

LINCOLN Resolution Regarding Publicly Funded Lobbying

WHEREAS, public, tax-payer funded political subdivisions of the state have a vested interest in increasing the size and scope of their organization, and

WHEREAS, these public, tax-payer funded public service subdivisions have a vested interest in increasing the size, scope, and funding of their organization, and

Whereas, it offends the ordinary taxpayer that the state's County Commissioners, Clerks, Treasurers, Attorneys, Coroners, Assessors, Sheriffs, School Boards, and Municipalities budget taxpayer funds to lobby the Legislature for more taxpayer funds and against property tax relief and reform, for one example, and

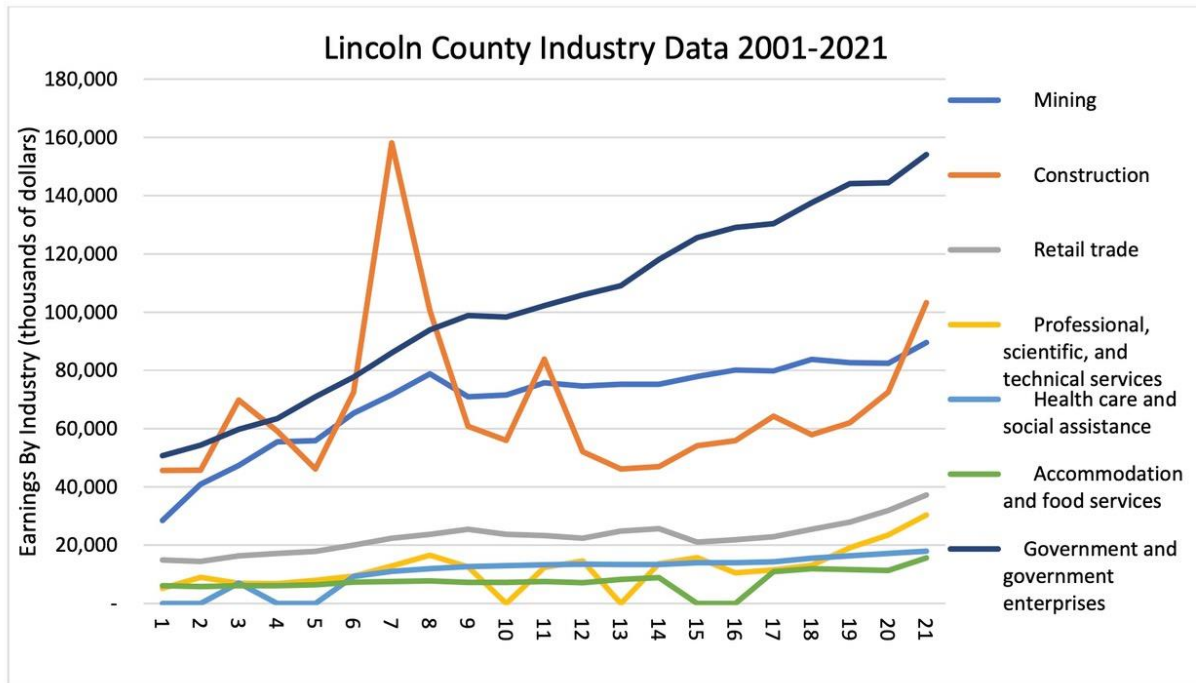
Whereas, it further offends the ordinary Lincoln County taxpayer that government and government enterprises enjoy the highest "Earnings by Industry" in Lincoln County, and

WHEREAS, the interest of these taxing entities and public service providers are often times in direct conflict to the interest of the residents whose taxes fund them, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Lincoln County Republican Party opposes the use of taxpayer monies to fund these administrative agency advocacy organizations, and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Lincoln County Republican Party supports a prohibition on the use of taxpayer monies to fund public service lobbyist activities.
