New Member Guide

Welcome to our shooting family!

Our goal.

To foster an attitude of safety, responsibility, and community while having fun with shotguns.

Who can join?

The Nueces 4-H Trap and Skeet Club is open to all Nueces County youth who are age 9 and in at least the 3rd grade, through age 18 and finishing their 12th-grade year.

What are the requirements to join?

There are three things that need to happen before new shooters can join our club. Additionally, there are two requirements to continue membership in the Nueces 4-H Trap and Skeet Club.

Before joining each new shooter must do the following...



1. Shooter's family must become members of the Corpus Christi Gun Club (CCGC). This is the facility where we hold all our practices and our annual club fundraiser shoots. Visit the club's website at www.corpuschristigunclub.com and click on the membership tab for more information and to get a copy of the CCGC New Member Application. Their application is also located at the end of this guide. Your application will need two sponsor signatures from existing CCGC members. Feel free to ask any of our club managers or coaches to sign your application. You will also be required to take an orientation class through the CCGC upon submitting your completed application. See CCGC management to schedule this class.
2. Each shooter must complete a Texas Parks & Wildlife Department (TPWD) Hunter Education Course. A course is usually held at the gun club before shotgun season starts but is not guaranteed. Take the class at your earliest opportunity.



Visit <https://tpwd.elementlms.com/course-category/hunter-education-classroom-course/> for upcoming courses. You will need to provide a copy of your shooter's Hunter Education card to one of the managers upon course completion.



3. Each shooter and adult volunteer must register with Texas 4-H by going to <http://texas.4honline.com>. At the end of this guide, you will find instructions for new and returning family enrollment. Our club's name is "*Nueces 4-H Trap & Skeet Club*" and our project is "*Shooting Sports*". If you have completed 4HOnline registration for your shooter for another 4-H club, you will need to call Chris Owens at the Nueces County Extension Office at 361-767-5220 and ask her to add your shooter to our club's roster.

After joining:

Each shooter is required to participate in the following two shooting events.

1. Nueces 4-H Trap and Skeet Whiz Bang Shoot - usually held the first weekend of May.
2. Texas 4-H State Games - usually held in the middle of July.

Shoots may seem scary to new shooters, but they are so much fun, and shooters of all abilities participate.

What equipment does your shooter need?

You and your shooter will be introduced to a whole new vocabulary about guns, gear, tools, etc. Just a warning, this is not a cheap sport! The club does its best to assist in lowering the cost to participate, but it is significant. The following is a general recommendation to get you started.

1. GUNS/SHELLS/CHOKES

- a. GUNS- You will see a variety of gun styles being used in competition and they all come with different price tags. Before you get carried away with a brand, gauge, and style remember the most important factors. It needs to fit your shooter, and your shooter needs to be able to handle it for long periods of time. Newer, younger shooters tend to start out with semi-automatic 20 gauges. They are lighter, with less recoil. Your shooter will shoot a minimum of 150 targets at competitions, sometimes up to 450 targets. They will get tired fast. The downside of semi-automatics

are lots of moving parts that can and do break, plus lots of cleaning. Ultimately the best gun to end up with is a 12 gauge over & under. These are the guns that most new shooters graduate to after they've competed for a few seasons. The club has loaner guns that the shooters can check out to see what fits, if they like the sport, and make the commitment to stick with it. All before you make the investment to purchase a gun for them.

- b. SHELLS- One round of shooting is typically 25 targets, and shells are sold in boxes of 25. You can never have too many shells! Your shooter will be going through a lot of boxes of shotgun shells. Take advantage of bulk orders through our club and our club's Shell Program which will be discussed later in this guide.
- c. CHOKES- If your gun requires chokes, at the very least, for semi-automatics you will need one Modified (M) choke and one Skeet (SK) choke, for over & under guns you will need two Skeet (SK) chokes, one Modified (M) choke and one Improved Cylinder (IC) choke.

2. SAFETY GLASSES

To get started, basic clear safety glasses will do. Down the road, you might want to consider shooting glasses with colored lenses. They can be a lifesaver on sunny mornings or cloudy days. The biggest key is to make sure the glasses fit properly on your shooter's face.



3. HEARING PROTECTION

Again, just starting, any ear protection will suffice. You will see other shooters with custom-fit earplugs, they are worth the investment. Most shooters like the plugs with a filter so they can hear normal sounds but a muffled shot. Headphone-type hearing protection can get in the way of proper gun mounts and foam earplugs can fall out easily.

4. SHOOTING VEST OR SHELL POUCH

Most beginning shooters start with a pouch because they cost less and are easily found at your local sporting goods store. Most generic shooting vests tend to fit improperly and will get in the way of your shooter's ability to mount their gun properly. Vests tend to hold more shells than pouches. If your shooter commits to this sport after a season or two, we recommend ordering a shooting vest made to their measurements. Ultimately, what your shooter is comfortable wearing should guide your purchase.

5. SHOOTING BAG

Many new shooters start out with an old backpack to carry all of the above. A shooting bag designed specifically for the purpose of carrying all your gun stuff will save time, lost items, and disorganization.



Practices and Meetings

Our meetings run from January/February through July/August. Meetings are held on the first Tuesday of every month at the Corpus Christi Gun Club starting promptly at 7:00 pm. We strongly encourage shooters and parents alike to attend these meetings to learn about upcoming events, shoots, etc.

Our 4-H certified coaches hold practices during our season every Tuesday evening starting at 5:00 pm, and every Sunday afternoon starting at 2:00 pm. Your shooter is encouraged to participate in as many practices as possible. Additional practice days/times may be added as the coaches see fit. The availability of additional practices will be discussed at meetings and/or made known via the manager email/Remind app. As a member of CCGC you are also encouraged to practice with your shooter as much as possible on your own as well.

Competition Events

Your best place to find 4-H competitions is on www.iClays.com and emails from our club managers. There are also other types of shoots your shooter can participate in: Fun Shoots, Charity Shoots, and Registered Shoots sanctioned by the National Sporting Clays Association (NSCA), Amateur Trapshooting Association (ATA), or National Skeet Shooting Association (NSSA).

You can choose how many, how far you want to travel, and what events your shooter would like to shoot depending on your schedule, finances, or comfort level.

Your shooter will have the opportunity to compete in the following events depending on the host club putting on the shoot. They will have the opportunity to practice most of them at our club. Your shooter will be encouraged to sign up for all events at a competition. They won't get better by avoiding them!

- SKEET – most competitions
- TRAP - most competitions
- WHIZ BANG - most competitions
- SPORTING CLAYS - not all clubs have a sporting clays course. For those that do, you will need a way to haul all your gear around it.
 - Trailer your own golf cart, Polaris, or other ATV to the shoot

- Rent a golf cart from the hosting club (if available), usually at around \$100/day
 - Acquire a gun stroller, wagon, or human pack mule.
- TRAP DOUBLES - usually only at the San Antonio Rodeo shoot and the Texas 4-H State Games
- SKEET DOUBLES - usually only at the Texas 4-H State Games
- 4-H shooting sports is home to some of the nicest, kindest, and most helpful families you will ever meet. If you have any questions, do not hesitate to ask someone. We have all been in your shoes and remember what it's like when you first start.

Shell Program

The club subsidizes the cost of the practice shells to eligible members. We know the cost of shells correlates to the amount a shooter practices. This program is designed to encourage shooters to practice as much as possible by offering shells at a discounted price. The exact details are subject to change due to ammo availability and cost. The club will go over the specifics at the first meeting of the year.

Volunteers and Community Service

We need volunteers! It is OK if you know nothing about shooting! We need volunteers to help put on our annual shoots, provide club amenities at other shooting events, and assist in club activities.

Our club also gathers as a group to help in our community. Ideas, suggestions, and participation are greatly appreciated and encouraged!

**ASSUMPTION OF RISK
GENERAL RELEASE, WAIVER, AND INDEMNIFICATION AGREEMENT**

Please read carefully before signing.

In consideration of the privilege of entering upon Corpus Christi Gun Club (CCGC) land for any reason, including to participate thereon in target shooting and/or other recreational activities, I, the undersigned, on behalf of myself, my heirs, legal representatives and assigns, hereby voluntarily and knowingly assume all risks and waive and release all claims related thereto, and agree to indemnify CCGC, all as provided herein.

I acknowledge that target shooting has inherent risks, hazards and dangers for anyone that cannot be eliminated. I UNDERSTAND THAT THESE RISKS, HAZARDS, AND DANGERS INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO:

1. The risk of handling firearms and being near others that have firearms in their possession.
2. The risk of **ear damage** from noise.
3. The risk of **eye damage**.
4. The risk of injury and/or damage to my property from ammunition, clay targets, clay target pieces, and shot from other guns.
5. Walking in rugged country, including encounters with wildlife, animals and insects.
6. Inclement weather conditions.
7. Risk of injury from animals on premises including but not limited to other shooters' pets.
8. Risk of sickness or death related to any communicable disease acquired while on CCGC premises.

EYE AND EAR PROTECTION IS REQUIRED AT ALL TIMES AT CORPUS CHRISTI GUN CLUB
SHOT SIZE LIMITED TO 7 1/4, 8, OR 9 SHOT.

Failure to comply with shot size limits or other safety rules can result in loss of privileges to shoot at the CCGC.

I understand the risks, hazards, and dangers as described above and have had the opportunity to discuss them with the manager of CCGC. I understand that these activities may require good physical condition and a degree of skill and knowledge. While CCGC will make reasonable efforts to do their best to provide a safe environment, they cannot guarantee the cleanliness of every surface members may come in contact with. I understand it is my responsibility to bring and use my own hand sanitizer and disinfecting wipes on a frequent basis and I am responsible for the results/outcome of my own social distancing behaviors. I AM VOLUNTARILY ENTERING ONTO THE PREMISES AND USING THE SERVICES OF CCGC WITH FULL KNOWLEDGE OF THE INHERENT RISKS, HAZARDS, AND DANGERS INVOLVED AND HEREBY ASSUME AND ACCEPT ANY & ALL RISKS OF INJURY, PARALYSIS, SICKNESS, OR DEATH.

Accordingly, I hereby assume full responsibility for all risks or any and all claims, actions, losses, damages and expenses for bodily injury, sickness, or death and property loss or damage incurred by me or arising out of or in connection with my entry, presence, or activities upon CCGC land, and knowingly and voluntarily expressly release CCGC, its directors, officers, members, employees, volunteers, and agents from all liability and claims arising out of such matters whether due to the acts or omissions (including the active or passive, sole, or concurrent, alleged or actual negligence or other fault) of CCGC, its directors, officers, members, employees, volunteers, and agents or any other person or entity, and I FURTHER AGREE TO INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS CCGC, THEIR DIRECTORS, OFFICERS, MEMBERS, EMPLOYEES, VOLUNTEERS, AND AGENTS FROM LOSS, DAMAGE, LIABILITY, CLAIMS, OR EXPENSE (INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO, ATTORNEY'S FEES) ARISING IN ANY MANNER OUT OF OR IN CONNECTION WITH MY ENTRY, PRESENCE, OR ACTIVITIES UPON CCGC LAND. I FURTHER AGREE THE FOREGOING INDEMNITY AND HOLD HARMLESS SHALL APPLY REGARDLESS OF THE ACTIVE OR PASSIVE, SOLE OR CONCURRENT, ALLEGED OR ACTUAL NEGLIGENCE OR OTHER FAULT OF CCGC, THEIR DIRECTORS, OFFICERS, MEMBERS, EMPLOYEES, VOLUNTEERS, AND AGENTS, OR ANY OTHER PERSON OR ENTITY.

I agree to abide by all safety rules, whether written or oral.

I have read and clearly understand and voluntarily sign this waiver and release agreement.

I declare that I am 18 years of age or over, can legally own a firearm in the state of Texas and I have never been convicted of a felony or a crime of violence.

WELCOME TO TEXAS 4-H

Texas has more than 550,000 youth who are involved in 4-H experiences each year and we are pleased that you have decided to join 4-H! Here is some information about our enrollment process and how we need your partnership in getting your membership entered and approved. All membership records change to an inactive status in August. The Texas 4-H year officially starts on September 1 but enrollment opens on August 15th. Enrollment procedures and payment method options vary in each county, so check with your local county office for more information.

Youth Club Member Participation Fee

\$25.00 August 15 - October 31st
\$30.00 November 1 to the completion of 4-H year
(clover kids are free)

Adult Volunteer Application Fee

\$10.00

About 4HOnline!

- 4HOnline is the official registration system for adult and youth members directly involved with 4-H.
- 4HOnline is a partnership between the 4-H family and the local county office. (counties.agrilife.org)
- 4HOnline is a secured system that is in compliance with the PCI Security Standards Council. Texas 4-H nor 4HOnline shares or sells any personal information to third party vendors without your knowledge or permission.
- 4HOnline is based on "zero-based enrollment." Each year at the start of the enrollment cycle all 4-H membership in Texas goes to zero and everyone must re-enroll. This process is based on federal accounting policies.

Did You Know?

- Most questions can be answered by calling the local county office. (counties.agrilife.org)
- An approved youth or adult member record means a person is officially enrolled with Texas 4-H.
- An approved youth or adult member record means a person can register for state or district level events.
- Adult volunteers are required to be screened through the Texas 4-H Youth Protection Standards program every three years. The screening process can take up to two weeks.
- A youth that is 8 years old and going into the 3rd grade must wait until September 1st to enroll for proper fees to be accessed. The Texas 4-H year officially starts September 1.

If the family has moved to a NEW county in Texas, contact local county office to have the FAMILY PROFILE moved to the new county. **Do not create a new profile.**

The system will send automatic notifications to the family email address in the system!

Family Profiles in 4HOnline

The first step to becoming a 4-H member or volunteer is creating a profile in the 4HOnline data management system. Texas 4-H uses the 4HOnline system to manage 4-H membership, events, projects, activities, and communications. All youth and adults who participate in Texas 4-H must have a 4HOnline profile.

4HOnline profiles are family-based, which means every family creates a "master" profile with its own login ID and password. A member file is then created within the family profile for each family member involved in Texas 4-H. A family profile may contain both youth and adults.

Once a family profile is created, it will exist for as long as members of that profile are involved in the 4-H program. New members may be added to the family profile at any time, and members who are no longer involved in 4-H may be archived. If someone in your family was active in Texas 4-H from 2010 to 2019, you likely already have a family profile in 4HOnline.

Use your existing login and password to access your family profile in 4HOnline. If you need assistance accessing your existing family profile, review the steps in this guide. If necessary, contact your local county Extension office for assistance.

Creating a NEW Family Profile

Only families participating in Texas 4-H for the first time should create a NEW family profile. Once created, family profiles are permanent. If you already have a 4HOnline family profile, do not create a new one. Contact your local county Extension office for assistance if you are not sure whether you have a family profile, or if you need assistance accessing it. To create a NEW family profile in 4HOnline, follow these steps:

1. Go to <http://texas.4honline.com>

2. Click "Don't have an account?" if you have never enrolled in 4-H before using 4HOnline.

Note: Your family profile must be associated with a valid email address. This will be your login and you will receive communications to this address. It will also be the email address where a password reset will be sent, if needed.

The email address you provide can only be associated with one family profile. If 4HOnline does not accept your email address, you may already have a 4HOnline family account. Contact your local Extension office for assistance.

3. Select "Texas" from the drop-down menu

4. Select "Texas 4-H and Youth Development" for the Institution

5. Select your county from the drop-down menu.

Note: When selecting your county, you are choosing the 4-H program in which your family will participate. Read the rules and guidelines for more information:

Click "Continue".

6. Complete your family's information. Required fields are marked in red and must be completed to move to the next screen. If you have mistakenly chosen the wrong county just hit the back button to adjust it before moving on to the next screen.

Remember: Your family information must be associated with a valid email address. This will be your login and you will receive 4-H communications at this address. It will also be the email where your password reset will be sent, if necessary.

Click the "Create Account" button

Note: An email account can only be associated with one family profile. If you enter an email address that is already associated with a 4HOnline profile, you will see an existing family profile message. Click the "Confirm" button and continue to log in to the existing account. See instructions for logging into an existing [family account](#).

7. Enter your family's address information and click "Verify." The verification process may require you to select an appropriate USPS format. The local county Extension office may have authority to bypass this for rural areas.

If there is already another record in 4HOnline with a matching address, you may see this Duplicate Address screen:

Use the browser "back" button to return to the previous screen. Double-check the address you entered and try again. Be sure you have included the full USPS address and a unit/apartment number, if that is part of your address. If you receive the Duplicate Address message again, choose an account recovery method and contact your local county Extension office for assistance.

Opening an Existing Family Profile

If you already have a 4Honline family profile, you can access it by following these steps:

1. Go to <http://texas4honline.com>
2. Enter your email address (login) and password, then click "Sign In" to open your account

Note: If you do not remember the password associated with your family profile, you can use the "Reset password" function at the bottom of the screen. A temporary password and instructions will be sent to the email address associated with your family account.

If you do not remember the email associated with your family profile, contact your local Extension office. The local county office can confirm or change the email address in your family profile. If the county 4Honline Manager changes the email associated with your family account you will need to reset your password before logging in.

Remember: Your family profile must be associated with a valid email address. This will be your login and you will receive communications at this address. It is also the email address where a password reset will be sent.

Once you have logged in to your family profile, you may review the Member List, add new family Members, and complete 4-H enrollment and registration actions.

Family Profile Management

Each time you log in to your family profile in 4HOnline, your Member List will open as the home page. The Member List displays all family members for whom a Member record has been created. In addition to the Member List, your family profile contains family details, events, and saved credit card information.

You can view the information contained in your family profile. You can change or update email, phone, and address by clicking the "Edit" Button.

The County associated with your family's profile can only be changed by the local county office. If you want to change your county affiliation, contact your local Extension Office for instructions.

Events

You can view events that are open for registration to members of your family. To register for an event, click on the event name, select the Member who wishes to attend, click the "Register" button, then follow the instructions.

Credit Cards

The credit/debit card(s) used to pay for 4HOnline transactions are listed in the family profile. The card number is not saved in 4HOnline; only identifying information is retained. You can modify or delete card records by clicking on the card type. Only a family member can view or edit card information; it cannot be accessed by any 4HOnline Manager.
