THE PASTOR'S EPISTLE

"Let's Celebrate Easter"

"After the Sabbath, at dawn on the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to look at the tomb.

² There was a violent earthquake, for an angel of the Lord came down from heaven and, going to the tomb, rolled back the stone and sat on it. ³ His appearance was like lightning, and his clothes were white as snow. ⁴ The guards were so afraid of him that they shook and became like dead men. ⁵ The angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. ⁶ He is not here; he has risen, just as he said. Come and see the place where he lay. ⁷ Then go quickly and tell his disciples: 'He has risen from the dead and is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him.' Now I have told you." ⁸ So the women hurried away from the tomb, afraid yet filled with joy, and ran to tell his disciples. ⁹ Suddenly Jesus met them. "Greetings," he said. They came to him, clasped his feet and worshiped him. ¹⁰ Then Jesus said to them, "Do not be afraid. Go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me." Matthew 28:1-10

It was a week full of emotion for our Lord. He knew what lay ahead for Him—unspeakable agony in His suffering on the cross; being abandoned and left alone by His Father.

We read in Hebrews 12:2...Jesus, who for the joy that was set before Him, endured the cross, despising the shame..." The joy that was set before Christ was to finish the work which brought Him to earth—our salvation through His suffering and death on the cross. Jesus' work was completed when He rose from the dead. While on the cross He cried, "It is finished," and died. The glory of Easter that we celebrate in our lives is that our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ rose from the dead, and is alive forevermore. No other religion on the face of the earth has a risen, living Savior, only the Christian faith. The most unique symbol Christians have for their faith is an empty tomb, because Christ Lives!

Ever since the sin of Adam and Eve, man has been estranged from God. In spite of man turning away from Him, God has sought us, for it is not His will that anyone be lost. He has made provision for the forgiveness of our sins through His only begotten Son. We celebrated the birth of God's Son at Christmas: When the fullness of time was come, God sent forth His son, born of a woman, born under the Law, that he might redeem them that were under the Law, that we might receive the adoption of sons..." How amazing, that God loves us so much He was willing to sacrifice His Son that we might be saved.


Christ's suffering and death on the cross and His rising from the dead—His resurrection to life—fulfill the purpose of His coming. The salvation He purchased is available to all through faith in Him; "Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ and thou shalt be saved...for there is **none other name** given among men whereby we must be saved." (John 14:6, Acts 4:12)

God loves you very much; you are very precious and very dear to Him. He demonstrated this love in allowing His Son to suffer and die in our place on the cross, and then raising Him from the dead. What a tremendous blessing that “whosoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have everlasting life!”

We have reason to celebrate Easter, every day of our lives. We should live as victorious children of a resurrected King. I pray that we will all have a joy and peace which will continue and grow stronger all the days of our lives.

Loving Neighbors

Miss W in our neighborhood is a mixture of beauty and brokenness needing Jesus to address, just like each of us. She struggles with alcoholism, takes care of 8 children, and was recently hospitalized with COVID. I (Katie) have been encouraged by how the community, including many Christians, have come alongside her.

Late last year, the neighborhood association board meeting which consisted of older Black Christian women, and Dave, had some extra money and desired to give Christmas gifts to children in need. Dave pulled me onscreen and I shared about Miss W. They readily agreed and we identified 4 families in our community.

The experience was so uplifting that the community association has continued to provide food and utility support into 2021. The other week Dave picked up food from Small Things/Easter Outreach, who we collaborated with to deliver meals last year. As Miss W answered the door to receive the box, it came up in conversation that she once lived at Families Forward, the emergency family shelter a few blocks away.

Our paths did not cross while she was living there, though I have appreciated the opportunity to serve there and be a bridge for partnership with our church. Families Forward does important work to temporarily house families in crisis, though the reconverted 150 year old former-state hospital is not the warmest place for those experiencing

trauma. The walled and imposing facility also appears cut off from neighborhood support. I only connected with their literacy coordinator because she wore a sweatshirt of our alma-mater at a community event. Through this relationship and support from our church, we transformed 3 areas to read, study, and relax for the 70+ families that reside there for 6-9 months.

Families Forward highlighted these efforts and our church in their recent newsletter. They thanked City Church for being a community oriented and funding "painting supplies, furniture, art, and bookshelves, completing an amazing makeover from clinical-looking hallways to inviting spaces" and myself for "consistency, creativity, and commitment to literacy and community."

Though it has been difficult to not be back at Families Forward throughout the pandemic, I was glad for the opportunity to serve a family that has now been able to find permanent housing. Now that I am half-vaccinated, I can't wait to soon be there in person and show the love of Jesus to these neighbors in need.
