



GEORGIA FILM TAX CREDITS EXPLAINED



Georgia has become one of the most powerful film production hubs in the world, earning the nickname “Hollywood of the South.” From blockbuster Marvel films to independent features, television series, commercials, music videos, and streaming content, productions continue to choose Georgia because of its talented workforce, world-class infrastructure, diverse locations, and one of the most attractive film incentive programs in the United States. At the center of this growth is the Georgia Film Tax Credit.

For producers, financiers, and studio executives, understanding how Georgia's incentive works can significantly impact a project's financial viability and overall return on investment.

What Is the Georgia Film Tax Credit?

The Georgia Film Tax Credit is a transferable income tax credit offered through the Georgia Entertainment Industry Investment Act. Qualified productions can receive a base tax credit equal to 20% of their eligible Georgia expenditures. Productions that meet additional promotional requirements can earn an extra 10% uplift, bringing the total incentive to as much as 30% of qualified spending.

Unlike many states that offer rebates or grant programs, Georgia's incentive is a tax credit. This means qualifying productions earn credits that can either be used against Georgia tax liabilities or transferred and sold to Georgia taxpayers. Because of this transferability, productions often monetize the credit even if they do not owe taxes in Georgia.

One of the most attractive aspects of Georgia's program is that there is currently no annual cap on available credits and no sunset provision, creating long-term stability for producers planning future projects.

How Much Can a Production Receive?

The incentive structure is straightforward:

- 20% Base Tax Credit on qualified Georgia expenditures
- Additional 10% Georgia Entertainment Promotion (GEP) Uplift
- Maximum potential incentive of 30% on qualified spending

For example:

A feature film spending \$10 million in qualified Georgia expenditures could potentially earn:

- \$2,000,000 through the base credit
- An additional \$1,000,000 through the GEP uplift

Total Tax Credit: \$3,000,000

This effectively reduces the net production cost to \$7 million before considering any additional financing structures or incentives.

Who Qualifies?

Georgia's incentive applies to a wide range of entertainment projects, including:

- Feature films
- Television series
- Television pilots
- Movies of the week
- Commercials
- Music videos
- Animation projects
- Certain interactive entertainment productions and gaming projects

To qualify, productions must meet a minimum spending threshold of \$500,000 in Georgia. This threshold can be met through a single production or aggregated across multiple projects by the same production company within a tax year.

Additionally, projects must generally be intended for distribution outside of Georgia and across multiple markets.

What Expenses Qualify?

Qualified expenditures generally include costs directly associated with producing content in Georgia. These often include:

- Cast and crew wages
- Production labor
- Equipment rentals
- Set construction
- Location fees
- Hotel accommodations
- Post-production services
- Visual effects
- Catering and craft services
- Transportation
- Production office expenses

Both resident and non-resident payroll may qualify when work is performed in Georgia, making the program particularly attractive to large-scale productions bringing talent from outside the state.

The Georgia Department of Revenue ultimately reviews and certifies eligible expenditures during the audit process.

How Does the Additional 10% Uplift Work?

The Georgia Entertainment Promotion (GEP) Uplift allows productions to increase their incentive from 20% to 30%.

Historically, productions earned the uplift by incorporating approved Georgia promotional materials, including the Georgia logo and links to Georgia's film promotion website. Productions may also pursue alternative marketing opportunities approved by the Georgia Department of Economic Development. Commercial advertisements generally do not qualify for the uplift.

Because the additional uplift represents a 50% increase over the base incentive, most qualifying productions pursue it whenever possible.

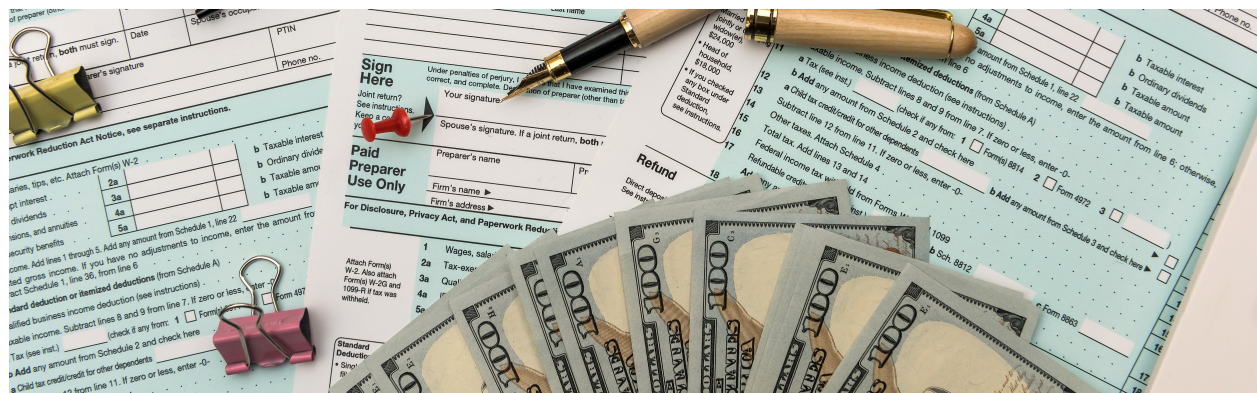
Transferability: The Secret Weapon

One reason Georgia remains so competitive is that the credit is transferable.

Many production companies do not have significant Georgia tax liability. Instead of letting credits sit unused, they can sell those credits to Georgia taxpayers, corporations, or investors. This creates immediate cash value that can be incorporated into a production's financing structure.

Film tax credits often trade at a discount to face value. For example, a \$1 million credit may be sold for approximately \$870,000 to \$970,000 depending on market conditions and timing.

This transferability effectively transforms future tax savings into present-day production financing.



Application Process

To receive the incentive, producers must follow a structured process.

Step 1: Obtain Certification

Projects must first be certified through the Georgia Department of Economic Development's Film Office. Productions must submit applications electronically and meet filing deadlines tied to principal photography.

Step 2: Track Qualified Expenditures

Throughout production, detailed records must be maintained documenting all qualified Georgia spending. Accurate accounting is critical because every dollar claimed will be reviewed during the audit process.

Step 3: Complete the Mandatory Audit

Since January 1, 2023, all certified productions are required to undergo a mandatory audit before credits can be claimed. Audits may be conducted by the Georgia Department of Revenue or approved third-party CPA firms. Audit costs themselves do not qualify for the credit.

Step 4: Receive Credit Certification

Once expenditures are verified, the Georgia Department of Revenue certifies the final credit amount. The production may then utilize or transfer the credits.

Georgia's Growing Post-Production Opportunity

Historically, Georgia's incentives heavily favored principal photography and production spending. However, Georgia has increasingly expanded opportunities for post-production companies and facilities.

Recent updates have strengthened pathways for qualifying post-production expenditures, creating opportunities for sound facilities, color grading houses, VFX companies, editorial teams, and finishing vendors located within the state.
