

A RESOLUTION TO BAN FUNDING FOR UNITED NATIONS CHAPTERS IN WYOMING PUBLIC SCHOOLS

WHEREAS, the primary mission of public schools in the State of Wyoming is to provide students with a high-quality education focused on academic excellence, civic responsibility, and American constitutional principles; and

WHEREAS, public school funding is derived from Wyoming taxpayers and should be allocated toward core educational priorities including literacy, mathematics, science, career readiness, and civics education; and

WHEREAS, chapters, programs, or affiliated organizations operating under the authority, sponsorship, or branding of the United Nations may promote global governance frameworks or policy perspectives that are not aligned with the sovereignty of the United States or the priorities of the State of Wyoming; and

WHEREAS, decisions regarding curriculum and extracurricular activities in Wyoming public schools should remain under the control of local school districts, parents, and state education authorities; and

WHEREAS, the use of public funds should reflect transparency, accountability, and alignment with state educational standards and community values;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. No state funds, district funds, or other public monies allocated to Wyoming public schools shall be used to establish, operate, sponsor, or financially support any student organization, chapter, program, or initiative formally affiliated with or chartered by the United Nations.
2. This prohibition shall include, but not be limited to, funding for materials, membership dues, travel expenses, conference participation, or administrative support connected to such organizations.
3. Nothing in this resolution shall prohibit the academic study of the United Nations, international relations, or global history as part of approved curriculum standards.
4. Local school districts shall review existing extracurricular programs to ensure compliance with this resolution within [specified timeframe, e.g., 90 days] of its adoption.
5. This resolution shall take effect at the beginning of the next fiscal year following its adoption.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution be transmitted to the Wyoming Department of Education, all Wyoming public school districts, and appropriate state officials.
