THE PASTOR'S EPISTLE "TRUSTING GOD AT ALL TIMES"

But Joseph told them, "Don't be afraid of me. Am I god, to judge and punish you? As far as I am concerned, God turned into good what you meant for evil, for he brought me to this high position I have today so that I could save the lives of many people. No, don't be afraid. Indeed, I myself will take care of you and your families." And he spoke very kindly to them, reassuring them. (Genesis 50:19-21 L.B.)

Only God is able to take what seems to be a terrible situation and then use if for good. Often our faith is put to the test in life. After Joseph was betrayed by his brothers and sold into slavery, he was still able to forgive them and say, "you meant this for harm, but God meant if for good."

In this situation it was easy for Joseph to understand how God used his misfortune to save and preserve His chosen people. But what about the times in our own lives when we can't make sense of what is happening to us? Often, we become discouraged or angry with God. We might even be tempted to ask, "Does God really know what He's doing?" or "Does God really care about me?"

In Job 5:7 we read "yet man is born unto trouble, as the sparks fly upward." Many times, we have noticed that fire does naturally fly upward. So just as naturally as fire will raise up toward the sky, trouble will naturally come to us all. Keeping this sober fact in mind we must now decide how we will react to negative situations. With the help of the Holy Spirit I pray that all of us will keep our trust in God who loves us so much that He sent Jesus Christ to die for our sins. By trusting God, we are not only being faithful, but we are helping others to be strong during their times of trial. By trusting God, we are being stepping stones to faith and not stumbling blocks.

May we all learn the meaning of trusting God as we meditate upon the Word of God, worship, pray, and serve both God and all people. Amen.

The Special Events Committee will organize all special events. The Christian Education Committee will be responsible for VBS, youth groups, bible classes, etc. Pastor Shay will meet with all interested volunteers. - 5. The Missions Committee still in search of volunteers
- 6. Youth Group has a service project for September 29th, 2018. Discussed possibly a meal at Wednesday Bible Study and invite KFC parents as an outreach. The Step-Up class will be using the Alpha video curriculum which explores the basics of Christian faith.
- 7. Website/Social Media website is running smoothly and next step is to begin streaming sermon audio.
- 8. Shinefest was a success. Next year end time would be 8 pm versus 10 pm.
- 9. The Wuchter House will be filled by the Schlegel family as of June 1st, 2019. Discussion was made for possible usage of the west side of the Wuchter House.
- 10. The Property Committee- Gutters on church have been replaced. Porch on the Fenstermaker House has been completed and debris needs to be removed. This fall the siding will be power washed and gutters replaced. Mike Follweiler brought forth need for repair of the concrete ramps to the church and walkways and steps of the Parish House. Motion was made to repair in the amount not to exceed \$3000 by Kevin Dellicker and seconded by Jared Hermany. The motion carried.

Rural Church to Note 200th Anniversary

The 200th anniversary of St. Jacob's Union Church at Jacksonville will be observed Sunday with two programs.

The first will be at 2 p.m., the second at 7:30 p.m. The pastors of the Lutheran and United Church of Christ congregations will preside.

Guest sermons will be delivered at the afternoon service by the Rev. Charles D. Rodenberger, president of Lehigh Synod (UCC), and the Rev. Luther Schlenker, assistant to the president of the Lutheran Ministerium of Pennsylvania.

The evening service will include meditations by two congregational sons who have entered the ministry, the Revs, Carl Osenbach and Carl Trexler.

The Rev. Clarence R. Rahn, pastor of the UCC congregation, expects the church to be filled to capacity for each of the services. The church seats about 600 persons.

The Rev. Richard H. Schaefer is the 13th minister for union church's Lutheran congregation. He accepted a call to the church two years ago.

Rev. Rahn, his father - in law, is the congregation's 12th pastor. He has served the UCC congregation nearly 40 years. Rev. Schaefer is married to the former Ruth C. Rahn.

The church — located along Route 143 midway between New Tripoli and Kempton — was founded originally as a Reformed church upon two acress of land donated by Daniel Hamm. It was a log structure A third acre of land was acquired in 1807, and Lutherans were gievn a right to worship in the church.


Late that year, parishoners of both faiths worked together and financed — for \$1,407.92 a new church, also of wood.

The third church was built of brick in 1862.

Construction costs of \$6,500 were minimized by parishioners who donated labor and materials.

In June 1925, it was decided to construct a new church building — at a cost of \$109,000. This is the structure that stands today. Special campaigns to clear the church of indebtedness were conducted in 1945.

Since that time, a \$14,000 pipe organ and two new heating systems have been installed. In addition, nine acres of land adjacent to the original church site have been acquired.



Our work here is mostly done under the banner of the Philadelphia Gospel Movement. One initiative that Katie has already help to execute is Family Homework Night, recruiting families and purchasing/organizing 14 bins of books!

Family Homework Night brings 4 churches together in Brewerytown for a weekly dinner and literacy time for K-3 students and their families. Kicking off last Thursday night, a dozen young scholars came to a church for one:one reading. Lilia read to a 2nd grader who was behind due in part to her mom's ocular condition.

Grant Skeldon

"The church does not have a Millennial problem, it has a discipleship problem" shared Grant Skeldon on Saturday. Grant is a speaker and forthcoming author on the Millennial generation. We hosted him as our city is no exception to the national pattern of Millennials not attending or being given opportunities to lead within churches.

At our multi-racial and multi-generational event, Grant shared how most church events are based around listening to either a pastor or worship band. He pointed out that in an age of podcasts, content is no longer the draw it once was. Instead, he highlighted discipleship, especially crossgenerational, as a powerful and unique tool to transform lives and our world, giving tips such as sharing our personal calendars with our disciples to have them observe/assist our everyday lives.

Based off of Ephesians 4:11-12, Grant also pointed out that churches/pastors tend to emphasize shepherding/teaching gifts while Millennials are looking to actions to change the world. This spurred such conversation that not a person left even a half hour after the event was supposed to be over! We saw how believers with different gifts, races, and generations need to come together for the gospel in our city.
