# THE PASTOR'S EPISTLE "THE POWER OF THE RESURRECTION AND THE CORONAVIRUS"

BUT VERY EARLY on Sunday morning they took the ointments to the tomb---and found that the huge stone covering the entrance had been rolled aside. So, they went in—but the Lord Jesus' body was gone. They stood there puzzled, trying to think what could have happened to it. Suddenly two men appeared before them, clothed in shining robes so bright their eyes were dazzled. The women were terrified and bowed low before them. Then the men asked, "Why are you looking in a tomb for someone who is alive? He isn't here! He has come back to life again! Don't you remember what he told you back in Galilee—that the Messiah must be betrayed into the power of evil men and be crucified and that he would rise the third day?" Then they remembered, and rushed back to Jerusalem to tell his eleven disciples—and everyone else—what had happened. Luke 24:1-9 L.B.

The followers of Jesus Christ were about to experience a power they could never have imagined. Having just witnessed the death of the man in whom all of their hopes rested, the followers of Jesus were experiencing the pits of despair. Feeling confused, angry, betrayed and defeated they certainly were a miserable group of people.

I don't believe any of Jesus' followers were prepared for what they were about to experience at the tomb. In the three words "HE IS RISEN," the lives of this small, pathetic group of people would be changed forever! Defeat would give way to Victory as the power of the resurrection would affect the lives of millions of souls throughout history.

I would like for you to ask this question, "Am I experiencing the power of the resurrection in my own life?" As difficult situations arise are you still filled with a hope which boldly says, "My God is Able?" Do you possess a joy and peace which cannot be shaken by the circumstances of life?

In December of 1776, Revolutionary War Patriot Thomas Paine wrote the famous words, "These are the times that try men's souls..." In 2020, we are also experiencing "trying times" of a different sort. In II Timothy 1:7 (KJV), we read, "For God hath not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and a sound mind." With the coronavirus and its effect on the entire world, we, as God's children, should reflect confidence and hope to everyone we meet. We must exercise wisdom and caution in coping with this pandemic. We must be respectful of our national and state leaders and be careful to follow their safety recommendations. But fear has no place in

the lives of those who proclaim and follow our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Brothers and Sisters in Christ, call upon the Lord! Be wise. Comfort and encourage one another. By the grace of Almighty God (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit), we will endure and prevail!

When Jesus Christ rose from the dead, he conquered death and all the powers of evil. It's wonderful to inherit this resurrection power as a Child of God. If you are not experiencing power and joy in life, please open your heart to Jesus Christ, who is the author and finisher of our faith, and the only Savior of all Heaven and Earth.

May you discover the power and peace of the resurrection this Easter Season.





## To: Northwestern Lehigh Church Families

March, 2020

The Northwestern Lehigh Veterans Memorial is continuing to move towards the construction phase in Ontelaunee Park. The attached architect's rendering shows the latest design for the memorial.

The essential piece needed to complete the design is the number of names that will be engraved on the granite panels so that the size of the memorial footprint can be determined. Our area churches are the most important source for veteran's names from your archives, memorials and cemeteries.

To date, 1725 names of Veterans have been entered in our data base. <u>The committee</u> has set July 4<sup>th</sup>, 2020 as the deadline for accepting names for engraving on the granite panels. Veteran's names will be engraved, in alphabetical order, on the panel that shows the time period in which they served.

Names received after July 4<sup>th</sup> may be added after construction is complete.
Unfortunately, they will have to be placed where space is available on the panels which, will detract from the alphabetical order and make it more difficult to locate the Veteran's name.

An important consideration for the memorial design is the ability to add names of future veterans thereby including our youth who will answer the call to serve in future conflicts. In doing so, this memorial will perpetually honor the service of all our veterans from the birth of our Nation into the future, recognizing the on-going struggle to protect our individual and religious freedoms.

Our website, <a href="http://nwlehighvetsmemorial.org">http://nwlehighvetsmemorial.org</a>. shows the design and progress toward securing donations required to build the memorial. The symbolism of all the features designed into the memorial is explained. The website lists the names of all veterans that have been submitted to date, the Rules for Engraving and application form to submit Veteran's names. There is NO FEE to submit a Veteran's name to be included on the memorial before construction begins.


