Phil & Heather have decided to downsize and are now






building a home close to Sarasota Memorial Hospital. Eventually, they plan to spend summers in North Carolina where they also have property.



## Gordon & Linda Langeneger's 1931 Chevrolet Roadster



The old sea captain wept as he bid his beloved Eloise farewell; he knew he would never see her again, and after 26 years, he was going to miss her. Three months later the Long Island, NY resident passed away, and it was said by those who knew him that the old captain died of a broken heart! There was a new man in her life now, 17 years old and a junior in high school. Gordon Langeneger was thrilled about his new Eloise; she was just what he wanted and he had great plans for her: after dropping in a '57 Corvette engine, he'd use her as and it was off to Hershey for Eloise's first show. There his transportation to school. Eloise, as she is still affectionately called by those who know her, is a 1931 Chevrolet AE Roadster, which sold new for \$495. Her colors are Coffee Cream, Cellini Green, and Sunset Yellow, with a brown naugahyde interior and beige soft top. The car has a six cylinder 50 HP engine pumping 3 3/16" diameter pistons on a 3 3/4" stroke. Tire size is 4.75x19. Weight is 2400 lb; The fuel system fills at 10 gallons and feeds at 18 m.p.g. Brakes are four wheel mechanical. Original accessories (and original prices) include an Eagle radiator cap, \$3.50; windwings, \$9.00 dealer installed; and deluxe wheel covers of canvas, \$2.50. Special standard features included: sidemounts, trunk rack, side curtains, and stoneguard.

When Gordon first brought Eloise home (she still had the big "E" on the radiator's stoneguard, lovingly placed there by the old captain), his father hit the roof! He didn't want another piece of junk cluttering up the yard. However, being the first car he ever bought (he paid \$75.00), Gordon finally convinced his dad he'd made a wise investment. Following his graduation from high

school, Gordon stored the car in his sister's basement garage. Then he went off to college, married, and started to raise a family, all the time planning for the day he could restore Eloise to her original condition. As the years passed, he collected parts he would need, once following a '31 Chevy all the way home before he could catch the owner to ask if he happened to have an extra trunk handle for the rumble seat (He did!). Gordon never did find inside door handles and had to make them: he melted down his wife Linda's brass candlesticks and poured the liquid into molds which he had made using the lost wax process. Two years ago, after searching for 13 years for a trunk, Gordon finally found 2 within a month of each other.

The day finally came when Gordon was able to retrieve his car from its interment, haul it up to his home in New Hampshire, and begin a painstaking restoration from the ground up. It took him about 2 ½ years, working nights and weekends, and he did all the work except the top and upholstery, and his father rebuilt the engine. Finally, in 1978, the car was completed were 950 cars that year, and 37 in her class, but she received her First Junior. On to Hagerstown, MD, for her Senior, and then began the preservation awards - to date the car has 8 - plus 2 Firsts at National Chevrolet Meets and many local and regional wins. Eloise has also been in parades, mall shows, and on tours, 3 of which were over 500 miles each. It was during a Glidden Tour that Eloise climbed Clingman's Dome in the Smokey Mountains National Park, a height of over 6000 ft., and she did it all the way in third gear! Finally, 8 years after having restored Eloise, Gordon and Linda decided it was time to enter her in a Grand National Meet. It was to be one of her last competitions, and she went out in style; she became a First Prize Grand National Winner at the 1986 Meet in Ashville, NC. Gordon and Linda also own a 1957 Corvette and a 1911 E.M.F.


We need to do something and maybe we could stop somewhere and have a picnic by the cars afterward. Best wishes & good health.


COLLECTOR CAR APPRECIATION DAY
