exterior

- Remove cars, bikes, and trash containers from driveway and surrounding areas
- Remove or roll up garden hoses in front and back yards
- Remove children's toys, pet bowls and any yard equipment
- Have your outside yard areas neatly manicured and clutter free—colorful flowers or plants add appeal
- Have all pool and spas looking great with patio furniture displayed in an inviting manner
- Please remove any pool hose prior to our arrival

interior

- Less is More. Remove clutter in all areas. Magazines, newspapers, toys and pet bowls & beds
- The goal of any room is to create a beautiful and comfortable space. Buyers will imagine their family there
- Replace burned out bulbs and use bulbs of the same temperature (ALL Incandescent or ALL compact Fluorescent)
- Have TV's and monitors turned off. Fireplaces should be lit when possible
- Add decorator touches such as candles, fresh flowers and plants
- Please have kitchen free of clutter and remove photos and magnets from the refrigerator
- Clear countertops as much as possible. Remove things such as paper towels, shower items and trash cans
- Have towels neatly arranged or removed in all areas. Have beds made and master bedroom free of clutter

night photography

- Be sure that outdoor lighting, pool & spa lights are on and remove pool cleaning hose and toys
- Outdoor fireplaces/fire pits should be working. Light up your interior and exterior as if you were having a "party"
- Timing is crucial for night shoots. It is very important to have everything ready upon our arrival

Before We Arrive - lights, camera, action

- Open draperies and blinds, turn off ceiling fans and turn on as many lights as possible
- PETS: We love pets, but it would be helpful if you could arrange a safe place such as a garage during the shoot
