+ From the Pastor's Study +

I Believe...

Attend church regularly and you will hear, "I Believe…" It begins our creeds. At Jacob's, we regularly recite the Apostles Creed at the outset of our worship service. For a while, we switched to the longer, more word-crafted, Nicene Creed. Even in churches that do not consistently rehearse the creeds together as a part of their worship, you unswervingly hear, "I Believe…" in their prayers, hymns, and sermons.

"I Believe..." is not just a churchy, religious thing either. Politicians say it, as do our schoolteachers. Businessmen say it, and so do coaches whose teams are down by five points with 1:26 left on the clock. "Men! I believe we can march down the field and score with the short time we have left, but you must be sharp, pay attention, and work as a team. Listen up! Here's the plan..."

Everyone uses, "I Believe…" intending more than just to convince the mind. We lead with it because by saying "I Believe…" we want to shape behavior. Politicians want to garner votes, teachers want to expand the intellects of their students, businessmen invite investors to risk joining them in profit ventures, and coaches seek to stir their teams on to win. God wants you to believe, not just so you know facts, but so you can be transformed into the image of His dear Son, Our LORD, Jesus Christ.


Beliefs are important because they DEFINE who we are, they set boundaries. What criterion do you think there should be for someone to join our church? Would baptism along with a new

member's class or confirmation be enough? The elders and I take it as a serious charge before our LORD and the whole congregation to interview closely those individuals who endeavor to join our church. We want to make sure that new, voting and potentially influential voices firmly acknowledge Jesus Christ as God, the only sufficient Savior for mankind. We need to know that they have received and avow that our salvation is an act of God's grace which can only be accessed by faith in Christ's death on a cross. "I Believe…He was crucified under Pontius Pilate."

Beliefs are important because they shape our DESTINIES. Tell a child she is a bad little girl or a boy he is stupid and won't amount to anything, and you will wound their hearts and direct them into a ditch. Teach a child they are imago Dei, the LORD has plans for their life, and He is calling them out of the terrors of this world into eternal joy and you will shine the gospel light before them, showing them the way of everlasting righteousness. They may not take it. Shine anyway. There is no path to be found in the dark words of denunciation. Say, "I Believe…in the forgiveness of sins." Failures are not final. Say to yourself, "I Believe… in the resurrection." Grace abounds. Life has meaning and purpose, if "We Believe…in the Holy Spirit" who leads us to new life.

Finally, beliefs shape our DUTIES. "I Believe...Jesus Christ is coming to judge the living and the dead." That knowledge is not just for me. It is not just for me so I can make peace with God and then go about living in any direction I want. No, that belief compels me to talk with my neighbors, friends, family, loved ones, and even with foreigners and enemies. Jesus comes to save and to judge, to reward and to punish. What terrible judgments await those who do not believe! How rich will be those rewards for those who do! Since we believe the King is coming, let us be dutiful to make disciples of all the nations teaching them obey everything He has taught us, baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. 


Last year Jacob's Church Congregation put together more than 70 boxes for boys and girls in need around the world.

♦ Choir Corner by Melinda Kelly ♦

Praise the LORD. How good it is to sing praises to our God, how pleasant and fitting to praise him! Psalm 147:1

We would like to welcome Scott France to the Choir! Choir rehearsals have started, but there is still time to join, if you are interested. Rehearsals are held in the large room in the basement from 7:00 - 8:15. Please contact me, if you would like to sing with us. This is a great way to proclaim the glories of God to our congregation. (Any one in grades 9 to adult is welcome to join, whether you are a member of the church or not.)

One of our anthems for October is "Be Thou My Vision". Some scholars believe the Old Irish text was written in the 8th century; while others put it as late as the 10th or 11th century. The text is written in the form of a prayer for protection. God is referred to as a chieftain or High King of Heaven, which is typical of medieval Irish poetry. The words of the poem were later combined with an Irish folk song, given the hymn tune name "Slane", in 1919.

Organ tidbit:

The pipes of the organ are made of either wood or metal, which sound differently. The pipes are also divided into either flue or reed pipes. Flue pipes produce sound by the air being forced through the pipe, similar to a flute. Reed pipes produce a sound by the air making a reed vibrate, similar to a clarinet reed.

The main sound of the organ is made by the Principal pipes, usually made of metal and are the most important sound of the organ. (This is the most difficult sound for digital organs to duplicate.) Some pipes imitate instruments of the orchestra, such as the flute or strings. The reed pipes also imitate instruments, such as the clarinet, oboe or trumpet. Perhaps you have heard these pipes being played during the prelude!

Hello my brothers and sisters in Christ. I have been here in the states about 10 days now and want to bring you all up to date on the latest happenings.

A few weeks ago, another legally blind pastor was able to see again. We sent him for an operation and now he will be able to read his bible again. He is very happy.

I did a wedding and a funeral in the last month or so. The wedding is noteworthy because for hundreds of years, the Indians didn't get married. They only lived together. Now there is an awareness that they must leave that sinful lifestyle and get married to be able to please God and be blessed. The tide is changing and there are 4 more couples that want to get married when I get back. To God be the glory.

Eysbel is doing fantastic and is eating everything her mom throws at her. Consequently, she has gained 10 pounds since the January operation thanks to eating solid food. She is also doing great in school.

I recently repaired two handrails to help prevent people from falling down the steps that lead to a stream crossing bridge. It was extremely dangerous without a handrail. The old one rusted and fell off.

I have been able to spend some quality time with some of the 20 orphans that I chose to help. I enjoy being the stable male role model in their lives. One 10 yr. old girl, not an orphan, wrote me a nice Father's Day card. She loves me dearly.

While I am home in the states, I am making my rounds of the various churches that have an interest in the mission in Panama. I am blessed to have so many people supporting me. It is good to see old friends and family again. I'll be around till the end of September if you want to get together to hear all the stories of what God has done lately in Panama.
