## ✠ “FROM THE PASTOR’S STUDY” ✠

So, Jesus Shows Up at Your House One Day...

In May's edition of Jacob's Ladder, I titled my article "It Was the Preaching." If you recall, I talked about a traumatic emergency on a commercial flight that led to a two-minute sharing of the gospel by one of the passengers. Believing they all were surely plummeting towards collective fatality, a born-again believer asked for the mic and quickly talked about how Jesus' death for us on the cross opened the possibilities of eternal life for all those who believe. And if you recall, I mentioned how that singular in-flight event resulted in seminars all over the country changing how they taught people to evangelize the lost.

It is an interesting exercise for sure to think about what is necessary for a person to respond to so that a relationship between the Almighty Creator and one of His fallen image bearers might be restored. Personally, do you know what it takes? Have you exercised the kind of faith God expects? The Bible says, "even the demons believe and shudder?" (James 2:19b) What if the kind of faith you have is akin to demonic faith, and not truly an understanding of what God demands? We should shudder thinking about it! The Bible says we can know for sure (cf. 1 John 5:13), and you can and should settle that matter once and for all.

The reason I bring all this up is because it is highly doubtful any of us will ever be handed a mic during an in-flight emergency. However, you will find yourself beside a loved one who is slowly wasting away from cancer, or a dear relative in a nursing home who has just a few years or even months to live. As you watch them slip towards the coming divine ruling on the worthiness of their life, out of your love for them shouldn't you have that crucial conversation with them about the eternality of their soul and the surety of God's judgement? If they didn't know God, would you be able to share with them the essential truths of Jesus?

This is why Mark records for us in the gospel that Jesus taught the gathered crowds, "as was His custom, (Mark 10:1)." It wasn't His custom to feed them. It wasn't His custom to heal them. It wasn't His custom to cast out demons from among them, argue with the Pharisees, or pray with them. For sure He did all those things and more! But it was His custom to teach them. By Jesus' example you should conclude that Bible teaching, preaching, and instruction is critically necessary for spiritual growth, Christian maturity, and the kind of

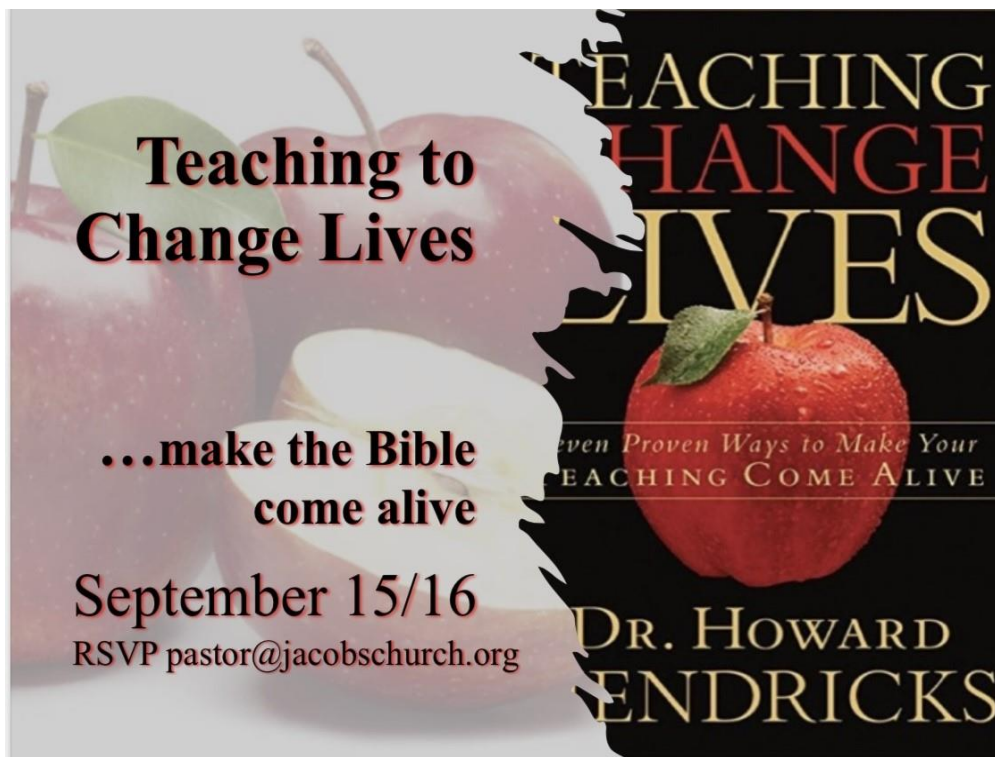
confident faith that leads to a peace that passes all understanding. Or, more simply put...if you want to know God you have to know His Word.

It is not sacrilegious to say that the miracles and supernatural interventions were more window dressing than God's main point in Jesus' ministry. God calls for you to know His word and obey it, in fact obey all of it (Matt. 28:20).

Thusly, if Jesus showed up at your house one day what do you think He would do? We are given a picture in the gospels of what His custom was. He would have you gather all your friends and neighbors in your living room or around your kitchen table, and He would teach you. He would talk about God's great power in creation. He would grimly talk about mankind's rebellion in the garden, and the darkness that entered the world as Satan attacked and tempted God's children through their desires. He would talk about the necessity of a Redeemer. He more than likely would say that the Torah Law was never given as a means of salvation, but the Pharisees hijacked the message of faith and bent it toward a religion of works. Then He would look you in the eye and say, "I am the way, the truth, and the light. I am the Son of Man come to save you. Will you forsake all and follow Me?" Have you?

1. Pastor Stan opened in prayer and devotion.
2. Treasurer Update – Andrea reports she is currently trying a free software trial from Church Trac for budgeting and offering. She is also obtaining quotes from new payroll companies and will be completing paperwork to find if the parcels qualify for property tax exemptions. Kevin made a motion to allow Andrea to evaluate and purchase accounting/payroll software; seconded by Kayla; motion carried.
3. Property Report – Jared reports roofing repairs will be starting in the month of July. Currently looking for estimates to repave the activity center driveway, as well as considering quotes from Artisan Restorations to replace stonework on the church.
4. Youth Group – Will reports he is continuing to reach out to the children of the community through witnessing and campfire bible studies. He is also preparing for VBS week with Pastor Stan.
5. Young Adults Bible Study – Pastor Stan plans on continuing young adults bible study every second and fourth Tuesday of the month. More details to follow.
6. Live Streaming – Weekly sermons continue to be posted. Kayla reports the picture freezes sporadically, but the sound continues to record and can be posted.
7. Cemetery Committee – Ed reports Mike Sacks has taken interest in joining the committee; no additional updates to report.
8. Vacation Bible School – Kayla reports there are 67 children registered; funds raised through the Mission Moment will be donated to Lowhill Food Pantry. VBS Sunday will be held on July 16<sup>th</sup>, and a volunteer thank you lunch will be held after church on July 23<sup>rd</sup>.
9. Pastor Meet and Greet/Community Day - Kevin reports there will be a meeting on July 13<sup>th</sup> at 7:00pm to review events and services. Meet and Greet will be held July 26<sup>th</sup> at 12:00pm in the activity center; currently 14 attendees have RSVPed.

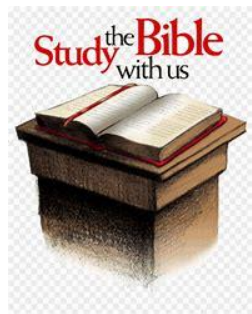


## **Stephen Ministry – Christ caring for people through people**

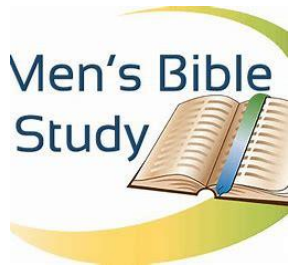

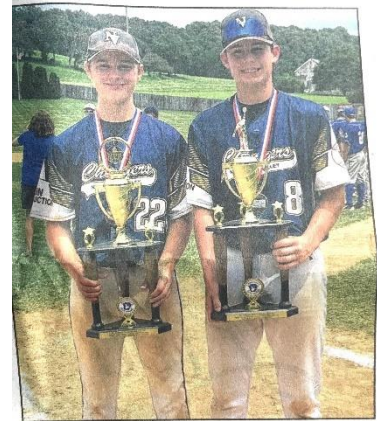

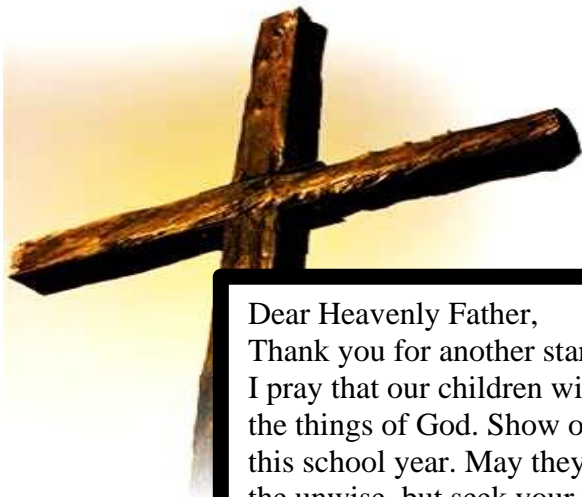
