† From the Pastor's Study **†**

Worship

You may have heard before someone trace the etymology of the term 'worship.' It comes from the Middle English *worshippe*, or Old English *worðscip*, *wurðscip* (Anglian), *weorðscipe* (West Saxon) "condition of being worthy, dignity, glory, distinction, honor, renown," from *weorð* "worthy" + "-ship" *-scipe*. All those differences —I am assuming— are because the first English dictionaries appeared around 1500 AD, and standardization of pronunciation and spelling came way later. In any case, most people understand the word to have meant something like what I have copied from the Online Etymology Dictionary above describing the nature or worthiness of something to be held in high regard.

Worship in our language is generally reserved for our attitudes toward deity. In the case of we Christians, it describes our affections for the Trinitarian God who has been made known to us through the incarnation of our LORD, Jesus Christ, as it has been revealed to us in the Scriptures. Occasionally, we hear something like, "hero worship" or "he worships the ground she walks on." We know in those situations people are expressing an extreme affection for or strong desire towards someone else, not treating them as a deity; but that usage is why there is confusion when we apply the term "worship" to our approach to God. The Bible calls us to do far more than what our English word conveys.

So what do I mean by that? The Bible calls us to respond to God with our whole being: body, soul, and spirit, something far more than simply ascribing a personal attitude of worth, even our most extreme idea of worth, towards God. The biblical terms, πρω and προσκυνέω, from both the OT and NT, mean to bow down before in humble reverence. The humbling process is central to the whole idea as well as the concept of taking direction. Obedience is wrapped up in the mix also.

So how does knowing all this technical stuff work out practically in our lives? Well, imagine yourself coming before a king, a human king. In the ancient world, when you did so, you had to bow down in recognition of his authority and power. You were not allowed to rise until the king acknowledged your presence, and in some cases just to make a point the king would wait a bit before he said something to let those know before him who was in charge.

The language the ancients used to describe their coming before a human king was the same language the Scripture writers used to invoke images in our heads of how we should come before our LORD, Jesus Christ. *We should come before God in humility seeking direction*. This is why the preaching of God's Word has been so central to Christian worship for the last two thousand years. God's people come before God to hear the words of God which are for the people of God so that they might obey them!

If we just think of worship as ascribing extreme worth to God, we miss all notions that when we walk away we are supposed to have been transformed by the power of God's Spirit to carry out the advancement of His Kingdom in our homes, neighborhoods, and work places. We will reduce worship to the simple ascribing of dignity and worth to God through our favorite praise songs, music styles, or hymns, and when we walk out of our services we will find ourselves bowing to something else: our culture, our fears, our traditions, etc., everything else but to God in the day to day business of our lives. Something to think about...

BARNABAS BENEFIT CONNECTING CARING HEARTS WITH NEEDS May 2024 update

India and surrounding countries experience devastating weather events every year similar to what we are witnessing here in the US, This year seems especially severe and devastating. Most of the homes are built with bamboo and rice straw and many have no actual floors or sewage provisions. One orphanage in Manipur where we had just furnished a tin roof had much of it ripped off during a recent storm. One of our young 15-year-old helpers named Abel fell helping during a storm and had severe back injuries that required professional treatment. Another leader was crushed by a falling tree and leaves a widow and five children. Hardships are everywhere.

The leaders who have been beaten during this turbulent election season in India are now all recovering. "MD" was sponsored and had successful eye surgery in a city ten hours away to save his sight and is recovering with his twice daily bandages just removed. The police never returned his phone so I can't get updates like before and I don't think his glasses, bicycle, and personal belongings were ever replaced.

In spite of all that, things are progressing wonderfully and there is a lot of good news.

We have had wonderful individual and organizational support. A family sponsored our transition to QuickBooks online along with other assistance and are providing help in transitioning to expand our capabilities and effectiveness. It's quite a learning curve for us folks in the latter half of our seventies! Please forgive me if I haven't mastered timely receipts and updates yet. I haven't forgotten! I just haven't figured everything in a timely manner and am behind.

Borewells and clean drinking water continue to be our major thrust and you have blessed many villages with clean pure water. It is especially important as these daily deluges create constant dampness and water and sanitation born illnesses. We now are welcome wherever we have done wells and each recent village project have also raised money toward their own well. One unexpected benefit of the flooding; as the water recedes, many fish are trapped in shallow depressions. The villagers are catching and selling them to help pay for their wells! We have a request from 72 mountain villagers in Nepal for a long PVC pipe to pipe spring water down the mountain. A dedicated team of young men are going village to village digging countless wells for villages in Assam. We will try a filtration system in Manipur where refugee orphans have to trek a distance to bring back brackish canal water to drink where a well isn't feasible.

Many individuals are waiting for microloans; especially single mothers. All repaid previous loans are recycled into new loans that help others. We have many sewing school graduates wanting sewing machines. Young leaders are now supporting themselves taking vegetables on their bicycles to remote villages where there is high demand and no competition. We previously helped establish professional bee keeping in Nepal and now have two other requests for other's hives. We matched funds so one of our

leaders could get a contract to provide up to 500 lunches for workers each day and become self-supporting for herself and her refugee orphans. Things are going well so far. Some of our loans for goats and chickens in Nepal several years ago have grown into significant flocks. These loans and grants provide hope and renewed purpose for so many.

We had a long-time friend and sponsor step up to replace two worn out Jesus Film mini projectors (and other projects). The tariffs and customs cost more than the projectors but it is well worth it. Bibles are in high demand but the book of John in tribal languages serve our purposes much more economically. It is not uncommon to have only one Bible in a village. I will be experimenting with Telugu study Bibles for a few select leaders to assist in their teaching. We are also anxious to teach basic Biblical financial principles. Even with limited materials, people hang on every word of any teaching.

I am increasingly amazed at the variety of caring people like you that are helping more and more. An international fifth grade class sponsored bake sales for borewells as practical action steps when they studied worldwide water problems. (I spoke to their class on the internet.) A fifteen-year-old young lady raised support from teachers and friends for another well. Another friend got his major corporate employer to get us officially approved for matching funds for his donations. I recently travelled out of our area and bought some equipment from a stranger who, after learning about the work we do, returned my cash to put to use in Barnabas Benefit. God never ceases to amaze me how He touches people's hearts to meet seemingly endless needs!

I personally would appreciate your prayers. This past year has been challenging with my life's partner Natalie's cancer treatments and wonderful but growing Barnabas Benefit relationships and commitments. We are working to get better systems and documentation in place to identify and do a better job with the "zillions" of details behind the priceless relationships and projects so that others can help and effectively carry on and expand this "Mom & Pop" vision in the future. I wish I could package the past sixteen years to pass on but hope to start by compiling my 10 sets of composite daily musings and notes for those interested.

Thanks for being there and praying and bringing hope to so many that you've never met. You are a priceless blessing to them and to us.




