Immanuel

The Holiday Season will soon be upon us. I guess you have already begun to plan which family members you will be hosting or whose house you will be traveling to for Thanksgiving and Christmas. Who we are with is of course the great joy of the holidays. I would venture to say that most people would sacrifice all their favorite holiday dishes, decorations, and traditions if they knew such a move would guarantee a chance to be near their dearest ones.

For believers in Jesus, holidays are supposed to be a reminder of what eventually will be our eternal reality. Now our holidays celebrate –in small part– what will ultimately be for us an enduring existence, the Kingdom of God. The prophets imagined this final step in the timeline of God's metanarrative as a wedding supper, a joyous celebration of our conclusive consummation with our beloved Savior, Jesus Christ. The New Heavens and the New Earth where tears and sorrows are all wiped away. It will be for us an unending string of holidays where we will revel in unbroken joy alongside our choicest friends, neighbors, companions, and family. The chief celebrant at this forever party of course shall be Jesus of Nazareth.

Until that happens, we call Him, "'Immanuel,' God with us." There is a broad bandwidth of thought that goes with the idea of God being with us, but I want to focus on just one aspect of it that seems to get lost in the holidays. The term "Immanuel" coming to us from Matthew's gospel often gets relegated to the Christmas story only. Matthew quotes Isaiah saying, "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Immanuel." After that, however, our Messiah gets the name "Jesus," the one given to Joseph of Nazareth in a dream through the angel's message. Little attention is given in the following narrative to what that name Immanuel means, so we tuck Immanuel into our Christmas songs and cards and give little thought to it for the rest of the year, and that to our detriment.

Each of the gospel writers ends his gospel with a riff on the idea that having visited us in the first Advent Jesus has remained with us and will do so until He comes again in the clouds full of glory. Matthew states this outright when he quotes Jesus after he gave us the Great Commission, "Lo, I will be with you until the end of the age." Mark tells the women who came to anoint Jesus's body in the tomb, "He has risen and gone ahead of you into Galilee." Luke makes the point through the two disciples who were walking toward Emmaus discussing the loss of Jesus on the cross. Jesus joins them and even though they do not recognize it He is there! John tells us how Jesus knew all of Thomas' weeklong objections to the resurrection after His first meeting with the other ten in the upper room. In other words, Jesus heard everything Thomas said because He was right there the whole time.

What all four gospel writers are trying to say is, "God is with us always in the person of Jesus." If all four of them are saying that collectively, then it is a very important point for our faith. We walk by faith, not by sight, so we need to know that even though He is unseen Jesus is with us. He is our daily Immanuel; He's not just a Holiday Season or Christmas Immanuel.

As a pastor, I want to emphasize this point strongly because during the grind of our daily routines, we often can succumb to the lie that somehow God is distant or not paying attention to what is going on in our lives. And He especially wants you to know He is there during the sad times –like the Holiday Seasons when you do not get to be with your friends and family.

I hope this helps cultivate in you a richer prayer and worship life. Jesus of course will come again. But while we are waiting for that He is our Immanuel. ~Soli Deo Gloria~

6. Property Committee Update

-Church office development. Pastor Stan's new office will be in the church balcony room that was previously utilized by Little Lambs Preschool as their storage and supply room. The preschool is now utilizing the storage room located in the church basement between their two classrooms. Two shelving units were purchased by the church for them to store their supplies more efficiently. Little lambs Preschool was very appreciative of the space offered to them as well as the storage shelves.

- Heating Oil prepaid for 2024. A suggestion was put forth recommending getting church board approval whenever a large prepay price is needed in the future.

-HVAC system repair estimated to be \$1500.00

-Additional estimates to add AC to upstairs of church balcony area \$6500.00.

-A third quote was received for paving the driveway next to activity center of \$7500.00 and additional paving of driveway to back door of center of \$7500.00. A cement pad also needs to be poured for dumpster. 7. New ESV Bibles will be placed in the pews by IU students on September 19. Old pew bibles that are in good condition will be offered to the Rescue Mission. Church members who would like a bible will also have the opportunity to get one of the old bibles.

8. Music Director and IT Director Positions. No applications were received.

9. Mike reports that the cost of a Triage bag is \$750.00 and made a motion to purchase the bag. Discussion followed and a decision was made to get some more information about the contents and to determine if this bag meets the needs of the church.

New Business

1. Doctrine Committee-newly formed with the stated purpose to look at Jacobs Church Constitution. Members are Pastor Stan Newton, Kevin Dellicker, Mike Bailey, Will Dellicker, and Mike Follweiler.

2. Christian Ed Committee- newly formed with the stated purpose of reviewing all the current educational programs that are offered at Jacobs church and creating new programs for instruction in teaching, discipleship, and mentoring. First training seminar is Friday evening Sept. 15 and Saturday Sept 16 and will be utilizing the book by Dr. Howard Hendricks: Teaching to Change Lives. Pastor Stan will be teaching the seminar. Members are Pastor Stan Newton, Will Dellicker, Kayla Fusselman, Diane Wertman and Jane Wessner.

3.Confirmation Class- starting September 17 and led by Pastor Stan. Children's church still anticipating growth and will be dividing into preschool and school age classes if there are enough children for each class. Jane

continues to review new curriculum. Preparation for the nursery started and will be overseen by Diane Wertman.







OCTOBER 2023 BARNABAS BENEFIT UPDATE

Our leaders continue to face increasing hardships. Two young twenty-something leaders are experiencing cancer; one breast cancer and one throat cancer. One leader was beaten and is hospitalized and others had their homes and churches destroyed. One marauding band of Indian radicals even went on a rampage into Nepal. The flooding and natural disasters have been unusually severe and brought about near fatal poisonous snake and spider bites. One area that it isn't safe for me has had severe oppression and mobile phone and internet service severed. I have only spiritic contact when they go to another state to buy food. The Myanmar military continues to bomb and burn the "rebel" Chin tribe Christians.


In spite of all that, thanks to your prayers and giving, there are more great things to report than I can begin to fit on this sheet. Many are being inspired to being involved through your word-of-mouth endorsements and some opportunities to share with individuals, families and groups. One amazing young lady whose family previously sponsored a borewell in India decided to have her family and friends contribute what would have been her ninth birthday funds to Barnabas Benefit. Those funds provided pencils and books for the poorest children in the slums of Tuni, India and some lifesaving treatment for some children bitten by a poisonous snake(s) in the northern tea gardens. Multiple desperately needed tribal village borewells have been sponsored to honor friends and recently departed loved ones. Other give from unexpected "windfalls" and/or tax refunds. One friend who is a professional speaker donated the proceeds of an engagement to Barnabas Benefit and another worthy cause. Several people now give on a consistent basis in addition to their other giving. Please know that many you'll never meet here on earth have been blessed and are praying for you.

In spite of our leaders previously mentioned hardships, they are more determined and have continued to touch more lives than ever before. Their ingenuity and accomplishments with God's help are utterly amazing. One ask that we purchase borewell drilling equipment so their people could do the wells. (in an area with good soil and few rocks). We did and they went to 16 villages drilling as they went. Others still need professionals. We are encouraging teaching on Biblical finances and are successfully having villagers raise money and contribute toward their own projects. (so far about 8%-20%) Eight villages are presently collecting funds toward borewells. (selling eggs & fish, chopping and selling wood; even doweries)

There continues to be a stronger demand for microloans than we can supply. We've had much success and some of the microloan projects have "matured" into thriving enterprises especially in Nepal. Pictures are attached of two ladies who grew two goats and a few chickens into big successes. A friend recently visited another group in Sikkim that over the years has grown into a three-vehicle taxi company. We have successfully connected several to banks, too. A former home economics instructor funded several sewing machine ventures; some for single mothers to feed their children and one for a poor medical missionary Doctor's wife to sew and repair clothing for their charitable work with the indigent tribal people on the Bhutan border.

Many are being baptized. One formerly Muslim friend in the holiest Ganges River Hindu city of Varanasi that I met in 2016 has multiple house churches and baptizes weekly. (I can't successfully have Bibles shipped there) I could continue, but hope this gives you some idea of how your prayers and giving are increasingly touching lives amidst growing persecution and new anti-conversion laws and sentiment. All "good deeds" are now suspect. Thank you so much for your prayers, encouragement and support for Barnabas Benefit and Natalie's lung cancer recovery journey (cancer free!).

Welcoming International Students and October 2023 gathering ideas from neighbors -

Kirk Hall

During the start of the Omicron wave, it was obvious that there was going to be an extended season where making new connections, planning for outreaches, or hosting events would be impossible. I (Dave) took this opportunity to start activating Woodland's fellowship hall, called Kirk Hall. I was not prepared for how much work it would entail or how amazing the results would be.

Before I could organize volunteers or hire professionals, there were a number of steps I had to do on my own. In the 2k sq ft hall from 1891, I had to determine what was worth keeping. The carpet and drop ceiling certainly did not make the cut. After that, came a design phase, volunteers disposing of what was no longer useful, and bringing in contractors to transform the hall as well as the ancient kitchen. Anyone who has known the space in the past gives what I call "Fixer Upper Face" as they first see the new Kirk Hall.

Having a second, larger space in the ministry center at Woodland permits events that we could not in the smaller Annex or the Lawn when weather permits. The Cru campus ministries across the city held a joint weekly meeting where they could be encouraged by what they are seeing God do at each of their schools. Meanwhile, the ministry to international students has expanded their weekly dinner and Bible discussion from a house to Kirk Hall. Before, they would have to cap how many students who could attend, but that is no longer a concern!

To connect with neighbors, we hosted an open house, asking what'd like to see in the space. Local leaders, including a former mayor and a VP at Penn have already come through. The local historical society asked to use the space to kickoff a walking tour of homes in Spruce Hill.

Most importantly, the space is now able to be utilized for regular worship. Whether it is international students coming for discussions about the Bible or long time neighbors using our space for community events, it's exciting that many are coming through our doors, establishing relationships with followers of Jesus, and are being invited back for worship.

After a year of trying to get her the operation she needs through the free hospitals in Panama, and then trying the 'pay' hospitals, we are heading to Cali, Columbia to repair her esophagus. There have been roadblocks and blessings along the way.

The hospital in Columbia is the 4th ranked hospital in Latin America and I know other people who go there for surgery with excellent results. This is really good news for Eysbel, as she told me before leaving for vacation that 'until she met me, she thought she would have the feeding tube in her the rest of her life'. I won't let that happen to this girl that calls me 'dad'. The hospital costs there are about ¼ of what they are in the states.

I have ZERO doubt that God will raise up the support we need to have the operation. I won't have a price till after the exams in December, which are already paid for. Right now, I have all my eggs in one basket, so to speak.

Other than that, the 6 churches are keeping me busy, along with the 20 orphans and a few projects. December looks like it will have 14 church services! All good. All for Jesus.

Hope to see most of you this trip, either in church or in your home sharing what God is doing in Panama.
