We all had that moment of, 'Why not us?' No one had ever done it that way (beating the unbeaten team in back-to-back games), but we knew we could do it." A nine-run first inning and 14-hit attack paced the Saints to an 11-6 win in the first game. Trailing by a run in the fifth inning, the Saints exploded for five runs and went on to a 10-4 victory in the second game to clinch the gold medal.

"An unbelievable day and season," Robinson said. "We didn't do anything easy. Everything we got was hard fought and to win three games on Saturday sums it up. We don't give up."
