Is There More?

Do you have a good personal definition of religion? That seems like a silly question, but it is not really. Most people think religion is some kind of belief in and worship of supernatural powers or power, a faith that includes one God or many gods. When people ask, "What is your religion?" they are normally asking, "What do you practice?" Muslims go to Mosques, if you are Jewish you attend synagogue on the Sabbath, Buddhists have their temples, and Christians build churches. Everyone prays, engages in rituals, and employs "holy men or women" to function as intermediaries, essentially priests. Normally these individuals are viewed as more faithful, or closer to their understanding of a chosen higher power.

Worldwide most religions –with the distinct exception of Christianity and Atheism– are culturally based. If you are in Saudi Arabia, India, or Japan you have a good shot at guessing what someone practices merely from a geographical perspective. Interestingly, Atheism, which is a decided non-belief in supernatural powers, a God, or gods, is one of the world's top three religions now coming in just behind Christianity (~31%) and Isalm (25%). So, how is atheism a religion? Well, that depends on what your definition of religion is.

Atheists do not collectively build temples or worship spaces, employ priests, or engage in meaningful community-centered rituals, but be assured atheism is a religion, because atheism is a faith system. At the core religion is a cogent system of truth that best explains the universe around us. It defines reality and seeks to answer questions like, "How did we get here? Why are we here? Is there a reality beyond what we experience through our senses? What is the origin and solution to evil?" The kind of questions that keep us up at night when we give pause to think about them.

Ultimately Christianity is unique among all faith systems, however, this uniqueness cannot be demonstrated if your definition of a religion is simply an observation of external practices. Every religion —even Atheism— requires faith, a trust in something outside one's self. Christianity is ultimately a relationship with the Creator Himself accessed by faith in His benevolent kindness, mercy, and free grace which He demonstrated most fully through the work of Jesus Christ on the cross. Muslims and Jews believe they will eventually be in union with their Creator, but in very different ways than Christians do; they believe that a person must earn the right to be with God and part of that earning involves rituals, ceremonies, and obedience to set moral codes and divine expectations.

That was a long set-up for me to ask the pastoral question, "If Christianity is unique not ultimately because of our external practices and rituals, but because we have access to the Almighty Creator of the heavens and earth through His amazing grace, are you personally satisfied with the grace you have received?" Honestly think about it, "Is there more of God's grace to be had?" Of course, we do not deserve it, but if I am reading the Scriptures correctly there's more grace to be had simply for the asking. If Paul the apostle thought so, I think we should too. In the same sentence that he expressed an assurance that he was Christ's possession, he said he continually pressed on to grasp more of the available relationship with Jesus (Phil. 3:12).

One of the marks of a faithful Church is that the pursuit of Jesus Christ is a topic the members regularly talk about and encourage one another to pursue together. I hope this article encourages you to do that, and even more it inspires you to run into the arms of God so that you might experience more of His amazing grace. ~soli deo gloria~

- 1. Pastor Stan opened in prayer and devotion.
- Visitors Mike F reports that the proposed Gentlemen of the Church outing will be postponed until next year due to scheduling conflicts. More information to come.
- 3. Property Report Dave reports the church roof repairs are scheduled to start mid-July. Tom is currently working on repairing walls and repainting multiple areas throughout the property. Windows continue to be replaced in the Wuchter house.
- Youth Group Will reports that he has started a young adults' bible study Sunday mornings starting at 9:00am in the Parish house. He is currently working on setting up an area for children 4 to 5th grade to come to during the adult bible study on Wednesday evenings. He is also reaching out to children of the community.

## **MISSIONS!**



#### **Welcoming the Community**

For many years, I felt like the odd "litter guy" in Philly. After developing a site that saw I,700 citizens sign up to clean their block once-aweek, reporters would reach out for a quote when they were writing about trash. The site, created by the coding community in Philly, ended up crashing during the pandemic, but the experience is still paying dividends.

My motivation for combatting litter was to remove a sign of hopelessness. It felt intuitive that it is detrimental to be shaped by consistent signs that your neighborhood is not cared for. When the City offered micro-grants for programs around gun violence prevention, I pitched my initiative, but was not selected. The connection between trash and violence was not yet shown with research.

Now however, a local ER doctor has worked with the Horticultural Society to show that cleaning and greening vacant lots reduces violent crime in the area by 29%. Influenced by this research, a grad student at Penn began to map out all 40,000 vacant parcels in the city. The site contains a decision tree to guide neighbors about how to improve a site based on the area gun violence prevalence, if it is publicly or privately owned, and local tree cover.

To bring this rudimentary site fully online, I hosted an event for the civic tech community as

well as activists at Woodland last week. To my surprise, even 6abc came! I was encouraged by how many people are excited to give their time to make this project a reality.

Hosting events at Woodland helps create connections to those outside the church and show we care about the same issues that are on their hearts. In addition to the gun violence presentation, we also hosted a gathering for a historic district nomination as well as a second summer of Toddler FreePlay.

Having a space for toddlers and their care givers to connect is especially important in University City. Many times one spouse finds work and the entire nuclear family moves across the country or world with them. This often leaves the spouse lonely and disconnected from support.

With all the good things happening in just a 800 sq ft space, we are so glad our church is having contractors revitalize the Fellowship Hall this summer that is over double the size!




