## † From the Pastor's Study †

I Believe...and Things Got Better

I have enjoyed preaching through the Apostle's Creed. The "I Believe" series has been from my perspective a phenomenal success, and the success can all be attributed to the growing beliefs of Jacobs. As I write this, we still have three Sundays to go but the feedback has been so positive I felt it necessary to share a bit of it with everyone.

Before I share, however, I need to say this again, "Great sermons require great congregations." Often when people stop me and thank me for the sermon, I feel compelled to say that Jacobs is a delightful congregation to preach to; I am always particularly energized and excited in my studies and preparation during the week because I know people are hungry for God's Word and leaning in and listening well.

So, here's some of the feedback I have received from people in no particular order of importance. I am typing as things come to mind:

Many have enjoyed the bits of historical knowledge that come with knowing and studying the Creeds. For example, the Great Schism of 1054 AD occurred when the now Roman Catholic and Greek Orthodox churches argued over which bishop should be preeminent throughout Christendom (the bishop in Rome started it). The current expression of both of those denominations is different from what they were then; back then they were much more gospel centered, unified, and similar. On

both sides, there were cooler heads who sought unity, but they did not prevail. It was a handful of leaders whose personal inclinations and visions of power, not conciliatory Holy Spirit dependent faith, who divided the body. When we say “I Believe” we are saying we must be vigilant in maintaining bonds of peace, *especially when* we share differences of opinions!

Next, many have enjoyed seeing the difference between the Creeds and the Scriptures. It is tradition to recite the Creeds, but the Apostles Creed is only a summary of what the Bible says. The Creeds do not say –or claim to say– everything we need to know; nor are the Creeds worded inerrantly like our Bibles are. They are teaching tools. In the Creed we say, “I Believe...Jesus descended into hell for three days.” The Bible never says that. The wording of the Creed is not wrong, however, because “descended into hell for three days” was the way those who hammered out the wording of the Creed were saying *Jesus fully embraced death when He sacrificed Himself on the cross for us*. He fully embraced death for us so in turn He could offer us a full and richly textured resurrected life. This “We Believe...” and should enjoy daily as we search the Scriptures together to find the many great promises left for us to discover and pursue!

Finally, people have really gotten onto the “grace in all areas of my life” teaching. The fact that Jesus entered our world, suffered, and was crucified under Pontius Pilate is a historical reality. That means our lives in time (here now in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century) have meaning and purpose, even those moments in our lives of intense suffering. Jesus’ conception by the Holy Spirit and birth from a virgin means He is both fully human and fully divine. God is expressing through Jesus that it is possible for our lives to be fully directed under the covenantal promises of God which are ours by faith. We can faithfully live out the wonders of the divinely designed Heaven & Human partnership in our homes, our communities, and our church if “We Believe...in the Holy Spirit” who qualifies us and strengthens us to say, “Not my will, but Thine be done.” *SOLI DEO GLORIA*

# ◆ Jacob's Church Board Meeting Minutes ◆

## September 9, 2024

1. Pastor Stan opened with a devotion on Proverbs 14:8 The wisdom of the prudent is to understand his way, but the folly of fools is deceit. Asking the questions to ponder: What are the decisions that led to who I am? What are the decisions that led Jacob's Church to where we are today?

2. The August Treasurer report was reviewed and a motion to accept the report was given by Kayla and seconded by Mike M. Motion carried.

3. Minutes for the September Board Meeting were reviewed for accuracy. A motion to accept the minutes was made by Kayla and 2nd by Kaitey. Motion carried.

4. Sound System Update: Jared Hermany met and obtained a second opinion on our sound system by a company called Event Staging. Their evaluation of our sound system also confirmed the first opinion given by ESG (Entertainment Service Group) that our main speaker is not functioning correctly and needs to be replaced. The verbal quote from Events Staging is very similar to ESG. Both Companies have offered to provide a speaker demonstration to committee and board members. The Church Board will make a decision to move forward once a formal quote is obtained from Event Staging. Additional concerns involving monitors and the positioning of the overhead microphone for the choir were also discussed.

### Old Business

**Missions:** The Mission's committee is requesting the elders to determine a set amount for spending on missions for 2025.

**New Members Class:** Three people have requested to join the Church. Classes will start September 15th.

**Catechism Class:** A luncheon for 5 youth and their families was held Sept 7th. ESV Study Bibles will be given to each child. Classes will start Sept 15th at 9am Sunday Mornings in the church basement.

**Finance Committee:** Budget meeting to be held in October. Date to be announced. No update on envelope mailing list.

**Property Committee:**

Organ Repair: Organ repair project not completed yet. Insurance is covering most of costs.

Oil and Propane: A contract was made with Countryside Fuel. Furnaces scheduled for cleaning this fall.

Fox Property: no update.

Wuchter House: Tom Foulk and several youth have helped to make repairs.

**Christian Ed Committee:**

Children's Church has approx. 11 children in attendance and is divided into 2 classes to accommodate age ranges K- 5th. Coordinator of this program is Jane Wessner. There are several teachers as well as helpers that will alternate through the year. Curriculum utilized is Bible Studies for Life by Lifeway. Jane is tentatively planning a picnic for the children and their parents at Leaser Lake sometime this fall. More details to come.

Adult Retreat scheduled for November 8th-10th, 2024; theme is Sermon on the Mount. More information and sign-up sheet for teaching opportunity and attendance to be posted soon. Mike Follweiler will give the sermon in church on November 10th.

Children's Ministry: Coordinator Kayla Fusselman has started a fun time event for children in the New Tripoli community ages K-5th grade. The first event held in August had 6 children participate. She will reach out to families of Little Lambs to connect with older siblings that may be interested in attending. Information and registration can be found on church website. **Youth Minister:** Will Dellicker will be returning to the U.S. from his tour of duty in October. Date to return to Jacob's is not known at this time but anticipate shortly after debriefing from service.

**Music Committee:** praying for Melinda Kelly's heart condition.

**Mission's Committee:** Bob Moyer will present a mission update in church on Sept 15<sup>th</sup>. A social time is planned for after the service to greet Bob. The Mission's Outreach Committee has been meeting several times since August. The committee comprises of nine members. They are working towards strengthening the work of the Jacob's Church by supporting those missions who most closely have the goal of evangelism, discipleship and growing new churches. 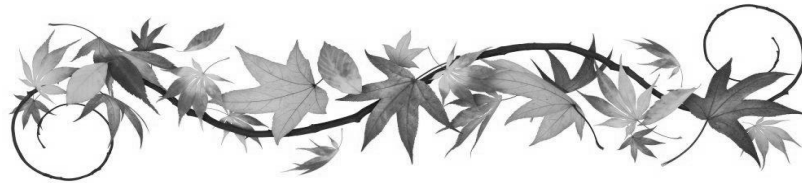

If you are interested in singing with the choir for just two months, please consider joining us for the months of November and December to sing anthems for Thanksgiving, Advent and Christmas. We rehearse Thursday evenings from 7:00 – 8:15. Please let me know if you are interested and I will prepare a folder of music for you.

*Did you know.....* the **prelude** serves to set the tone for the worship service, to invite worshipers to prepare for the transition from their everyday lives into a sacred place of communion with God and with each other? The prelude generally lasts about three minutes and gives everyone time to be seated and prepare for the beginning of the service.

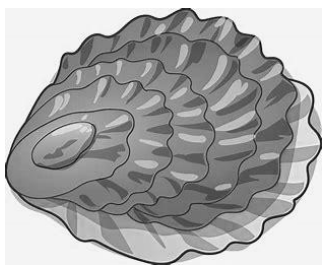
*Did you know....* the **postlude** serves to do the opposite. The music sends the worshipers from communing with God and fellow church members out into the world.

### **Organ tidbit:**

All the pipes of our organ are from the original 1950 Fritzsche organ, except for one set. A set of pipes is called a rank. We have about 22 ranks of pipes. The manuals (keyboards) usually have 61 pipes per rank and the pedals usually have 32 pipes per rank. I did not go up into the chambers to count, but I estimate that we have approximately 1,200 pipes.

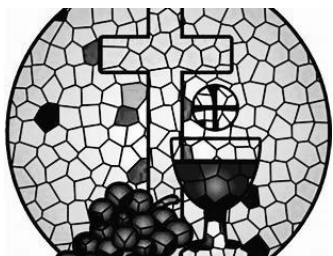

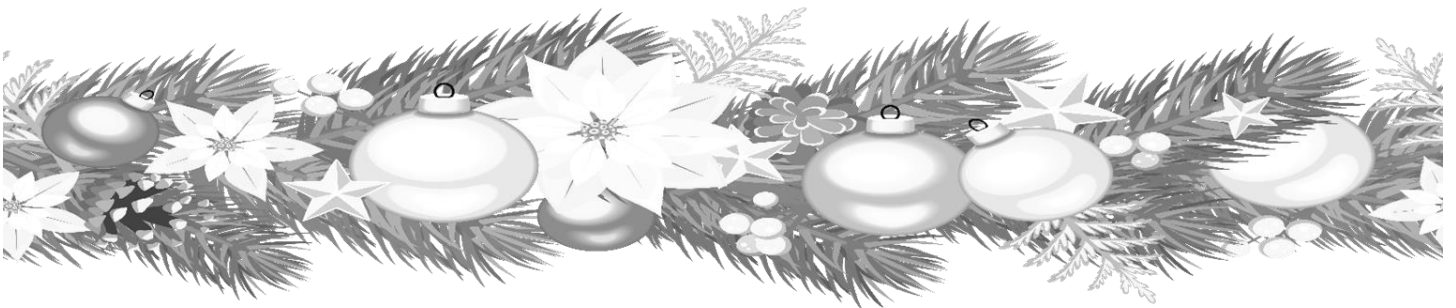
Please take note to the following:

# BARNABAS BENEFIT

CONNECTING CARING HEARTS WITH NEEDS WORLDWIDE (Oct. 2024 Update)

Thanks so much for your continual caring, praying, and supporting of Barnabas Benefit. As many of you know, we just returned from a 15 day “Footsteps of Paul” tour of Turkey, Greece, and Italy celebrating Natalie being cancer free. Great; but far too much of it trekking and climbing on ancient rugged paths morning to night. with frequent web access, we were able to stay in touch with the Barnabas Benefit leaders and actually send funds for some desperate needs while traveling. Paul couldn’t do that even though he walked “millions” of miles!

We continue to work with our normal borewells, microloans, etc. through our local leaders as funds became available and can be transmitted electronically. Thank you to those who “gave in advance” knowing we’d be gone. Fortunately, we also have been receiving ongoing help recently with our QuickBooks Online. It is a major blessing to have experts overseeing that everything is properly accounted for and 100% of the funds go to designated needs.

Borewells continue to be the most urgently requested item followed by microloans to start small businesses, and always more Bibles. It is a real joy to see the funding honoring special people in your lives (some deceased, others celebrating special events, or still others dedicated to friends and family who are impossible to buy gifts for “because they have everything”. I just received a gift this morning from a lady I don’t know honoring a special soon to be ten-year-old young lady’s birthday for another “giftless” birthday. It would have never crossed my mind at that age but multiple young folks now sponsor and inspire borewells.

I lived in the Philippines and Viet Nam for several years and the weather there this time of year is usually similar to the devastation you see lately on the news in the southern and central parts of the US. This year was worse and more widespread; ranging as far as Nepal from the coasts. Many of our leaders requested emergency funding for food and water and we supplied as we were able, especially for refugees and orphans. In some cases, we supplied tarps for those left homeless till they could start over on dry ground.

We have experienced an unusual number of serious medical situations. Fortunately, all are still alive after extensive treatment for issues such as surgery after a severe beating, to paralysis from blood clots, breast cancer surgery, and a liver donor/transplant yesterday. One leader’s wife died from kidney issues and we responded by helping supply requested “box” and a burial. (burials are just a hole in the ground but because of Hindu beliefs, they can be delayed for quite a few day if not done immediately and in secret)

We have had many exciting events and break throughs in spite of persecution and the events listed. Many of our leaders along with a helper venture into “unknown” areas on their motor bikes and bicycles (some we provided) with some still walking. Some areas not far from “civilization” still don’t routinely wear clothes. They form relationships with the village elder and discuss needs such as clean, accessible water and we provide as funds are available. Although I purposely don’t keep count, the number of lives that are touched are amazing and spreading from district to district. Many of these villages are controlled by the RSS (not friendly guys!) and/or village witch doctors. Now the new “problem”: each village wants to build their own (costly) church. We try to encourage meeting in homes or other buildings. We discourage churches for several reasons not the least of which churches (and Pastors) are targets whenever there is unrest and it is spreading.

The lady Natalie discovered to start a sewing school for single Mothers several years ago has trained and made sewing machine loans available to countless ladies. (Their repayments fund new loans)

Recently she completed men's tailoring training and now successfully teaches often illiterate and unemployable men. They are doing great. Not sure they can master embroidery which even Natalie had difficulty with!

We have funded water distribution to isolated families and small villages in Nepal with them supplying the labor and some funds. Since our goal is to build self-reliance, virtually all if not all of our projects require an investment of time and money into their own projects.

We have been working extensively with refugee situation especially orphans fleeing war torn areas such as Manipur on the Burmese army-controlled Myanmar border. We build a "shed" for the children but now the local government says it isn't safe and wants a building with concrete instead of ground floors. We just supplied 65 bags of concrete to help with construction along with water filtration and even a basic solar system for study.

We are also working to supply food and supplies to the predominately Christian Burmese Chin tribesmen fleeing the army into "inaccessible" jungle areas. Money travels person to person by courier and takes 10-14 days depending on army surveillances.

We have worn out several Jesus Film projectors in the past which we have found ways to replace. We are working on two more replacements right now. Sounds simple but getting them there to vague addresses and then getting the recipients documents to line up is a challenge. Customs costs are horrendous and sometime a bit more to "redeem" lost projectors. An aside, we did successfully "redeem" and redistribute several hundred Bibles being held by the police as evidence in an "anti-conversion case" in another area. We also are giving 100 audio Bibles to eager illiterate Nepalese villagers.

Many of the older businesses funded through our microloans have been a great help in funding and training. It's great to see earlier generations successful and involved. It is my hope to institute basic financial training programs of some sort to further ensure success.

There are so many other wonderful stories but because of concerns for the leaders and others, it is not wise for their security and safety to share them in writing or on line. I am working with others that God has brought into my life within the past year who have provided valuable expertise, great advice and help. Barnabas Benefit's future will be even more effective and exciting with them on the team. One person that I meet regularly is even fluent in the Telugu language that is spoken where most of our borewell work is done.

God is amazing and I am so grateful for each of you who have faithfully stood with us and those who are presently choosing to join us.

I have good news and God has answered your prayers.

John and Neelam's daughter's lungs have been treated in a specially equipped private hospital and she has been released to the civil government hospital in Golaghat, Assam.

Neelam is scheduled to be released today from the special hospital in Vijayawada in SE Andhra Pradesh after chemo, breast surgery, and a kidney transplant. Her Husband John will be taking her on the long journey north back home to their tea garden home in Assam India.

I am not sure if she knows yet of her two orphans who were fatally bitten by a snake(s?) trying to get wood from the forest to sell to pay for her treatment so this will be a mixed homecoming. I believe John's job was held as "pending" while he was with Neelam.

MD (David) who was paralyzed and wheelchair bound after surviving beatings and then other complications resulting in blood clots in his legs was taken on a long journey south to a Christian surgeon who operated and helped coordinate rehabilitation. It is best that MD not return to his flourishing house churches that he established in the holy Hindu city in the north and he will "start over" as a "tent maker" selling cups of tea in the city ten hours south of there where he was treated. I am following up with some of the house church members. MD is amazing. He started in the area where he previously started those house churches by being a "picker" which is one who survives by selling plastic, cloth, etc. from trash heaps. This is an especially difficult time for him because both his Muslim parents and his brother recently died in a terrible mountain bus crash in remote Darjeeling and he deals with some continuing mental health issues.

Please continue to pray for all the leaders that we work through even though their challenges right now are less extreme.

We have many great things happening in spite of setbacks and growing persecution. Borewells and relationships are spreading throughout the districts, especially where we have worked with a special well driller for quite a long time. (4 in progress honoring special people right now) The 100 audio Bible for illiterates in the mountains of Nepal is creating new opportunities. The cement flooring to meet government demands for properly housing orphans in Manipur should be complete along with some pure water and even lights. Although we didn't foresee all the possibilities, we are becoming more involved with children and young people who are the future of SE Asia (and the world). As some of you might know, a young lady's birthday contribution to Barnabas Benefit here in my area funded the materials and treats that a young teen and preteen brother and sister in India are providing to reach the children in the slums of their city in India. Refugee areas on the borders continue to be receptive to food and friendship/good news, especially the orphans.

I thank God for these opportunities and for each of you that care, pray, and give to enable these selfless leaders to touch lives and spread good news in their areas.

More later; wanted to do a quick update and praise report after last night's reports.

## **CLOTHING THE HOMELESS**

Last week when I was at New Day, I was in the donation room sorting dozens of bags of clothes supplied by our ministry partners. Emily, the director, told me she was sending in Jen to pick out an outfit. Jen came in and I greeted her with a smile. She told me she hadn't showered in 2 weeks because she didn't have anything to change into. I found some sweatpants just her size. We looked through the tops and she spotted a Penn State sweatshirt. She exclaimed, "I went there! I would love that one." I had to pause for a moment in my head...how does a college graduate end up in a place like this. I know it's not hard to get hooked on pain killers and then it's not a long trail to fentanyl, especially when it's less than \$10 a bag. It really can happen to anyone. She also picked out a soft t-shirt and I sent her on her way to get a shower.

This story is heart-breaking, and yet it's a reality to far too many people. Pray that the women in addiction would have the desire to get clean and that they would get the help they need when ready. Also pray that they can stay clean because recovery is a life-long journey.

The current director Emily is a Christian. When I asked her what she'd like prayer for she

mentioned that God would bring along more Christian workers to New Day. She's currently the only one at this particular space. Join me in praying God would raise up Christian social workers that have the leading by the Spirit to enter into this very spiritually dark world. Pray also that the Christians He raises up would have longevity to stay. This fall, I'll have been volunteering at New Day for 6 years. Most workers don't last more than a year or two because the nature of the work is so brutal and vicariously traumatic.

IMPACT used the center on Saturday, October 5th and Saturday, October 19th for their breakfast gatherings.

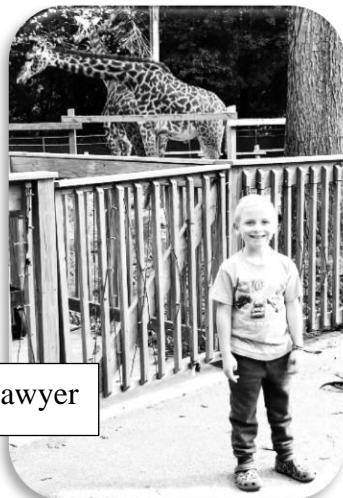
Kids Night Out was held on Sunday, October 20th. Mission Crafters for women of all ages was held on Friday, October 25th in church basement.

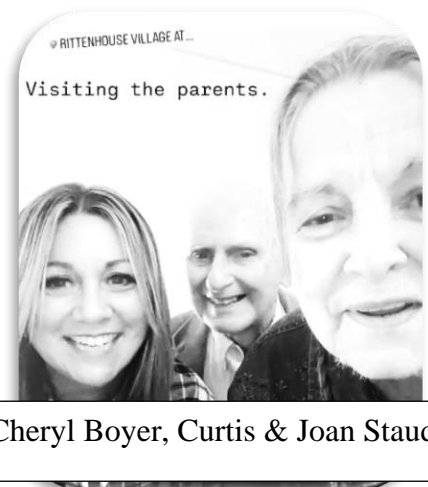

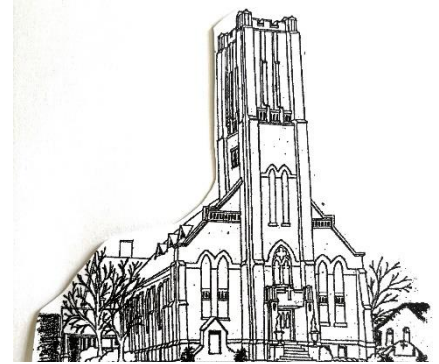
