








WHAT IS A PRECINCT CAUCUS?

A “caucus” is a political meeting of a group of like-minded people. Every two years, Republican Precinct Committee members host meetings for voters living in their respective voting precinct or neighborhood. At the caucus, they put into words issues and concerns they have for our county, state and nation.

- Platform Planks: Timeless Truths that will always inform and direct our party and our country regardless of current events and circumstances, changing strategies, goals, and leadership.
- Resolutions: Timely statements addressing specific situations as direction to our elected officials are considered.
- Bylaws: These are the rules by which the Lincoln County Republican Party and the Wyoming State Republican Party operate.

WHO CAN ATTEND A PRECINCT CAUCUS?

The only qualifications for attending your precinct's Caucus are...

- You must reside in the precinct.
- You must be registered as a Republican by January 23, 2024, to participate.

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT TO ATTEND A PRECINCT CAUCUS?

The precinct caucus is the grassroots in action. Often Americans feel they have no input into how their government works. This is partly because our great country is spread over such a large area with so many different communities and points of view, that is why precincts are so important. Issues that concern you also concern your neighbors. When you put your voices together and express your opinion a ripple effect is sent up throughout the entire system. If you want your voice to be heard, the best place to begin is at your precinct caucus.

Caucus attendees also choose who will represent their Precinct at the County Convention, which will be held March 7th at the Thayne Community Center. The following is a list of the locations of the Precinct Caucuses and the number of delegates that will be elected from each Precinct. Please ensure that the delegates and alternates you elect can attend the County Convention on March 7th.

SAMPLE RESOLUTION

AMERICAN VETERAN PROPERTY TAX RELIEF RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Present law allows for a \$3,000.00 deduction off of the assessed valuation of an American Veteran's primary residential property; and

WHEREAS, With all things in life, changes must be made to ensure the continuance of life, liberty, and happiness; and

WHEREAS, The tax situation in this state has risen to the extent that it has become a burden for American Veterans and their families; and

WHEREAS, These American Patriots have, in many cases, placed their lives on the line for the continuance of life, liberty, and happiness for others

WHEREAS, A measure to increase the annual American Veteran Property Tax Deduction will alleviate some of the stress, angst and possibility of self-inflicted harm to those who unselfishly served our Nation and their neighbors.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, The Wyoming State Legislature amend the existing State Statue governing the American Veteran Property Tax Deduction from a total deduction of \$3,000.00 of assessed valuation to a deduction of \$16,500.00 of assessed valuation, and that henceforth the legislation be adjusted each year to the annual Index for Inflation.

LINCOLN COUNTY REPUBLICAN PARTY

There are 15 precincts in Lincoln County. Each precinct is entitled to at least one committeeman and one committeewoman who are automatic delegates to the County Convention. Some precincts are entitled to more – the number depends on the number of votes cast for the Republican candidate for U.S.

Representative in the previous general election.

Each Precinct will elect a number of delegates and alternates in addition to those precinctmen and –women who are automatic delegates.

Number of Convention Delegates

- Kemmerer – 6 automatic delegates + 6 elected & 12 alternates
- Diamondville – 2 automatic delegates + 1 elected & 3 alternates
- Frontier – 2 automatic delegates + 1 elected & 3 alternates
- Opal – 2 automatic delegates + 1 elected & 3 alternates
- La Barge – 2 automatic delegates + 1 elected & 3 alternates
- Afton In – 4 automatic + 5 elected & 9 alternates
- Afton Out – 2 automatic + 2 elected & 4 alternates
- Alpine – 4 automatic + 5 elected & 9 alternates
- Bedford – 2 automatic + 2 elected & 4 alternates

Number of Convention Delegates

- Etna/Freedom – 4 automatic + 5 elected & 9 alternates
- Grover – 4 automatic + 2 elected & 6 alternates
- Fairview/Smoot/Osmond – 6 automatic + 6 elected & 12 alternates
- Thayne – 4 automatic + 2 elected & 6 alternates
- Cokeville – 2 automatic + 2 elected & 4 alternates
- Star Valley Ranch – 6 automatic + 6 elected & 12 alternates
