Chapter One The Word of God – The Bible

"Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path" (Psalm 119:105)

As we begin this this process of infusion, we begin from a few points of mutual agreement. First, we affirm "all Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness" (2 Timothy 3:16). Can you say, I choose to believe the Bible is the inspired word of God (God-breathed). If not, take some time to write your doubts and share them with a wise Counselor who can help you sort through your struggle with this truth. Second, we affirm that the Bible, the word of God is inerrant. "Knowing this first of all, that no prophecy of Scripture comes from someone's own interpretation. For no prophecy was ever produced by the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit" (2 Peter 1:20-21). Can you say, I choose to believe that God's Word is inerrant? I can. If not, take some time to write your doubts and share them with a wise Counselor who can help you sort through your struggle with this truth.

Chapter Two Approaching His Word

"Therefore, we must pay much closer attention to what we have heard, lest we drift away from it"
(Hebrews 2:1)

There are many Scriptures that invite us to come near to the One so as to hear Him through His word and commune with Him. Consider

Romans 10:17: "so faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ."

Isaiah 30:21: "and your ears shall hear a word behind you, saying, "This is the way, walk in it," when you turn to the right or when you turn to the left."

Luke 11:28: "but he said, "Blessed rather are those who hear the word of God and keep it!"

Psalm 32:8-9 "I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go; I will counsel you with my eye upon you. Be not like a horse or a mule, without understanding, which must be curbed with bit and bridle, or it will not stay near you."

James 1:19-27: "know this, my beloved brothers: let every person be quick to hear, slow to speak, slow to anger; for the anger of man does not produce the righteousness of God. Therefore, put away all filthiness and rampant wickedness and receive with meekness the implanted word, which is able to save your souls. But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves. For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man who looks intently at his natural face in a mirror. For he looks at himself and goes away and at once forgets what he was like. But the one who looks into the perfect law, the law of liberty, and perseveres, being no hearer who forgets but a doer who acts, he will be blessed in his doing. If anyone thinks he is religious and does not bridle his tongue but deceives his heart, this person's religion is worthless. Religion that is pure and undefiled before God the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction, and to keep oneself unstained from the world."

Chapter Three Interacting with His Word

Let us remember that whether we listen to the Bible, read the Bible on a device, watch a teaching on the Word, or open a paper Bible – it is first and foremost His Word and we are called to interact with it, "my son, be attentive to my words; incline your ear to my sayings. Let them not escape from your sight; keep them within your heart" (Proverbs 4:20-21).

How do we start? First, for purposes of the Infusion Module we ask that you choose to infuse using a paper Bible. We make this request based on constructivist, active learning pedagogies. This is foundationally important because research in educational and cognitive psychology as well as neuroscience have empirically shown that active, interactive, learning is more powerful than passively receiving infusion. This pedagogical approach will be discussed in greater detail in the Digestion Module 3, as we learn to appropriate and extract more deeply from the truth of His Word.

Chapter Four Extracting from His Word

In the last chapter we shared ways to interact with the Word of God. Remember, there is not one perfect way to approach and interact with His Word. We have been reminded that it is necessary to approach His Word with an open heart, a receptivity, and a surrender to His Truth. We have also been reminded of the necessity of interacting with His Word, as "the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart" (Hebrews 4:12).

We come to extraction choosing to believe that God is greater than you and me. God is Sovereign (He is the supreme authority and has all things are under His control), Omnipotent (able to do anything, with unlimited power) and Omniscient (knowing everything). He desires to instruct us, sharpen us, transform us more and more into His image. "And we all, with unveiled face, beholding the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another. For this comes from the Lord who is the Spirit" (2 Corinthians 3:18).

How does the process of extraction facilitate God's transforming process? Let's review some Scriptures:



2 Timothy 2:15: "Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly handling the word of truth." Romans 10:17: "So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ. 1 Timothy 4:15: "Practice these things, immerse yourself in them, so that all may see your progress." What are some specific practices you can use to extract truth from God's Word to then apply to living in Christ? List them. The Bible talks about entanglements, bondages, the trappings, enticements and sin of our flesh. Let's consider a few verses: "Jesus answered them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, everyone who practices sin is a slave to sin" (John 8:34). Chapter Five Keeping His Word

The previous chapters have set forth a strategy for infusing the Word of God. A strategy based on cultivating a desire to open His Word to approach His throne of grace and spend time cultivating relationship with Creator-Savior. We have:

- Developed a right-understanding of the Bible God's Word
- Approached in humility and openness ready to receive
- · Touched and tasted in interaction with God's active, living, transforming Word
- · Extracted through listening, gleaning, and prayerfully waiting on the Lord

Now we come to keeping (guarding, protecting) the truth of His Word through implementation and execution of the riches of His Word through obedience to our Lord – Jesus, the Christ.

'Why do you call me Lord, Lord,' and not do what I tell you? ⁴⁷ Everyone who comes to me and hears my words and does them, I will show you what he is like: ⁴⁸ he is like a man building a house, who dug deep and laid the foundation on the rock. And when a flood arose, the stream broke against that house and could not shake it, because it had been well built. ⁴⁹ But the one who hears and does not do them is like a man who built a house on the ground without a foundation. When the stream broke against it, immediately it fell, and the ruin of that house was great."
