+ "From the Pastor's Study" +

Most people know *Christ* is a title, not a name. The official title of our God and Savior is the LORD Jesus Christ. LORD refers to Jesus' deity. When reading the Old Testament, we notice that LORD is capitalized. It is how our translators let us know that in the Hebrew the author is using the name God gave to Moses when He met him in the burning bush. Moses was worried the enslaved Jewish people would question him concerning the God that commissioned him, so He told Moses to tell them, "I AM sent me." In Hebrew, the letters YHWH roughly represent 'I AM.' The translators want us to see the distinction between the generic term for God, which is Elohim, and YHWH, the loyal covenant keeper, or LORD in English.

The second part of our Savior's official title is Christ. It comes from the Greek *Christos* or *Anointed One*. The Hebrew word for *Christos* is *Mashiach*, or in English, 'Messiah.' Behind the idea of anointing is the concept of being chosen. Jesus is the Chosen One, the Anointed One, the Messiah. The popular TV show *The Chosen* (and might I add programming well worth watching) in Hebrew would be called "Ha Mashiach."


So, what does this all have to do with Christmas? Actually, quite a bit. You see the Old Testament prophets who predicted the coming of the Messiah never knew enough about Jesus to describe Him *personally*. They knew the *titles* He would bear; they just did not know *who* would bear them. Sure, they talked about His majesty, His mission, and His miraculous power, but they had very little insight into His person. To do that He had to be experienced first-hand. That gift was given to the apostles, as well as His family, especially Mary. And you, if you receive Him into your life by faith.

Part of what we need to know about Jesus as a person is that He came in weakness. He came humbly as a baby born to a poor family in a manger. Could He have come all flashy and pompous like a king? Could He have come as a popular athlete, entertainer, or political leader? Of course, He could have. He is God and He could have worked that out. But is that really who Jesus, or God, truly is? I think not.

All those other potentialities of how Jesus could have come are related to *titles*, not a *person*. When we relate to people through their titles, we tend to look past them as persons. We must get close to people to really

see them for who they are; achievements and titles can hinder that. Michael Jordan's mother was acutely aware of how good her son was at basketball, but to her, he was just Michael. A man may have been a great president of the United States, but to his wife, he was just Ronnie. I bet that works the same in your home too.

For world order, it is a must that the benevolent King Jesus rule over us. When we are at the fringes of our finiteness, we need the supernatural LORD Jesus, Creator of the Heavens and Earth, to work miraculously in our lives. For any enduring eternal joy, we need a Messiah, Jesus the Nazarene, to rescue us from the power of sin and death. But, the LORD of glory, the Most High God, the King of the nations invites us to know Him, embrace Him, and walk with Him as a friend. Jesus. This is God's Advent Christmas gift to us...the promised presence of Jesus in our everyday lives. Jesus is not just the reason for the season. He is the Alpha and Omega, the Author of all time, and the finisher of our faith, so keep opening God's gift and daily walk with Him throughout the New Year. *Soli Deo Gloria*

19. Pastor Stan closed in prayer.





Will continue through Sunday, December 17, 2023




