



FISO Athlete Advisory Board (AAB)

Overview

The Athlete Advisory Board (AAB) are the elite athlete representatives from each member federation country of FISO. Each country's National Athlete Council (NAC) provides up to two (2) delegates on the AAB. At least one (1) delegate from each country must be a woman.

Continental Representation

Each Continental Association of FISO Members has a Continental Athlete Council (CAC) that broadens communication between the continental association and elite athletes and serves as a source of opinion and advice on policies that effect obstacle sports on their continent. The Continental Associations of FISO operate independently of the AAB and from the World OCR Athlete Advisory Council (AAC) for representation at the continental level.

The continental association of World OCR are:

- OCR Africa
- OCR Americas
- OCR Asia-Pacific
- OCR Europe

Members

The AAB consists of voting members who are the Elite athletes representing their country. Each country's National Athlete Council (NAC) may nominate up to two (2) delegates on the AAB. At least one (1) delegate from each country must be a woman. Approval of nominations resides with the AAC.

Athlete Seats

Elite athletes may hold a seat on the AAB if:

- (1) within the ten (10) years preceding an election, they have represented their country in obstacle or related sports in the Olympic or Pan American Games, a World Championship, a Continental Championship recognized by the FISO, or an IPC-recognized World Championship in events on the Paralympic Games program; or
- (2) within the twenty-four (24) months before election, they have demonstrated that they are actively engaged in amateur athletic competition by finishing in the top half of elite national championships or team selection competition for the events listed in paragraph (1) above; or
- (3) hold a current elite license as defined by their NAC and approved by the AAC
