Ten of those years were overseas (Prestwick, Scotland; Diyarbakir, Turkey; Tan Son Nhut AB - Saigon, South Vietnam; Wheelus AFB - Tripoli, Libya; RAF Lakenheath, England. Roosevelt and Stateside assignments included Wyoming, California, Utah, Ohio, Missouri, Florida, Colorado, and Texas. He retired in 1974 with the rank of Captain. Joe is a member of several automobile clubs and is an Editorial There is a shelf Contributor to the AACA National magazine.

On August 21st Julia & I. along with Jimmy Mayne, were invited to tour Joe's amazing collection of automotive models which consists of something over 1500 items. Although Joe had obtained a few models earlier, he began collecting in earnest in 1989. Our tour started in



what Joe called the "Toy Room". The walls are lined with custom built shelving which was originally going to house his entire collection. However, that plan was short-lived. The walls are covered with cars nearly to the ceiling and books finish that display. The fover has



cabinets full of cars and related displays. There is a model of a stainless steel diner with several smaller diners accompanying it. The vehicles begin with the

1893 Duryea which is considered to be the first gasoline powered car in American and goes through the 1970's and perhaps the 1980's. There are cabinets with shelves dedicated to various makes & subjects such as the presidential car shelf. That group

begins with the 1939 Lincoln made for Franklin includes the Kennedy parade car. of the Hershey



car shows memorabilia such as the annual wooden nickels, brochures, etc.


If one were to ask Joe which model he has most of, he would say Corvettes & Cadillacs, and the largest single make & year would be 1941 Cadillacs.

ornaments which appeared on some of the worlds finest automobiles. He has seven 18th scale pewter Franklin Mint cars that weigh about 15 pounds each. I was fascinated with a pewter model of the Ford Model









"T" assembly line in fine detail, and a model of GM's Parade of Progress show vehicle.

It was truly a treat to tour the collection, and the narrative provided by the host made it very interesting. If you ask Treasurer Malaney, perhaps he would entertain you as well.



- 1904 Durant buys Buick, takes Nash with him as assistant manager.

1912 - Charles Nash hires Walter P Chrysler to manage Buick division of **General Motors** 1912 - Nash becomes president of General Motors 1916 - William Durant regains control of General Motors, Charles Nash resigns.

1916 - Charles Nash buys the Thomas B Jeffery

Company, maker of the Rambler.

- 1925 Purchased plant from the Mitchell Motor Car Company in Racine, Wisconsin
- 1930 Nash retires and becomes Chairman of the
- 1937 Merged Nash with Kelvinator to form Nash-Kelvinator and made George W Mason the CEO

## Who Knew?

Who Knew? I didn't know, ..... not really. Jacki did not know either! It all happened on the Piglet Tour, which I wrote about in the May Stutter n' Sputter.

You see, for the entire week of the tour. we two widows rode in the back seats of Model A's and one big Yellowstone bus, used in 1924 to pick up passengers at the train station and shuttle them up to the big lodge in Yellowstone National Park. I didn't know it was starting, and I just plowed ahead, sitting in the very confined quarters of the back seats, me on one side and Jacki on the other. The days of touring were long; each day lasted about six hours. There were a few stops that allowed "stretching," and we finished each day, happy to be on the Tour! I was a tiny bit "stiff" upon getting out of the cars at the end of each day. But what could I expect? Close, cramped hours of touring that were so much fun! person with long legs, sitting in one Nothing equals riding in an antique vehicle! We left for the Ocala Tour on a Sunday and drove home the following Saturday. I seemed a little stiffer upon my arrival home, and my left leg wasn't functioning as it should. Prior to the tour I had been walking 1 1/2 miles five days a week, and now I was not able to walk at all around our circle in Fox Fire West.

I was really surprised, so I made an appointment with my PCP. She gave me a prescription for the pain and ordered an ultra sound. Thankfully, no blood clots. The x-ray showed some arthritis around my knee. My doctor referred me to an orthopedic surgeon to check both my leg & my knee and render an opinion. However, I still have

not had my appointment at this writing. I have to wait five weeks to get in to see the surgeon. I suspect he'll probably suggest a shot in my knee! I also visited my Physical Therapist, whom I usually only see every four months as a follow-up to a previous auto accident. Three of us were lined up at a RED traffic light. The 4th car came along from behind and thought we were moving. He plowed into the van behind me, which hit my car, and I hit the SUV in front of me! The culprit was driving his girlfriend's brand new car, with all the bells & whistles, from the dealership, with a dog sitting next to him in the front seat. Her new car was totaled!

My PT wanted me to use the cane which I had thought to borrow. She taught me the proper way to maneuver it, and I was instructed to keep using it until the pain went away.

But who knew? Who knew that a position for several hours every day for a week, would come out of the experience with a leg/knee problem? I have done the same thing in other vintage cars without issues: the back seat of an 1908 EMF, a 1911 Buick, a 1910 Cadillac, a 1915 Model "T," and a 1912 Winton. No problems at all. Well, now I know. The next time I am offered a ride in a small back seat with little leg room, I shall hold out for an antique car that has a bench style back seat with lots of leg room to stretch out, relax, and take care not to stay in one position for long periods of time. Who knew? I did not know before, but ..... now I know!

The tour was hosted by the Eastern Shore and Bay County Regions of Maryland. Great weather with slightly higher than normal temperatures for this part of June made for super touring conditions.

June 2: Early bird events available were a special sail on the Skipjack sailing vessel or a maritime museum/ walking tour of historic Cambridge, MD. Tour Director Charles Emery welcomed drivers/participants for the 48 registered vehicles and special guests invited for the informational kickoff meeting on Wednesday evening. The special treat for the evening was homemade strawberry shortcake which all enjoyed. Additional remarks from AACA past President Terry Bond stressed the importance of regions & chapters of AACA stepping up to sponsor meets and tours for the betterment of the club. AACA awards were presented to both clubs for their work in putting on this tour. June 3: Due to capacity limits, smaller groups split visits between the Yacht Maintenance Company



boatyard tour and the Kool Ice & Seafood processing facility operations. The boatyard performs extensive repairs on a vast variety of watercraft and maintains the last operational marine railway to haul large vessels out of the water. The seafood operation supplies most every type of fresh fish; crabs, shrimp etc. for restaurants and to the public. It was then off to the four year old Harriet Tubman Museum with many stories of her heroic rescues of runaway slaves via the underground railroad having never lost anyone on their northbound journey, The museum contained interactive displays & videos of her amazing life. Upon

leaving the site for lunch and the Blackwater National Wildlife Refuge, individual car photos were taken in front of the museum. A great lunch for everyone was at Old Salty's Restaurant with warm cream pies for dessert. At the refuge, an interesting film was presented explaining the areas importance in maintaining natural habitat for migratory birds including the bald eagle. It was then off to return to the hotel and dinner on your own.

June 4: Included the Cambridge Historical Museum with individual room scenes of life in the area and snacks with beverages were provided for tour



participants. Adjacent was the former MD Governors home and carriage barn with period items. The next destination for the day was in quaint St Michaels visiting the Classic Motor Museum with approximately 20 vehicles which are rotated semi-annually with a wide variety on display. The majority are temporarily on



consignment from private individuals for the exhibit. Following the car museum, a luncheon was held at the Union United Methodist Church served by church members. The church dates back over 160 years and is in need of major repairs. The remainder of the day was free to walk the town and explore the vast variety of stores on Talbot Street. The return to the hotel was via the Oxford-Bellevue Ferry where up to nine vehicles at a time are transported for an eight minute ride to Oxford. The joke is that the ferry could transport 18 Mini-Coopers at a time. At the Oxford harbor, ice cream treats were available at the Scottish Highland Creamery.



June 5: The first stop of the final day of the tour was the Adkins Arboretum; 400 acres of woodlands, meadows, wetlands, & walking trails. Individual small groups were escorted by a volunteer docent for an hour tour of the trails pointing out various native plants & trees. The final destination of the day was to the Suicide Bridge Restaurant to prepare to board the Choptank River Queen paddleboat for a two hour



luncheon cruise with a fantastic closing meal on the Choptank River. Total mileage driven for the three days of touring was about 200. Framed vehicle pictures were distributed to take home and a raffle for some items was handed out. Final farewells for the members on the tour were exchanged and a reminder that the true spirit of car club touring is the new friends made and seeing old friends from prior tours. Safe trips home, and we will see you on future tours.

shortly after the show, including a really cool MG that Bob Tone purchased.


I was also honored to be your Treasurer for 2020 and thru August of 2021. Not quite as long as Gerry Shapiro, but equally rewarding.
