NOTES

ATTENDANCE – All the drill dates listed on this Plan of the Year (POY) are considered Mandatory Drills. All cadets are expected to attend all mandatory drills. Drills that cadets are absent from, whether it be excused or unexcused, are expected to be made up. You can attend regularly scheduled Color Guard practice meetings to make up for absent drills, or you may request an optional event (such as recruiting, Color Guard presentation, or unit-organized community service) to be counted as make-up drill hours instead of credit towards promotions or awards. Your attendance will be reviewed twice a year, just before Winter and Summer breaks. USNSCC Action Memo #16 states that you must attend 50% of all scheduled drills, otherwise you may be discharged from the NSCC/NLCC. To remain in the program cadets may not miss more than five days during every review period. **Missed drills are still expected to be made up.** Cadets attending USNSCC events that conflict with a drill are considered “Present” and do not have to attend make-up drills.

PROMOTION REQUIREMENTS – The unit-wide Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for cadet promotions and can be viewed in details here : *NSCC / NLCC Promotion Requirements SOP - Version 3.0* detail here: *All cadets* are required to participate in unit-organized Color Guard, Recruiting, or Community Service events that are separate from mandatory drills to promote.

PRT CLARIFICATION – The Physical Readiness Test (PRT) is a tool to evaluate the risk of injury of the individuals who are participating. NLCC Cadets must achieve a level 3, 4, or 5 to pass, promote, or attend ATs. NSCC Cadets must achieve a level 3, 4, or 5 to pass - however, new cadets may fail with a level 2 score and be allowed to attend Recruit Training. Our unit will host two PRT opportunities during each PRT cycle. There will be two PRT cycles each year. Cadets may request to run additional PRTs with another USNSCC unit, with the approval of that unit’s CO and the current CO of TRIDENT 65 SQ.

PQS INFO – Cadets are encouraged to take the Polaris Course “Mastering the Personnel Qualification Standards (PQS) Process” to learn more about how PQS works in the program. Cadets who have failed to be promoted for one year due to missing PSI/PQS will not be approved to attend Advanced Trainings beyond any required for promotion. Currently, this only applies to promotion to SC-3, Seaman, in the NSCC.

NEW ENROLLMENT – Interested new cadets may join the unit anytime.

RO ATTENDANCE – Due to the strict curriculum of the Recruit Orientation, and the importance that all cadets who graduate RO have trained to the same standard, once the first classroom day of RO begins no cadet may miss more than one day of RO (excused or unexcused) for any reason. If a Cadet misses any portion of RO, then they will have to make up the missed lessons in order to graduate. Make-up drills may be considered, if requested, on a case-by-case basis. If a cadet is unable to make up the required RO coursework before their RO graduation date, they will fail their RO class. Requests for exceptions to this policy may be made in writing to the Commanding Officer, but are not guaranteed to be approved.

RO FAILURE – All cadets must pass RO to formally join the unit, participate in normal unit functions, or attend advanced training (such as Recruit Training). If a Cadet does not meet graduation requirements by graduation day, they will remain a recruit candidate until they have made up those requirements and have an administrative remark placed into their record. Reasons a cadet may fail RO include, but are not limited to: lack of attendance, not running a PRT (Cadets may fail the PRT and still graduate), incomplete Polaris Coursework, incomplete PQS (in-person coursework), failing graduation knowledge and uniform inspection, or behavior contrary to the Cadet Code of Conduct. RO Graduation requirements may be waived at the discretion of the Commanding Officer, on a case-by-case basis.
