THE PASTOR'S EPISTLE

"DON'T ALLOW THIS ADVENT SEASON TO BECOME JUST ANOTHER TRADITION"

Every year, beginning on the 28th of November, the church celebrates advent. However, many people don't understand the meaning behind the tradition. Growing up, I knew that we began lighting candles at church each Sunday, and the more candles we lit the closer we got to Christmas Day. This, of course, was exciting for a kid. Besides that, I didn't understand the representation behind the tradition.

What advent actually represents is the time of expectant waiting and preparation for both the celebration of the Nativity of Christ at Christmas and the return of Christ at the Second Coming. Not only does the tradition of advent look to the past as Israel waited for the expected Messiah, but it looks to the future as the church waits for Jesus' Second Coming.

So, as we wait for Jesus' return, despite our external circumstances, the Holy Spirit is preparing us through Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love. This is represented through the four candles we light each Sunday before Christmas.

November 28 – Hope for God's Presence
Yet this I call to mind, and therefore I have hope:
Because of the Lord's great love, we are not consumed,
for his compassions never fail. They are new every morning;
great is your faithfulness, say to myself,
"The Lord is my portion; there I will wait for him." Lamentations 3:21-24

December 5 – Hope for God's Peace Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid." John 14:27

December 12 – Hope for God's Joy
"But let all who take refuge in you be glad; let them ever sing for joy.

Spread your protection over them,
that those who love your name may rejoice in you." Psalm 5:11

December 19 – Hope for God's Love "Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?"

Jesus replied: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind." This is the first and greatest commandment.

And the second is like it: Love your neighbor as yourself.

All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments." Matthew 22:36-40

The fifth candle that is lit in the middle on Christmas Eve is the Christ candle. This candle represents the light that Jesus brings to the world.

December 24 – The Light of Christ "In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in Heaven" Matthew 5:16

So, this Christmas season, while it is difficult to keep in mind what advent truly represents in the midst of holiday celebrations, shopping, lights and decorations, and joyful carols, let us not make advent into just another tradition that we just do, but let it be a tradition that we live.

1. Pastor Schlegel opened in prayer

- 2. Diane spoke on "Voice of Martyrs" program. 1st Sunday of November is international day of prayer. She wants to share information from the program to the congregation on that Sunday. Diane also reports on Bob Moyer returning to PA for five Sundays. He wants to speak to the congregation about his work. A love offering will be held for him the Sunday he speaks. Diane plans to include his name for our yearly budget.
- 3. Tarissa Van Blargan and Cindy Loch report that the nursery is almost done; a light needs to be fixed, but Dave Zoghby is aware of it. Total cost was \$67.72.
- 4. Property Committee: October 16th is work day; kitchen ceiling and outdoor work to be done. A lift is being rented to do stained glass work. Dave Zoghby has been doing repairs around the buildings including relacing lights in emergency exit signs. Mike Follweiler has looked into leaking roof issue in the church tower. Possible problem with the rubber roof. Jared Hermany is hoping to get a masonry to do frequent checks on the church to keep up with repairs. Mike Madtes will use his drone to film the tower of the church to get a better view of damage to assess repairs.
- 5. Schoolhouse: waiting on official quote for demolition, looking for second quote. Plans to salvage the timbers. This topic will be brought up at the annual congregation meeting for approval. There was a \$2812.50 bill for the structural engineer. Jared will finish up with the masonry since repairs will not be done to the building.
- 6. Youth: Tad reports the Sunday youth group has been meeting. Sidewalk Sunday school continues as normal every week. Kona Ice at Germansville location was successful. This Thursday will be the first day back to Germansville to restart the program.
- 7. Pastor Schlegel reports the young adult's bible study hasn't met due to scheduling conflicts with those attending.
- 8. Streaming and website are up to date. There were some sound issues with the streaming that Dave Zoghby will be asked to look into. Internet still has issues with dropping during streams. Action needs to be taken or else streaming isn't worth it. Blue Ridge Cable needs to be contacted about possible upgrade on wireless internet.
- 9. Pulpit committee: Kayla reports no applicants at this time but broader recruitment email will be sent out soon. Next week is October 26.
- 10. Lindsay from the co-op wants to meet on three Mondays a month in the Activity center from 9:30 to 11:30am. Mike Follweiler makes a motion and Jared second to allow them to use the activity center three Mondays a month. The motion carried.
- 11. Music director committee is to meet soon. Mike Madtes will sit on that committee as a board representative.

- 12. Member withdrawal from Duane, Kristina and Tori Bertsch. Kayla makes a motion and Mike Madtes second to approve their membership withdrawal.
- 13. 2022 budget meeting will be held 10/24 at 2pm
- 14. Oyster Supper is 11/6. Lesher Appliances will come Friday to check out fridge and freezer issues. Might need to purchase new fridge and freezer in the near future; estimated cost of new freezer \$3899 and freezer is \$4299.
- 15. Pastor Schlegel reports that a family at Little Lambs preschool recently lost their house to a fire. Nick and Nicole Muth and their four children are now homeless. There will be two weeks of love offerings to help the family.
- 16. Pastor Topics:
 - a. Tad brought up bringing back fellowship after church again. Board was in agreement to allow it to start again.
 - b. Tad suggested the idea of food being served at the congregational meeting to entice people to stay for the meeting. With some discussion the board agreed to have light fellowship that Sunday of the meeting and not do a full potluck meal.
- 17. Twin Pines retreat is coming up. Ed Sawyer is running it.
- 18. Choir wants to approach Brenda to ask her to stay on as either the organist or the choir director until a new music director is found.
- 19. A MOMENT ALONE

It's rare when you get one on one time with a client at New Day, but there I (Katie) was, getting to learn more about Autumn's story. She grew in the Philly suburbs and has been coming into New Day for about a year. Autumn was born to 2 alcoholic parents. Her mom is almost 20 years sober at this point, but her dad killed himself when she was just 14."That really messed me up," Autumn said to me as I asked her about her story. As she finished up straightening her hair and got ready to leave, I said, "I really enjoyed getting to know you." She thanked me and knew I was being genuine. "No one out here gives a s*** about your story. That means a lot." She was then shocked to learn that I don't work for New Days but choose to spend time serving women in Kensington. I could see that made our conversation even more meaningful to her.

Ladies that come into New Day aren't always ready to turn from their current life and seek healing. That's why New Day exists. Gently used clothing to select and a meal bring them in day after day, week after week. However, when that time comes, and someone is ready to change everything, a case worker is waiting to show them the way. My prayer for Kensington goes something like this..."God, for those that aren't ready to give up their addiction would you keep them alive. Would you prepare them to turn from this life and desire to get clean. Would they find

you, Jesus. For those who are ready, would you give them the strength and the accountability to stay clean. Would they find hope and life in you lesus, Amen."

Meade Elementary

Seven years ago this month our oldest was diagnosed with dyslexia. I had no idea the journey God would have us on as a result of this, but currently I'm in the process of getting certified in Wilson to teach kids with severe reading, phonics and spelling issues.

God has me serving right now at a school in a high poverty area in North Philly at Meade Elementary. I just started working with a 2nd and a 4th grader. My second week at the school the 2nd grader's father was shot and killed over the weekend. She currently lives with her grandmom, who has been in the process of adopting her. The 4th grade boy I'm working with has almost no reading nor spelling ability. As we have seen in our own family, one on one tutoring with Wilson has the ability to radically improve a student's life.

2021 Panama mission's recap.

Hello all. 2021 is winding down and I just wanted to let you know how the year went.

The new church is up and running. It is now solar powered. I also have 2 house churches in another part of the Comarca. We had a 12-hour church service that included musicians to play the whole 12 hours, 8 churches had their people sing at the front of the church, 3 pastors were there. There was coffee, bread rolls, breakfast and other food. 250 people came to praise the Lord that day. We will do it again in January.

Recently we had a time of 10 days of Prayer and Fasting. 5 other churches participated in somewhat lesser degrees. Many bibles were given away.

Over 1000 pairs of eyeglasses were handed out in 6 different locations to help the people with their eye sight.

I built 2 more rainwater Recovery Systems during the year.

I have 2 girls in a safe house near me that were beaten in their home. They are doing well and are actively seeking permanent housing.
