WISEMAN NAMED OCAA COACH OF THE YEAR

TORONTO - Doug Wiseman of St. Clair College has been named the inaugural Ontario Colleges Athletic Association (OCAA) Coach of the Year. Wiseman was at the helm of a Saints team that completed a historic women's softball season in 2022.

The Saints have been a traditional powerhouse for almost two decades, earning OCAA medals in 15 of the last 16 seasons entering 2022. But the Saints had been stuck with the bridesmaids label as of late, with four trips to the last five OCAA gold medal games with only silver to show for it. St. Clair's last OCAA championship came in 2014.

All signs pointed to a change in script early in the 2022 OCAA regular season, when St. Clair outscored its opposition 53-4 against its first four opponents. When the Saints opened a doubleheader with a 3-0 win against another perennial medalist Humber before a 16-4 victory in the nightcap on Sept. 17, St. Clair looked well on its way to the regular season championship. In a Sept. 25 doubleheader against defending OCAA champion and nemesis Durham, St. Clair swept the twin bill by scores of 8-0 and 7-0 for 12 straight wins.

St. Clair went on to defeat Humber and Durham again in single games to begin October, and following a doubleheader sweep of Conestoga by a 26-0 aggregate on Oct. 15, the Saints completed a perfect regular season. While teams have gone undefeated before in OCAA women's softball (the last coming in 2011), no team had come close to the 24-0 record compiled by St. Clair in a single season.



St. Clair broke three OCAA team regular season records including most RBI in a season (253), most hits in a season (318), and most runs in a season (277). Perhaps even more impressive was the 20 total runs allowed, less than one per game.

The record would only be a footnote in history had St. Clair not continue its historic run at the OCAA championship. St. Clair opened play with a 3-1 win against a pesky Fanshawe team, then in back-to-back games against Durham, won by a combined score of 15-0 to win its fifth OCAA championship in program history.

Not surprisingly, St. Clair swept the OCAA women's softball major awards, headlined by Wiseman's fifth OCAA Coach of the Year selection. The Saints also won the Canadian Collegiate Softball Association national title, and completed the entire season (exhibition, regular season and championship) with an overall record of 34-0.

The OCAA has expanded its season ending awards to include an athletic administrator, coach and rookies in addition to its traditional athletes of the year. Winners will be honoured at the 10th OCAA Hall of Fame ceremony, to be held at the St. Clair College Centre for the Arts in Windsor, Ont., on Monday, May 1.

KRESSLER NAMED OCAA FEMALE ATHLETE OF THE YEAR

TORONTO - Bryanna Kressler of St. Clair College has been named the Ontario Colleges Athletic Association (OCAA) Female Athlete of the Year.

The reigning OCAA Women's Softball Player of the Year was a duel threat for the Saints at the plate and from the pitcher's circle. With a bat Kressler (Kitchener) had a regular season slash line of .529/.563/1.023 setting a new OCAA single season record with 45 runs scored while also contributing \$1.881. Kressler's 46 hits included 14 doubles, 10 triples and three home runs.

From the rubber the fourth-year player made six starts going 6-0, allowing just one earned run over 34 innings of work for a 0.21 ERA, striking out 48. In addition, Kressier was named the OCAA Pitcher of the Year and headlined the OCAA League First-Team All-Stars.

Kressler was the top player on a team that simply had an historic season. The Saints completed its entire 2022 season (exhibition, regular season and championship) with an unblemished record of 34-0.

St. Clair went 24-0 during the regular season, the most wins without a loss in OCAA history. The Saints then won three straight postseason games to win their first OCAA title since 2014. St. Clair also won the Canadian Collegiate Softball Association (CCSA) national title, again without suffering a loss.



Kressler was named OCAA Championship MVP allowing no earned runs in a pair of complete games, including a shutout in the gold medal game. Kressler allowed just five hits in 14 innings, striking out 20 while walking just a pair. Kressler also had a hit and scored in each of St. Clair's three games at the championship. Kressler was also named Championship MVP, Top Pitcher and a Championship All-Star at CCSA nationals.

Kressler also joined the St. Clair women's basketball team this past season to help with roster depth having never played on a competitive team.

Kressler is the first-ever student-athlete from St. Clair to be named OCAA Athlete of the Year. Kressler joins Erin Smith (2003-04) and Joanna Van Dyke (1997-98) of Durham College as the only softball players to be given the award.

The OCAA has expanded its season ending awards to include an athletic administrator, coach and rookies in addition to its traditional athletes of the year. Winners will be honoured at the 10th OCAA Hall of Fame

ceremony, to be held at the St. Clair College Centre for the Arts in Windsor, Ont., on Monday, May 1.




Kressler becomes first Saints' player in school history to earn OCAA player of the year

A dominating season by the St. Clair College Saints' softball team continues to be recognized. Kressler becomes first Saints' player in school history to earn OCAA player of the year

"That's really cool to hear," Kressler said.

Kressler's award comes just two days after St. Clair head coach Doug Wiseman was named the inaugural recipient of the OCAA's coach of the year award. Both will be recognized at the OCAA Hall of Fame ceremony, which will be held May 1 in Windsor.

"We had a remarkable year," said Wiseman, who has guided the program since 2013. "It's the best team I've ever been part of since I've been here and (Kressler) answered the call."

Kressler is originally from Kitchener, but her parents (Ryan and Steph) moved to Windsor in 2019 to stay closer to their children. She was attending Wayne State University on a scholarship while her brother Braeden Kressler, who has signed with the NHL's Toronto Maple Leafs, was playing with the Flint Firebirds in the Ontario Hockey League.

"They wanted to be closer and it was easier to pay a mortgage than hotels," the 24-year-old Kressler said. An honour student at Wayne State University, Kressler still had playing eligibility remaining when she graduated early and returned to Windsor.

"It was hard because I was trying to find something in the NCAA for my last year of eligibility and I couldn't find anything that was a fit for me," the five-foot-two Kressler said. "Doug reached out to me. I lived in Windsor already and he said, 'Do you want to see what our program's about?' It's been a ride since then."

Kressler was part of a dominant St. Clair program that posted a perfect 34-0 record during the season, which included a 24-0 record in regular-season play.

The club went unbeaten in capturing the OCAA title where Kressler was named tournament MVP. In conference post-season awards, she was named a first-team all-star, provincial player of the year and pitcher of the year. She was also OCAA all-academic.

For the season, Kressler finished second behind teammate Amy Claydon in the OCAA in hitting with a .529 average while scoring a conference record 45 runs. She was a perfect 6-0 when pitching with a league-leading .21 earned-run average after allowing just one run in 34 innings of work and striking out 48.

"She got on the same page right away," Wiseman said. "We knew she was coming in with a lot of status. Coming in and being that team player, she bought in quickly. She took the lead with a lot of great players around her."

With the Saints again unbeaten at the CCSA national championship, Kressler was named top pitcher and tournament MVP.

"Here, everyone's here for both school and to play," Kressler said. "It's way more fun for me. It's not like a job. It's something I get to do and have fun doing and I've met a lot of lifelong friends."

The scary part for the rest of the OCAA is that Kressler will return for another season. "This program's been amazing," Kressler said. "I love being able to hangout with friends and play.

"I'm most proud of the two gold medals. Winning gold medals are better than any personal awards and it was an awesome time. I don't know how we can top this year, but maybe do the exact same thing. We're working hard and hopefully what we did this year, we can do next year."



After three-year absence, WESPY Awards once again celebrate some of area's best athletes

Three years later and the process has gotten no easier for the selection committee. The 16th (WESPY) Awards returned for the first time since 2020 on Wednesday at the Caboto Club, but the process to pick winners proved no easier for the 10-person panel.

"Some of the selections were really tough for sure," said WESPY founder Dominic Papa, who is not on the voting panel. "It seems every year we've done this is gets harder and harder."

Ron Smith, who guided the Windsor Stars to Baseball Canada's senior men's championship since 2013, was one of the major award winners at Wednesday event as he was named coach of the year.

Owen Findlay, who played junior B hockey with the LaSalle Vipers while also playing baseball for the St. Clair Saints and Tecumseh Thunder, was named male athlete of the year while L'Essor high school product Rose Forshaw, who is now at the University of Hawaii, was named female athlete of the year.

The St. Clair softball team earned team of the year honours while former University of Windsor Lancers' men's hockey player Ben Assad claimed the Mickey Renaud Captain's Leadership Award.

Aris Kahn, from the JK Cup Squash Tournament, was named executive of the year while Patti Kell was awarded the Knobby Knudsen female volunteer of the year and Jim Snively the male volunteer of the year.

Jamie McDermott was presented the award for courage and determination while Debbie Clarke was named the John DeNapoli Sports Community Service Award winner.

Nancy Loeffler-Caro captured the female legacy award and Tony Piroski the male legacy award winner.

Wednesday's award winners were for performances between the fall of 2021 through the summer of 2022. Forshaw, who won three medals at last year's OFSAA track and field championships, also claimed the Dennis Fairall track and field award on the female side while the Lancers' Ben Tilson won it on the male side.

University of Windsor Lancers' goaltender Kristen Swiatoschik won the Ed Jovanovski Hockey Award on the female side while Wyatt Johnston, who won an OHL scoring title and was named league's Most Outstanding Player with the Windsor Spitfires, won it on the male side.

The softball award went to St. Clair's Bryanna Kressler while the Stars' Andrew Wasyluk won the baseball award.

Sandwich Aaliyah Faddoul won the female soccer award with St. Clair's Riley Drkulec claiming the male award. The Lancers' Brooke Davis won the Tim Hommel volleyball award on the female side with the Lancers' Dami Alalade taking the male award.

The Windsor Aquatic Club's Jayne Harcarufka won the female swimming award with WAC's Alexander Lackovic winning the male award and WAC teammate Julia Lane claimed the parasport athletics award.

Allison Accetta, from the Windsor Wrestling Club and Sandwich high school, won the female wrestling award and Nash Renaud, also from the WWC and Massey high school, earned the male award.

The Lancers' Vanessa Ardovini, who claimed last year's Jamieson Junior Golf Tour girls' title, won the female golf award and James Hill, who was at the University of Detroit Mercy on scholarship, took the male award.


Sisters Logan Kucera and Jana Kucera, from St. Clair, shared the female basketball award with the Lancers' Thomas Kennedy earning the male award.






In just a couple more days, 110 teams, with over 1300 athletes aided by 75 umpires on 21 diamonds will play more than 370 games.

Francine Stadler named head coach of Lancer softball



The Windsor Lancers are pleased to announce the hiring of Francine Stadler as the new head coach of the Lancer softball program.

A familiar face with the blue and gold, Stadler played a key role in creating the Lancer softball program and was a member of the team's original coaching staff back in 2003 as the infield/first base coach. She remained an assistant for four seasons until 2007.

"We are so pleased to welcome Francine back into the Lancer family," said director of athletics Stephanie White. "Her history with the program gives her a true understanding of what it means to be a Lancer, and her wealth of experience and knowledge is going to help elevate our program to the next level."

While with the Lancers, Stadler helped lead the team to their best finish in program history, claiming a silver medal at the provincial championships in 2004.

"I am very excited to be back with the Lancer softball team as their head coach. I am passionate about the sport, and I look forward to leading this team as we begin the 2023 season," said Stadler. "I was lucky to be a part of the original Lancer coaching staff, and on the 20th anniversary of the program I am hoping that the community will come out to our games to support the athletes as we celebrate this milestone."

A longtime member with the Windsor Wildcats organization, Stadler led the 2000 Bantam Tier 1 fastball team to a gold medal at the Ontario Summer games and the Ontario Provincial championships, as well as a silver medal at the Novice Tier 1 provincial championships.

Joining Stadler on the bench is Paula Stamatiadis, who is no stranger to the Lancer family. Stamatiadis helped create the program with Stadler and spent nine years as head coach of the team.

Jessica Hitchcock and Michelle Blokker will also team up with Stadler in the dugout. Hitchcock won three national championships with the Softball Canada Development program, while Blokker played for five years with the blue and gold from 2006-10, before transitioning to an assistant coach for three years from 2011-13.





A single-division format will remain for 2023 as teams will play a triple round robin format consisting of one doubleheader and one single "neutral" site game against each club totaling 24 games each.

Coming off an undefeated season in 2022, the St. Clair Saints (Windsor) are the team to beat this fall. St. Clair became the first program to win 27 OCAA regular and post-season games in a single season without a single loss. St. Clair opens the 2023 season at home in a twin bill against the Lambton Lions (Sarnia) and Conestoga Condors (Kitchener) on Sept. 9.

A rematch of last year's gold medal game against the 21-time OCAA champion Durham Lords (Oshawa) will take place on a neutral field Sept. 23 hosted by the Fanshawe Falcons (London). A traditional doubleheader between the Lords and Saints will be played on Sept. 30 at the newly named Babcock Field in Oshawa.

The Humber Hawks (Etobicoke) play host to the OCAA Women's Softball Championship this October. The two-time reigning OCAA bronze medalists are on the road to being the regular season Sept. 9 before hosting St. Clair and the Sheridan Bruins (Mississauga) the following day at Connorvale Park.

A total of 108 games are planned over a span of 37 days. The top six teams at the conclusion of the regular season - including host Humber - move on to the OCAA championship. (If Humber finishes below sixth place, it will replace the sixth seed.) The modified double knockout tournament will take place Oct. 19-21 at Connorvale Park in Etobicoke. The top two teams advance directly to the double knockout, while the remaining four play a sudden death game to advance to the double knockout stage.

All OCAA schedules for the 2022-23 season, including dates, times and locations, are subject to change.


















Seventh heaven for Lozinski in final season






Many people have been asking about the status of the Ray Lafleur Jr statue project. This statue is intended to commemorate Ray's spectacular work broadcasting Saints softball games over the past three seasons, and we all know that he is once again in line to win the OCAA Softball Broadcaster of the Year award again this year.

I attended the most recent committee meeting on this project and was able to come away with a good idea as to where we are. Two locations were discussed for the statue. The first location was a prominent location between the football stadium and the highway running by the college. The statue was to be a 20-foot-high bronze situated on top of a 20-ton block of the best French granite. It would feature Ray with the camera to one side while generally pointing the way to the softball diamond with his other hand for visitors for generations to come. This statue was to be surrounded by a large bank of spotlights that would be visible by the orbiting space station. Unfortunately, this location was dropped because of cost issues and the fact that the sponsor for the idea ... someone with the initials RLJ was not there to defend the proposal. The second location discussed was the center field bern where Ray typically sets up to broadcast home games. Four local artists who work with bronze were asked to present their designs. These designs have been provided to a focus group to determine which was best. Unfortunately, the only one to be accepted by the focus group was one where Ray's face was virtually 100% covered by the camera. We asked Laurie why this might have happened, but she just smiled and said, "No comment". That is all the update I have at this time.







Kressler becomes first Saints' player in school history to earn OCAA player of the year

A dominating season by the St. Clair College Saints' softball team continues to be recognized.

On Wednesday, the Saints' Bryanna Kressler was named the OCAA's female athlete of the year. t marks the first time in school history a St. Clair male or female athlete has earned the award since its inception in 1996-97.

"That's really cool to hear," Kressler said.

Kressler's award comes just two days after St. Clair head coach Doug Wiseman was named the inaugural recipient of the OCAA's coach of the year award. Both will be recognized at the OCAA Hall of Fame ceremony, which will be held May 1 in Windsor.

"We had a remarkable year," said Wiseman, who has guided the program since 2013. "It's the best team I've ever been part of since I've been here and (Kressler) answered the call."

Kressler is originally from Kitchener, but her parents (Ryan and Steph) moved to Windsor in 2019 to stay closer to their children. She was attending Wayne State University on a scholarship while her brother Braeden Kressler, who has signed with the NHL's Toronto Maple Leafs, was playing with the Flint Firebirds in the Ontario Hockey League.

"They wanted to be closer and it was easier to pay a mortgage than hotels," the 24-year-old Kressler said.

An honour student at Wayne State University, Kressler still had playing eligibility remaining when she graduated early and returned to Windsor.

"It was hard because I was trying to find something in the NCAA for my last year of eligibility and I couldn't find anything that was a fit for me," the five-foot-two Kressler said. "Doug reached out to me. I lived in Windsor already and he said, 'Do you want to see what our program's about?' It's been a ride since then."

Kressler was part of a dominant St. Clair program that posted a perfect 34-0 record during the season, which included a 24-0 record in regular-season play. The club went unbeaten in capturing the OCAA title where Kressler was named tournament MVP. In conference post-season awards, she was named a first-team all-star, provincial player of the year and pitcher of the year. She was also OCAA all-academic.

For the season, Kressler finished second behind teammate Amy Claydon in the OCAA in hitting with a .529 average while scoring a conference record 45 runs. She was a perfect 6-0 when pitching with a league-leading .21 earned-run average after allowing just one run in 34 innings of work and striking out 48.

"She got on the same page right away," Wiseman said. "We knew she was coming in with a lot of status. Coming in and being that team player, she bought in quickly. She took the lead with a lot of great players around her."


With the Saints again unbeaten at the CCSA national championship, Kressler was named top pitcher and tournament MVP.

"Here, everyone's here for both school and to play," Kressler said. "It's way more fun for me. It's not like a job. It's something I get to do and have fun doing and I've met a lot of lifelong friends."

The scary part for the rest of the OCAA is that Kressler will return for another season.

"This program's been amazing," Kressler said. "I love being able to hangout with friends and play.

"I'm most proud of the two gold medals. Winning gold medals are better than any personal awards and it was an awesome time. I don't know how we can top this year, but maybe do the exact same thing. We're working hard and hopefully what we did this year, we can do next year."

LONDON, Ont. - St. Clair College's Bryanna Kressler (Saint Mary's) is the 2022 Ontario Colleges Athletic Association (OCAA) Women's Softball Player of the Year. Kressler received the award in a ceremony held in London, Ont., on Wednesday evening.

Kressler was a dual threat for the undefeated Saints at the plate and from the pitcher's circle. With a bat Kressler had a slash line of .529/.563/1.023 setting a new OCAA single season record with 45 runs scored while also contributing 51 RBI. Kressler's 46 hits included 14 doubles, 10 triples and three home runs. From the rubber the fourth-year player made six starts going 6-0, flowing just one earned run over 34 innings of work for a 0.21 ERA, striking out 48. In addition, Kressler is the OCAA Pitcher of the Year and headlines the OCAA League First-Team All-Stars.

Mckenna Copley (Dover Centre) of St. Clair is the OCAA Rookie of the Year. The right-hander pitched a team-high 55 innings for the Saints, going an impressive 13-0. Copley allowed just seven earned runs for a 0.89 ERA, striking out 50. Copley is also an OCAA League First-Team All-Star.

St. Clair's Doug Wiseman is the OCAA Coach of the Year, leading the Saints to the 2022 regular season championship. St. Clair won all 24 regular season games while scoring 277 total runs to set a new OCAA single season record. Even more impressive was the 20 total runs allowed, less than one per game.

Amy Claydon is the OCAA Batting Champion to complete the St. Clair sweep of major award winners. Claydon's slash line was .600/.621/1.253. The fifth-year first baseman and pitcher also set a new OCAA single season record with 55 RBI. Claydon is also a member of the OCAA League First-Team All-Stars.

Joining Kressler, Copley and Claydon as OCAA League First-Team All-Stars are Durham College's Grace Hearns (Nappanee); Fanshawe College's Morgan Lowry (Middlesex Centre) and Kennedi Roth (Stratford); Humber College's Christina D'Angelo (Mississauga) and Alexis Ferreira (Mississauga); and St. Clair's Sierra Baltzer (LaSalle) and Shae-Lyn Murphy (Windsor).


















Women's Softball Collect OCAA Awards


Windsor, ON – The St. Clair College Women's Softball team were the beneficiary of OCAA League Awards Wednesday with eight players being recognized.

OCAA First-Team All-Star selections included Bryanna Kressler (Kitchener, ON), Shae-Lyn Murphy (Windsor, ON/Holy Names), Sierra Baltzer (LaSalle, ON/Sandwich) and Ashley Ventura (Fergus, ON) while Second-Team members included Mckenna Copley (Dover Centre, ON), Judy Lafleur (Essex, ON/Essex) and Jacklyn Yewchyn (Windsor, ON/Kennedy) with Amy Claydon (Cambridge, ON) winning the batting title.

3B/P Kressler batted .473 with 45 RBI while scoring 43 times this past season and tied atop the league lead in homeruns at six with centerfield teammate Baltzer who batted .506 adding 31 RBI who also scored 43 times to go with 10 stolen bases. Kressler also added a 2-1 record and a save on the pitching strip with a 2.43 ERA in 23.0 IP. Murphy played shortstop while batting .505 including a league leading 11 doubles with 29 RBI and 38 runs scored. Freshman player Ventura was voted the OCAA's top catcher and a member of the All-Rookie team for batting .368 with 24 RBI along with 23 runs scored.

Copley led the OCAA with a 13-1 record in the pitching circle including six complete games while sporting a 2.04 ERA over 68.2 IP and struck out 68 batters on the year. Lafleur batted .393 and 9 RBI while scoring 22 times after 16 stolen bases with first baseman Yewchyn not far behind at .367 and 17 RBI.

Claydon claimed her second batting title with a .551 adding 31 RBI and 4 homeruns splitting time between designated hitter and pitching herself to 7-0 record with a 0.69 ERA.



Women's Softball Win Second Consecutive OCAA Gold


Etobicoke, ON – The St. Clair College Women's Softball team had to sweep three games on Saturday at Connorvale Park in Etobicoke to earn their second consecutive OCAA Championship Gold Medal hosted by Humber College. The Saints started with an 11-0 mercy shortened win over Humber before dropping Durham College (Oshawa) twice by scores of 17-3 and 8-3.

St. Clair took a 1-0 lead in the second inning of the Humber win before adding two runs in the third. Four runs in each of the next two innings secured the mercy shortened verdict and a trip to the gold medal round. Bryanna Kressler (Kitchener, ON) held Humber to just one hit and walk while striking out eight in the pitching win. The long ball propelled the offense as the Saints clubbed three homeruns courtesy of a solo shot from Player of the Game Julia Brusseau (Lakeshore, ON/St. Anne), a 2-run dinger from Sierra Baltzer (LaSalle, ON/Sandwich) and a 3-run whack from Amy Claydon (Cambridge, ON). Baltzer finished five RBI and two hits while Claydon had three hits and 3 RBI. Jacklyn Yewchyn (Windsor, ON/Kennedy) and Brusseau each had with two hits in the game that served Humber with the Bronze Medal.

In game one of the gold medal round with Durham, the Saints' bats were unstoppable and led to 18 hits as a team led by Shae-Lyn Murphy (Windsor, ON/Holy Names) and Judy Lafleur (Essex, ON/Essex) who each had three apiece. Power hitting was displayed again with Claydon, Kressler, Yewchyn and Alivia Peterson (Windsor, ON/St. Anne) all clearing the fence for St. Clair. Claydon and Yewchyn each drove in three runs to top the Saints in run production. Kressler pitched the first four innings for the win striking out seven Lords while giving up three hits and three walks which led to a pair of earned runs. Mckenna Copley (Dover Centre) threw the final three innings in relief to help force the, if necessary, game.

In the deciding game St. Clair put a quick run on the board in the first inning thanks to another Claydon homerun but she outdid herself in the third inning with a 3-run clout to give her team a commanding lead. The advantage grew to 6-0 in the fifth inning when Kressler hit a 2-run homer of her own, but Durham cut the lead in half with a 3-run poke in the bottom half. The Saints added two more runs in the seventh inning and starting pitcher Kressler began the celebration after setting down the Lords in order to end the game. She finished the game with 14 strikeouts while giving up just three hits and a walk with only one earned run against which resulted in her recognition as the Player of the Game. All told she pitched 16 innings on the day in the three victories for St. Clair.

Murphy was named to the Championship All-Star team after batting .316 adding two RBI as was Kressler who batted .368 with nine RBI to go with three homeruns. Due to their impact on the weekend Claydon and Kressler were named Co-MVP's for the Championship. Kressler added four pitching wins to her hitting prowess while Claydon was nearly perfect at the plate batting .800 and her five homeruns left an indelible impression not to mention 13 RBI.


