

REGISTERING FOR PEARSON VUE EXAMS

1. Go to <http://www.pearsonvue.com/military>
2. Click "Schedule an exam at a military test center."
3. Select your Program and Exam category.
4. Set the location as U.S. and under Armed Forces Europe & Other Installations list, select your testing site. (Note: All UMGC NTCs start with US Military NTC UMGC.)
5. Proceed with registration; select a day and time of availability.
6. Pay for the exam and print the voucher. Bring it with you on testing day.

INCIRLIK AB TESTING CENTER

A variety of testing is offered on Incirlik AB, both military tests and civilian tests.

AF Military Testing is offered through the Education Center.

Call 676-3277 or email 39fss.fsde@us.af.mil to schedule a test date*. All members must be in the uniform of the day when taking military tests at the Education Center.

Armed Forces Classification Test (AFCT) & Defense Language Aptitude Battery (DLAB) Mondays @1300

The AFCT is the equivalent of the ASVAB for service members (regular, guard and reserve components). The DLAB measures your ability or aptitude to learn and understand language by being able to recognize rules, structures and the various components of language. Both tests are about 2 hours long.

***Career Development Course End of Course Exam** **Tuesdays and Thursdays @0900 and 1300**

All test requests for CDC testing must go through the Unit Training Manager who will either schedule you or forward the request to the Base Training Manager OR Test Control Officer for scheduling.

Professional Military Exam

Tuesdays and Thursdays @0900 and 1300

You must order your test from Air University before requesting a test date. You must provide the confirmation from Air University that you have ordered your test and the date and time you would like to schedule your PME exam. We will not schedule anyone for a test unless their test has been ordered through Air University.

Defense Language Proficiency Test (DLPT) **Every Wednesday @0900**

The DLPT is comprised of two modalities (reading and listening) and you have up to 3 ½ hours for each exam. Foreign Language Proficiency Bonus (FLPB) pay requests will be submitted only after we receive the signed AF Form 2096 and Secretary of the Air Force agreement letter. See the Education staff for more details.

Air Force Officer Qualification Test (AFOQT) **Fourth Friday of the month @ 0900**

(may change due to USAFE family days, federal holidays, 39 ABW training days)

The AFOQT is required if you apply to any AF commissioning program. Allow at least two weeks from date of testing to receive your test results to include in your commissioning package.

***Weighted Airmen Promotions Test (WAPS)** **Out of cycle session – as needed**

WAPS out of cycle test sessions are conducted up to twice monthly during non-test window times if needed. Contact your Unit WAPS monitor to coordinate a test date with the ETS Test Office.

*Test date must be scheduled through unit representative.

Currently testing is conducted as follows:

-- CLEP/DSST testing every Mon 0930 & 1300; Thur 1800; Sun 1530.

-- Pearson Vue testing every Tues 1000-1600. (subject to change w/o notice)

CLEP & DANTES TESTING TIPS

- A. GUESS! Fill in every blank. There is no penalty for wrong answers; no points will be deducted.
- B. There are approximately 120 multiple-choice questions.
- C. You have 90 minutes to complete the test (120 minutes for some tests requiring an essay).
- D. Take the last five minutes to check your answers for accuracy and to ensure none were left blank.
- E. If an exam is failed, you must wait three-months to take that particular exam again. You can still take any other exam during this time. If you chose to re-take the failed exam, you must pay for it.

REGISTERING FOR CLEP EXAMS

In order to take a CLEP test, examinees are required to set up an account with College Board and register for the exam as follows:

1. Go to <https://clep.collegeboard.org/> to register and pay (if applicable).
2. Select chosen exam and add to cart. (Note: All active duty candidates are eligible for DANTES funded testing for their first attempt at each exam). To register as a DANTES funded candidate, you will need to log in and create a profile. Make sure you select: I am eligible for DANTES funding.
3. Request transcripts to be sent. If enrolled in a school, search and select your school. Transcripts for active duty service members are automatically sent to DANTES. CCAF code is 6139. By selecting a school, two free transcripts will be sent.
4. At the end of the process, print your voucher and bring it to the NTC on testing day.
5. Reserve your seat — create an account in the UMGC reservation system: <https://ntc.asia.umgc.edu/EuropeNTC/Web/>
6. Choose your location and select a day and time to take your test.
