#### THE PASTOR'S EPISTLE

"Expect Great Things"

"If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that giveth to all men liberally, and unbraideth not; and it shall be given him, but let him ask in faith, nothing wavering.

For he that wavereth is like a wave of the sea driven with the wind and tossed.

For let not that man think that he shall receive any thing of the Lord."

#### STAYING CONNECTED:

#### A little goes a long way

I (Katie) think one of the many lessons we've all learned through experiencing the Covid-19 pandemic is how important connection is. We aren't meant to live in isolation, but for relationships.

My last week as a volunteer at New Day in Kensington was last March 10th. I remember being aware that some virus was prevalent, but none of us had any idea the extent of how much life would soon change. By Monday of the following week, New Day was closed until further notice and I wouldn't step foot in the door until almost a year later.

Over the pandemic months, I stayed in touch with the staff as our basement filled with hygiene bags and clothes from area churches. They recently told met he space is now starting to be activated by a limited number of staff and women caught in addiction. As Dave and I drove into Kensington last week, we were struck by the amount of activity on the main drag of Kensington Ave. Unlike some sectors of the economy, the drug business is booming. As New Day was down to almost no clothing in reserve, the staff were unbelievable grateful for the 13 bags of clothing we passed along. For women caught in addiction and experiencing housing insecurity, clothing provides warmth, dignity, and a touch point to case-workers, who care for these women and are ready to provide a way out when they are willing.

As I mentioned how I can't wait to come back as a volunteer, the staff told me how the women have asked about me. I was surprised to hear that considering I was only there once a week and some of them are so high I didn't think they could remember a thing. The staff assured me that my consistent presence and how I try to connect with the women in small bits of conversation actually goes a long way. I was shocked and so encouraged! There aren't consistent people who love them and show them kindness. They often only know people who use them for selfish gain.

My heart is to continue to connect churches and individuals to New Day. Thank you if your church is already a partner! New Day now has an Amazon wish list that you or your church can purchase currently needed items. Email me and I would be glad to send that along to you. If you are in the area and have clothing to donate, our basement now has space!
