THE PASTOR'S EPISTLE "ARE YOU ENJOYING YOUR LIFE?"

"The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly."

John 10:10 K.J.V.

I believe that God really intends for us to enjoy life. In (Genesis 1:32 L.B.) we read, "Then God looked over all that He had made, and it was excellent in every way." God created everything in an excellent way to demonstrate His power and perfection and for our enjoyment. Jesus said He came to earth so that we might have abundant life. I can say with confidence, that if you are not enjoying life, then you are missing out on God's promises and intentions for you.

Perhaps you feel that life has robbed you of happiness and enjoyment. Jesus warned us that there was a thief who would try to steal away our abundant life – many people are not experiencing a joyful life because they are not looking in the right places. 

CHOIR NEWS the choir is on summer break, will resume in September.


HEALING PRAYER MINISTRY will continue to meet during the month of August on Tuesday at 6:30PM in the Activity Center for prayer and worship.




