The Way Home

The Bible is full of stories. Some are long, some short. Some short stories seem to standalone, but they always exist within the context of the longer one's to round them out. For example...how kingship came to Israel is the subject of 1 & 2 Samuel. David's famous encounter with Goliath is a shorter story that fits in that longer Samuel narrative. Even the longer stories like the rise of kingship, or the collapse of it (1 & 2 Kings, 1 & 2 Chronicles) are part of a much larger story, the grand theme of the Bible.

The grand theme of the Bible can be summarized into four parts: Creation, Fall, Redemption, and reCreation. By far the story of Redemption gets most of the attention in the Bible. The Creation and the Fall are presented as facts. God made us, we turned away from Him. We need to be restored. How God redeems and restores us through the cross of Jesus by far gets most of the attention in the Bible. Most of the Old Testament says, "You need a Savior, but you keep turning away from God every time He delivers you." The New Testament opens with four Gospels all saying the same thing, "This Jesus who died for you is radiantly glorious; how could you ever not trust Him or turn away from Him, the One who offers us so great a salvation?" Following that reCreation gets very little space but knowing God's love for us and what He has created we can trust He will make everything permanently right. Praise the LORD!

The book of Ruth, tucked in your Bible just between Judges and Samuel is one of those small little stories that seems to stand alone. It powerfully fits into the Bible's big grand theme...all things are going to be made right; you just need to patiently wait for it in obedient faith.

Ruth opens with an ominous tone. We are told there was a famine in the land in the time of the Judges. The period of the Judges was like a wild-west town without a sheriff; there was no king in the land and everybody was doing what was right in their own eyes. A man, Abimelech, from Bethlehem (in Hebrew Bethlehem means 'house of bread'), decides to take his sons and his wife Naomi to Moab to survive. Although it seems like a solid, manly thing to do on the surface, it was not. He should have trusted Yahweh to provide for His own in "the house of bread." Also, his two boys end up marrying foreign woman Orpah and Ruth, Moabitesses. This is strictly forbidden. While the family is outside the Promised Land all the men die. This is a huge red flag! From the previous book of Judges we are anticipating that the three unprotected women are going suffer mightily.

However, our God is a redeemer. He hears the cry of the weak and the afflicted. He rescues the needy and the lost. Far from being a stand-alone, feel-good story, Ruth is a story of God's continuing intent and purpose to recover lost humanity. It of course has its drama, it's ups and downs, but in the end, it is all up! We need to remind ourselves constantly of these wonderful stories of recovery and new life. We especially need to do more than just read them in the Bible. We need to live them ourselves which we can do through faith in Jesus Christ.

I will be preaching through Ruth in January. I invite you to tune in so you can learn like Ruth and Naomi did, that all suffering can be overcome by our great God. If we want to find our way home, we simply need to call upon His Holy Name in faith. *SOLI DEO GLORIA*





The "12 Days of Christmas" was originally a poem written by Catholic clerics and then transformed into a carol to celebrate this Christian event. The song is wrapped in a special hidden message about Christianity. During the sixteenth century when this was changed to a song, the Catholic church of England was under severe persecution and needed to code much of Christianity, the bible and its' truths. This song is one example of that.

The meanings of each of the gifts:

The partridge in a pear tree represents Jesus Christ. Two Turtle Doves represent the Old and New Testament. Three French Hens represent the virtues of Faith, Hope and Love. Four Calling Birds represent the four Gospels, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. Five Golden Rings represent the first five books of the Old Testament, also known as the Torah or the Pentateuch. Six Geese-a-laying represent the six days of creation. Seven Swans-a-swimming represent the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit.

Eight Maids-a-milking represent the beatitudes.

Nine Ladies dancing represent the nine Fruits of the Holy Spirit.

Ten Lords-a-leaping represent the Ten Commandments.

Eleven Pipers Piping represent the eleven faithful apostles.

Twelve Drummers Drumming represent the twelve points of doctrine in the Apostle's Creed.



Barnabas Benefit Mission Moment will be held on Sunday, January 12th during worship service. Love offerings will also be available in church bulletins on Sunday, January 5th and Sunday, January 12th.

Barnabas Benefit is a ministry started in 2015 by John and Natalie Teufel of Schnecksville. They connect U.S.-based financial donors with native volunteer workers to help meet the significant physical and spiritual needs of people in neglected, very rural areas of primarily India, but also in neighboring countries Nepal, Bhutan and Myanmar. The primary way these native workers are permitted to introduce the gospel to the non-Christian peoples is to arrange the drilling borewells to provide fresh drinking water to village areas to alleviate the sickness and death caused by drinking contaminated water. In gratitude, village officials then permit the workers to show the Jesus video via portable projectors. Resulting in many converts to Christ. The converts organize into house churches. Barnabas Benefit also makes microloans to help individuals start small businesses by which to support themselves and their families. The ministry also funds emergency food and blankets to those in life-threatening need.

BARNABAS BENEFIT DECEMBER 2024

Dear Friends,

Blessings to you and your family during this most holy season of the birth of our Lord.

This is a hurried update during a brief interlude in our packed December schedule.

Our volunteer open enrollment Medicare duties ended in the 1st week followed by a packed travel schedule. Natalie and I just returned from an awesome trip to the former Soviet land of Latvia last night. More details soon. I spoke to an awesome international church. I fell in love with the people, many of them Indian, and one from an area where we have drilled borewells. Also an interesting Vietnamese family that updated my now almost 60 year past there. Visiting a vacated decrepit Soviet KGB prison and interrogation/ execution house there renewed my appreciation of freedom.

We intend to take a meandering winter road trip once we regroup. It will include "long lost" friends and our three children and seven grandchildren; hopefully all by the end of 2024. Friends have taken care of our mail and all checks for Barnabas Benefit were deposited to our bank and will continue to be as we travel and I disburse funds as well.

The needs have been more than we have ever experienced and ,still even after many years, a bit overwhelming. Your compassionate and generous giving has increased and kept pace as each need came. Someday I may have 100% faith and leave behind all the fear that needs won't be met. You have given many, many hope and warmth.

We even welcomed our first timely matching grant check from some donor's employer.

We negotiated to purchase 3000 Book of John in Telugu to distribute to the curious along with musical instruments for house churches.

The needs are diverse but the monsoons and the winter have been devastating. I believe every leader has requested blankets, especially in the frigid Himalayan mountain areas of Nepal and India that need more costly warmer blankets since there is no heat in frigid Nepal and North India. (see pictures)

My heart was warmed when an Indian brother and sister, 14-year-old "Philip" and his 12-year-old sister "Cathy" requested 60 cheaper blankets to personally take to befriend homeless orphans on the streets and "under the bridge." (pictures)

Neelam is recovering from her kidney transplant, has restarted her lunch catering business, started a teagarden school, and directs village borewell outreaches, etc.

Borewells and clean water continue to be the biggest need in the ignored impoverished rural/mountain areas. We have an outstanding years long working relationship with a driller who will venture far off the beaten path and discount way beyond rates you see solicited on TV. We contracted to do four wells this week. (and many more are needed in this district) Some are funded by families who agreed to forgo Christmas gift exchanges to give an equivalent amount to desperately needed borewells and needs.

In another area in the north with different conditions, we were asked to contribute to money the villagers raised to buy equipment and supplies and send their young men to dig wells (and make friends). I somewhat reluctantly agreed but now find out with some chagrin that they drilled scores of wells. They want to do it again in a different area and have raised almost \$1000 although much more was and will be needed. Although I "don't keep score" based on a mistake I read a leader made in a Bible story, the results I've heard are beyond amazing. I thank God for the ways He has used these young disciples to make their way into the remote new areas where no one cares to venture.

Microloans continue to do well and there are many sewing school graduates looking for sewing machines. We had our first male graduate who left a life that was sure to end early for a sewing and embroidery career with hope and a future. Other are starting businesses serving tea on the street, selling biscuits (cookies), vegetables, etc. All are becoming "tentmakers" like the Apostle Paul and relationship builders.

We are doing various things to help recently orphaned war refugees, the blind, poor widows, and our friends in two leper conclaves and several orphanages. We have recently donated a small water filtration system and solar energy in the border areas of Manipur for the orphans there. We are providing socks and blankets for them and as many other refugees as possible.

Sometimes I forget that it is Christmas with personal hopes there too. The lepers in Erode said "tell John to come, (and added "bring Christmas gifts!").

I try to personally (aside from your donations) provide a little extra for our unpaid leaders for their kids because I am a long-time parent. I received this attached simple "Santa letter today" from a poor medical missionaries child. As Natalie can attest, a Tootsie Roll Pop or a pencil is treasure to many of these children and school supplies are treasured like "gold" in the schools our leaders start.

I had an interesting encounter today. Because of all the donations I made from Latvia, my bank/ transfer account was shut off until I could be questioned early this morning. After submitting a picture of my passport. etc. and a "moving selfie" to prove it was really me, I was subjected to a long list of questions. I truthfully told the lady the money was going to friends in India and Nepal. (only friends and family allowed) She responded that she was married to an Indian Dr. who grew up on the streets of Kolkata in the early two thousands. I told her of my first encounter with 8 special children from the red light/railroad yard slums of Kolkata in 2008 who stole my heart. That led to what we do now. I couldn't have guessed that God would open a thirty plus minute opportunity to tell our story to a Fraud Alert specialist with open ears and heart. She promised to pray and she made my day!

Off for another new adventure looking for charging stations going west and then back to PA.

(Cooking rice in a cleaned-out paint can and sheltering and sleeping in Monsoon downpours and dampness) He is hoping to start over, make friends and learn the local language with a dictionary "in 3-4 months", all while recovering from major surgery. I have seen him amazingly endure this and more in the past and bounce back.

But this morning, thanks to a faithful monthly donor, I sent a 3 AM transfer that will address the above basics to keep him going with things that we take for granted.

Thank you so much for your prayers, faithfulness, and trust that enables us to provide hope to the countless hopeless families, refugees, and recent orphans through a caring dedicated group of volunteer leaders like him "on the ground."

May God continue to bless you and your family abundantly this Thanksgiving season for answering His "still small voice." to provide for needs and bring hope to many.

Please include a prayer of blessing for those who make this possible with your giving when you say your prayer of Thanksgiving over our awesome families and feasts today.




