



LIFE APPLICATION QUESTIONS

LEVITICUS CHAPTERS 1-27

The book of Leviticus is focused on the worship of a Holy God and the children of Israel, and hence us, living a holy life. Read Leviticus Chapters 1-7 and note the different types of offerings. What are your gleanings from these offerings? How can you apply your gleanings to your life in Christ and God's desire for you (and I) to be holy as he is Holy (1 Peter 1:16)?

Read Leviticus Chapters 8-9. What can you glean from the ordination of the priests and the work of the priests? Did you know that God considers His children to be priests? Read 1 Peter 2:9 "but you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for his own possession, that you may proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light." What does it mean to be a royal priesthood, as God's own possession? How can you, specifically, reflect this in your life?

Read 1 Peter 2:5 “you yourselves like living stones are being built up as a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ.”
How is God working in your life, specifically, building you up as a spiritual house?

In Leviticus Chapter 10, there was punishment from God to Nadab and Abihu for offering strange fire during worship. Worship is important to our God. How will this make an impact on your worship of Him? What lessons can you learn from this Chapter?

Read Chapters 11-19. In Leviticus the laws are given by God in detail for His Chosen people. How does that translate into your relationship with Him today?

What awareness of God's nature and God's perspective through the laws of the Old Testament have you freshly developed?

Read Leviticus Chapter 20. God declared punishment for disobedience. How do the consequences of disobedience manifest today in our lives as Christ-followers?

Please be specific and provide some examples from your own life.

Read Leviticus Chapters 21-22. What can you extract from these chapters that can help you live a more holy life? What is important about worthy and unworthy offerings in terms of your life, as an offering to the Lord? Please be specific.

Read Leviticus Chapters 23-27. The declaring by God for the Year of the Jubilee is a lesson in trust. Trust in the number of crops provided in the sixth year for coverage during the seventh year which crops are not planted. How may you apply this trust in God in your life? How is God's redemptive grace apparent in these Chapters? Please be specific.
