THE PASTOR EPISTLE "JESUS AT THE CENTER OF IT ALL"

In his sermon *Easter Through the Eyes of God*, John MacArthur points out, "Even the most glorious sunset, when gazed at long enough, will eventually lose its appeal. The scenery becomes so familiar that the senses grow dull to its vivid color and beauty. The scenery doesn't need changing--only your perspective. Such is the case with Easter. Our modern eyes have gazed on the wonderful story for so long that we've lost our appreciation for its richness. What's worse, we've missed the real story--the forces at work behind the scenes that make the crucifixion and resurrection defining moments for all mankind."

As we find ourselves celebrating another Easter season, I find, we often become so busy that we truly don't take the time to appreciate what Easter is all about. It isn't about the eggs, the bunny, or the candy. It is about Jesus Christ. As Galatians 3:13 tells us,

Who redeemed us from the curse of the law by becoming a curse for us, for it is written: "Cursed is everyone who is hung on a tree."

Jesus was the only means of redemption because he was without blemish, without sin. So, he became our penal substitution and went to the cross in our place to be slaughtered as a lamb. It was through his shed blood that the sins of the world were covered.

This great act of mercy that Jesus showed to us made it seem like Satan had won. However, three days later Jesus rose from the tomb. He showed that even though he suffered and died, it was Satan who ultimately lost in the end.

This act of grace would then open our way to live eternally with God. As John 14:6 says, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one can come to the Father except through me."

So, as we celebrate Easter this year, let's change our perspective in order that the Easter story doesn't become just another tradition. Instead, let's truly celebrate with songs of praise and worship because God had a plan from the beginning of time, and that plan culminated through His Son Jesus Christ who saved us all.
