His gifts, expertise, and calling are to link that cultural information and the Bible so that its message applies to our lives today in very practical ways.

"We might be the only person in their day, their week, or even their life to treat them with kindness and dignity. When the women come into the drop-in center it might be the only time in their day that someone doesn't treat them as a dollar sign, but as a human being. As the women begin to experience this type of care and dignity, that is when they can see that their life could possibly look different."

As I (Katie) heard this words from a seasoned volunteer at the drop-in center I was energized to start my shift. I knew it made a difference that I greeted the women with a smile and talked kindly to them, but I didn't understand the impact these small actions could have. Each week that I serve in Kensington at the drop-in center, my prayer is that I would be present to the women. We don't know if or when they will desire to change their lives, but the drop-in center is equipped with case workers, free legal advice, and even a safe house for women who are ready.

Mary* was clean for three years. When her husband died recently, she relapsed. I had the chance to connect with her last week as she asked my

opinion about her outfit. We mutually shared how hard it is as a women to believe you are beautiful when the world is always saying otherwise. Pray for Mary that she can find her way out of this horrible world of addiction and get clean again.

This week Tina*, a middle-aged woman said aloud in the front room for anyone to hear, "I gotta get things right with God. I gotta ask Him to forgive me for something real bad that I did."

She went back to the kitchen for a bit; meanwhile the front room emptied out. She came back and once again exclaimed how she needed God to forgive her. I walked over to her and said, "Do you know 1st John 1:9?" I quoted it from memory. She took refuge in the fact that we can confess and ask for forgiveness and God is faithful and just to forgive.

Mary and Tina's lives look very different from ours, though we can all relate to needing to feel worthy or being forgiven. Pray they would find each of these things in Jesus. (*not their real names)


