True Worship

When Jesus was talking to the Samaritan woman at the well, He said a time was coming when true worshippers would worship the Father in spirit and truth. That whole encounter has always intrigued me, especially that statement about worship. On the surface, it seems simple, but if you peek under the hood a bit there is quite a bit to ponder there.

Before diving into that statement, I want to investigate the conversation itself. Most folks know that the Jews and Samaritans did not get along. The Jews saw the Samaritans as half-breeds and the Samaritans hated the Jews for their uppity attitudes towards everyone else. Jesus undoubtedly knew of those prejudices and simply chose to ignore them. The women, however, did not and thought it necessary to bring those prejudices up.

Jesus ignored those prejudices, but not her. No, He took her and her questions seriously. Just like He does you. It is nice to know our Savior takes both us and our questions seriously. He is never dismissive. He may be blunt and corrective, but never dismissive. Remember that when go to Him in prayer with something troublesome to you.

Back to that statement, because that simple statement has generated a legion of questions for Bible readers for centuries.

First of all, Jesus said a time was coming when true worshippers would worship in spirit and truth. Has that time come? Is that what we are doing now, or is it still future? I think it has. I think the Holy Spirit in us has added a new dynamic unknown to those before Jesus' arrival.

Next, when Jesus said a time was coming when true worshippers would worship in spirit and truth, does that mean everything before that was false? I do not think so. Those who had obeyed God's commands before Jesus' first advent were not offering false worship as they brought their sacrifices. The issue of false worship in the OT is related to the practice of idolatry, when people mixed in strange gods with what God had prescribed.

So, what was Jesus getting at? Quite a bit more than I can write in this article, but the main point I want to draw on here is that He also said, "Neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem will you worship the Father, but a time is coming when true worshippers will worship the Father in spirit and truth," because that helps us understand what a true worshipper is.

Jesus was saying that the externals were not as important as the internals, especially because it was partly the externals that were keeping the Jews and the Samaritans apart. Jesus said that part needed serious recalibration because He wants us to be as one as He and the Father are one. We need to focus on where are hearts are when we come.

We cannot just worship with everyone, because we worship the Father. Not everyone does. Not everyone joining us is filled with the Spirit. We should invite them to be. God is willing to pour out the Spirit on all those who trust in Jesus. Not everyone knows the truth well either, but we can purpose to know the Scriptures better as we gather.

The issue then before us is to check our hearts. In May, I am starting a new sermon series titled Worship Involves. I hope it involves you as we all pursue what it means to be a true worshipper seeking together our great God and Father through Christ. Soli Deo Gloria.

1. Opening Prayer and Devotions by Pastor Stan. He presented the requirements for the Catechetical class which include the verbal understanding of the creation narrative from Genesis, the ability to answer the 52 questions from The New City Catechism for Kids by Crossway Publishing and each individual's confession of faith to be shared with the church elders.

2. Visitors:

Visitor Jared Hermany- presented report on the evaluation of current church audio system by Entertainment Services. Various members of the church board as well as praise team met with them while they tested and gave their evaluation of the audio system of which many components are at least 40 years old and not functioning to support the music ministry. The evaluation included a demonstration of new floor speaker which in everyone's estimation vastly improved the sound quality. After the report presentation by Jared which included a quote of \$31,247.43 to replace the audio system, the church board requested that Entertainment Services meet with us at our church board meeting to answer questions before taking it to the Church Membership for a vote. A quote was also given for the possible installation of a rear confidence projector which would assist the praise team as well as Pastor Stan by displaying words and music onto the back of the sanctuary. The projected cost is \$8967.20 which requires further discussion with Entertainment Services at a church board meeting. Jared will contact Entertainment services to set up a date they can meet with the church board.

Visitor Andrea Hermany- presented a job description for a keyboard accompanist for Praise and Worship. The description was developed by Andrea as well as Ron Naddeo and Mike Madtes. A motion was made to approve the keyboard job description by Kaitlin and seconded by Kayla; motion carried. The job will be posted on Facebook as well as Jacob's church website and church bulletin. A \$500 allotment was approved for advertising.





Jacob's Church of New Tripoli, PA, hosted a Messianic Seder on Thursday, March 28, in their activity center.

A Messianic Seder meal is inspired by and patterned after the traditional Jewish Seder meal celebrated for Passover. It is enjoyed by both Jews and Christians who recognize that Yeshua (Jesus) of Nazareth was the promised Messiah predicted in the Hebrew Bible (known by Christians as the Old Testament).

"We were pleased to host this Messianic Seder in our community," said Reverend Stanley Newton, the Pastor of Jacob's Church. "This year

marked the first time Jacob's hosted a Seder for our Lenten season festivities. We memorialized the Jewish heritage of our Christian faith and celebrated the gift of salvation that God has offered to people everywhere through the redemptive work of Yeshua on the cross. His resurrection is what gives hope for peace and unity among all peoples worldwide."

"Our Messianic Seder attracted nearly ninety participants from the community many of whom had never participated in a Seder before." Pastor Newton remarked, "We are excited so many came. Because of this encouragement from the community, we may plan another Seder in the future."

Passover is an eight-day Jewish holiday, referred to as the "festival of freedom." Passover celebrates the miraculous deliverance of the Hebrew people from Egyptian slavery. Along with the traditional meal at the Seder, the story of Passover is shared through a recital of the Haggadah, "the Telling." The meal includes rituals, readings, songs, and a full dinner. It was at a Passover meal that Jesus took bread and broke it saying, "This is my body," after which he distributed it to his disciples. Jesus also took a cup of wine and lifting it up he said, "This is the cup of a new covenant in my blood. As often as you drink it drink it in remembrance of me.

Table Together Philly

While at a conference last April where pastors shared their best practices for reaching and blessing their community, I (Dave) latched on to an idea from Spokane. This church opened up their commercial kitchen for refugees and immigrants to prepare large batches of their cuisine to sell to the community. Not only is caring for the foreigner in our midst a biblical demand, but I also saw how it could be a tool to make connections in our community.

Many neighbors around the ministry center we are activating at Woodland are connected to Penn, though not necessarily to each other. There are American undergrads, international scholars, young families, and older university staff. Being at different stages of life leads to misunderstandings, isolation, and sometimes divisions. As Woodland is the only place with a large hall and kitchen open to the community, it allows us to be the gathering point for the neighborhood.

Returning back from the conference last April, I was excited to get this project off the ground but hesitant knowing how much work it would entail. Then UPenn's Office of Social, Equity and Community asked me if I had a

project idea that their undergrad fellows could work on this school year! I shared my vision and they ran with it! The 4 students pictured above created the organization, found an Algerian immigrant to be the first chef, spread the word through the university community, and did all the day of work to make it a success. I brought in people from our church and the neighborhood. Together, 87 tickets were sold!

To prompt discussions around each table, questions we placed encouraging people to share about their religious background. At my table, it was great to see people from our church engage with a staff person from Penn as they learned about her story.

At the end of the evening, several folks asked me when the next dinner would be. Also, as a young family left, the mom encouraged/ warned me that this event will quickly sell out whenever it happens again. I think she is right.




