The Necessary Noël

Noël comes from the Latin verb nasci, "to be born." In our modern English it has become a synonym for Christmas of course for its focus on birth. For Advent this year I am going to be concentrating on what was necessary in the Noël, the birth of Jesus.

The apostle Paul understood the birth of Jesus as coming "in the fulness of time." God is never late, nor early. He is always on time, so Jesus' birth landed Him in human history at the exact right moment. In retrospect, I am sure Joseph and Mary had no idea, nor could they anticipate, the turmoil that would follow the announcement of Jesus' coming. For others Christ's coming was far more upsetting that the reordering of their betrothal and wedding plans. King Herod found the news of baby Jesus so threatening he ordered the lives of all the young boys in Bethlehem to be taken.

It is hard not to get cross-eyed over what happened in that little town two centuries ago. How could God let that go down? Surely, He knew what would happen if the news reached Herod that Jesus was born just a few miles south of Jerusalem. Why didn't He just send an angel and tip off those weary travelers from the east so they would skip Jerusalem and head right down to the Bethlehem. It's these kinds of unanswered questions that keep people up at night, and along with the expectation that God would do more than offer an unrequited response, it's what turns people off.

But listen to Paul. He went on to say that not only did Jesus come at the right time, but God also sent Him to be born of a woman and born under the law. Like Jesus, we all have been born of a woman, but not all of us have been born under God's Law. However, we have been born into

families and communities, like Jesus, that had standards of righteousness and dignity that had they been followed life we be much sweeter for everyone, maybe not perfect, but certainly sweeter and more enjoyable.

What seems to get lost on quite a few people is the idea that the arrival of God's Son is not what caused the turmoil down here. It was here already. Indeed, it is the very lack of God's presence in our home and communities that wreaks havoc upon us. What we need is the arrival of Jesus like he came back then even still more today.

The essence of pastoral ministry is to remind people of this need. Pointing out people's trials, failures, disappointments, misgivings, breakdowns, trauma, and a whole host of other negative things is not for the purpose of shaming anyone. It is for the purpose of awakening individuals and our community to the idea that maybe Jesus is not as present as He could be in all our lives, and who better to invite Him into those spaces than the good folks of Jacob's.

So how do we do that? First, we ask for a second Noël, a personal one. We all need that new birth and once we have it, we ask for it again and again and again. I am not saying we ask to be born again over and over; that happens once, and once it happens, we are transferred from the kingdom of darkness into the Kingdom of God's dear Son. No, what I am saying is we ask God to renew us in the middle of all our trauma, troubles, and trials. We ask for new life for our family, friends, and neighbors, we ask for God's merciful rule to extend to the ends of earth spreading peace and goodwill to all peoples everywhere. Why? Because the Noël is necessary if we are ever to be truly joyful. SOLI DEO GLORIA

- 1. Pastor Stan opened with devotion from Proverbs 13:16 on wisdom and prayer.
- 2. Visitors from Mission Crafters with a presentation of their ministry and vision for future projects working with the various ministries in the church. A motion was made by Mike Follweiler to fund their expenses for the remainder of 2024. 2nd by Kayla. Motion carried.

A closer look at how Missions Crafters can be assisting with other ministries in the church was discussed. A determination of 2025 funding amount will be made at the October Budget meeting.

3. The September Treasurer Report was reviewed and a motion to accept the report was given by Kayla and seconded by Mike Bailey. Motion Carried.

- 4. Minutes for the September Board Meeting were reviewed for accuracy. A motion to accept the minutes was made by Kayla and seconded by Kaitey. Motion carried.

OLD Business

5. <u>Missions Outreach Committee</u> members Diane Wertman, Mike Bailey and Jen Mease proposed several missions to be relocated from the oversight of mission outreach committee to the general church budget; also, recommendations made for several missions to no longer be supported. A new budget amount of \$22,500 is being requested to fund the remaining missions for 2025. A motion was made to accept proposed changes and a tentative budget of \$22,500 (pending October Budget Meeting) for 2025 by Kaitey and seconded by Kayla. Motion Carried.

In addition, the monies previously designated in the 2024 budget for the missions that will no longer be supported by the church will be brought to a vote at the annual congregational meeting for the purpose of not paying out the 2024 support (\$2500.00) but instead be divided among the remaining missions under Mission Outreach; A motion was made by Kayla and seconded by Mike Follweiler. Motion carried.

The missions that will be relocated to the oversight of the General Church Budget will be labeled Diaconal Outreach.

6. New Members Class- The class has completed. Members of this class now will meet with the elders to share their profession of faith. These people are Beverly and Mitch Hosler, Brian Mease and Donna and Paul Richardson.

Confirmation Class- Currently we have 8 young people in the Catechetical Class that meet Sunday Mornings at 9 am.

Finance Committee:

7. Budget Meeting will be held October 27th after the Sunday Church Service.

Envelope Mailing List- Based on the letter that went out to all members, we now have only 170 offering envelopes to be mailed each month. The reduction in mailings is seeing a cost savings of approximately \$100/month. Any questions or inquires can be directed to the church secretary Faye Foulk.

8. Property Committee

Machemer Construction Company was consulted to repair church tower leaks.

No update on Fox Property discussions. Wuchter House still in process of being repaired and painted.

- 9. Christian Education Committee- Children's church attendance is low. Teachers are still available for both age groups but sometimes because of poor attendance classes are combined.
- 10. Children's Ministry- Kayla is planning for the next event on October 20th. New children are attending and so far, there are 9 children signed up. There are also plans to hand out activity books at the Oyster Supper and plans for a crafting activity for all the children that attend the Thanksgiving Meal in November.
- 11. Youth Minister Update- Will Dellicker is returning to the states in October. He will be speaking at the Annual Lehigh Valley Prayer Breakfast November 14. A signup sheet is available for people who want to attend, and support Will. He will also give the church sermon on November 17th.
- 12. Music Committee/Worship Team- Music selections have been planned through and to the remainder of the year. A position was posted for a keyboard player for the worship team. Jared Hermany planning to organize a demonstration of new speakers for sound system.
- 13. Special Events- are planned to the end of the year: Ladies Night Out, Adult Retreat, Oyster Supper, and Thanksgiving Family Meal.
- 14. Cemetery Association Tom Foulk reports that there have been more cremations than graves dug for burial which keep the overall expenses lower than previously.

15. Annual Congregational Meeting Plans- A date was set for December 1 with a date of December 8 in case of inclement weather was established. Notification of meeting will be sent out in the mail to members as well as posted in November newsletter and church bulletins. Mike Madtes and Ed Sawyer will complete their terms of service this year. Elders have considered Ron Belknap and Solomon Johri to join church board for next year pending congregational vote.







The carol's origins date back to the 15th century with the German devotional poem "Es ist ein Ros entsprungen". The text is based on Isaiah 11:1 A shoot will come up from the stump of Jesse; from his roots a Branch will bear fruit.

The melody was set to music in 1599 and is thought to have come from plainchant (a type of Christian liturgical music in which the text is sung to a single line of melody without accompaniment from instruments or other voices). In 1609, Michael Praetorius, a German composer, harmonized the melody.

This Flower, whose fragrance tender With sweetness fills the air, Dispels with glorious splendor The darkness everywhere. True man, yet very God, From sin and death He saves us And lightens every load.






























2024 Christmas Card Exchange

Please take note to the following:





Philly Jubilee

One recent evening, I (Dave) took a prayer walk. Things at the Woodland ministry center have reached a nice plateau and I now have a bit of margin to add something new. The prayer time didn't lead to any great insight, but in the middle of the night a fully formed concept came to me. I committed it to memory, then went back to sleep. Some background first.

On the side of the Liberty Bell is inscribed "Proclaim LIBERTY throughout all the Land unto all the inhabitants thereof." It comes from Leviticus 25 which describes the Year of Jubilee. Every 50 years, Israel is commanded to cease work, cancel debts, and remember the freedom God provides to his people.

In Philadelphia, we also have a huge party every 50 years to celebrate our founding. As city and national leaders plan for our 250th birthday in 2026, what role should the Church play?

As we see in the Year of Jubilee and the Liberty Bell's inscription, uplifting the oppressed is also a point of agreement between our faith and our culture. The ministry concept that came to me I am tentatively calling **Philly Jubilee**. Which will ask churches to commit to 3 actions:

- Teach on the Year of Jubilee in the time leading up to our nation's birthday.
- Invite a pastor from another culture or tradition to speak on oppression and liberty.
 We gain a greater understanding of oppression and liberty as we listen to those with various experiences.
- Choose a faith stretching cause as an individual church that advances liberty. These could include raising funds to cancel medical debt or helping returning citizens find housing and employment.

At an event a couple weeks ago, I pulled aside a trusted pastor to ask him if Philly Jubilee is a good idea and he not only affirmed the concept, but let me know that a few Christian leaders gathered to pray the day before to prepare for the 250th celebration! They would like to include this idea to be part of what they consider for their efforts.


