But the fruit of the Spirit is love, JOY, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Against such things there is no law. Galatians 5:22,23

If you were asked the simple question, "Are you joyful," what would your answer be? I really believe that God wants all of us to have **JOY** and be fulfilled people. Although not pleased with the circumstances He was experiencing, Jesus still possessed a "Spirit of peace and forgiveness."

Is it possible for us to have joy in a world full of stress and hardships? The answer to that question is "Yes!" Start counting your blessings today. Thank God for your life, family, health and job. Stop concentrating on the negative aspects of life. Learn to forgive and to say "I'm sorry." To a large degree, whether or not you are joyful in this life will depend upon you. P.S. "Be Joyful!"



DON'T WORRY, INSTEAD FIND HOPE IN GOD DURING TRIALS

How many of you have ever found yourself in a circumstance where you were afraid? Maybe you were afraid because you were living on your own in this crazy world for the first time without your parents to guide you. Maybe you were afraid because you just lost your job and you weren't sure how you were going to pay your bills. Or, maybe you were afraid because your spouse, whom you were married to for most of your life, has passed. Now, you need to learn how to live life without them.

All of us experience being afraid at some point in our lives. For me, it was when my son, Michael, was born. My wife, Lauren, had to have an emergency C section because there were complications with the baby. So, they cut her open, but because of the complications she tore open. This caused her to lose a lot of blood. I remember walking in the room after getting my gown on and seeing her lying on the table. She was shivering, and her lips were blue. I remember hearing her repeat to me, "I'm cold". At the same time Michael was born, and they held him up close to the lights like they did with *Simba* in the *Lion King*, so I could see him. However, I also remember the panic of the doctors after they saw how much blood she was losing. As the doctors handed me Michael, a fear came over me. As I sat and looked at my wife, and then at Michael, a thought ran through my head. What if Lauren doesn't make it through this ordeal? At that point I feared not only for her life, because I would be losing my best friend and partner, but I feared raising Michael as a single father. It was then that I began to pray. Suddenly, a Bible verse, that has been very close to my heart since giving my life to Christ, ran through my head. Proverbs 3:5-6 reads:

"Trust in the Lord with all your heart do not lean on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight."

It was then that a peace came over me. I realized that God was going to take care of us, and he did. Lauren recovered from losing so much blood, and Michael has just turned seven months old. God provided for us, and all I had to do was trust in him.

"All I had to do," sounds easy, right?

However, trusting in God is easier said than done when it comes to trials. Thankfully, Jeremiah 29:1-14 shows us how to trust God amidst trials.

I want to share these helpful steps with you in the next four newsletters so that you may use them if you are currently going through a trial. If you are not, praise God. However, I would suggest that you would still take notes as one day you will face a trial in your life. So, we will discover together that one can find hope in God amidst trials by (1) continuing to live your life for God; (2) not being led away from God through lies; and (3) knowing God has not left you.

When you put all this together the text shows us that:
