Subject: Kumeyaay & The Lambert Foundation - Possible Strategic Partnership...San Diego River Conservancy Act.

Eric,

Pleasure to meet you through this email. I'll be brief in my reasons for contacting you and allow for your own due diligence to determine if there is a reason for us to meet, along with Sheriff's Dept., assuming we'll have their full support and cooperation in ensuring not only the spirit of the San Diego River Conservancy Act, but the prioritization of its compliance.

This compliance long overdue and includes the City of Santee Inc. and the surrounding towns, neighborhoods, and communities that lie within the 1/2 mile of the Rivers Thread and on either side.

In full transparency, it is my intent to position my organization The Lambert Foundation (aka LambertHearts.org & The Hearts Ark) as a potential suitor and grantee of land trust that the State of CA plans to hold, for the purpose of Reestablishing the cultural and historic connections between the San Diego River, Old Town San Diego State Historic Park, the Military Presidio, and the Kumeyaay Nation.

As a result, providing the public with the opportunity to appreciate the state's historic beginnings. (b) Given the opportunities available, the state recognizes the importance of holding this land in trust to be preserved and enhanced for the enjoyment of present and future generations.

The State may argue that they should retain control, but nothing could be further from the truth. It goes without saying that the management of these sacred lands, is far more complex than what the State is equipped to manage or has successfully addressed, especially along the river water ways of San Diego.

That too, a topic for another discussion and not nearly as relevant as my second and final transparency. An act of kindness, showing my personal empathy and compassion towards a people's, who long ago were forced to leave their homes and be placed in reservations.

For that reason, should the State agree to grant the lands as described within the SD River Conservancy Act to The Lambert Foundation, my first order of business will be to gift IT back to its original people's, The Kumeyaay Tribe.

Although, it is my hope that the Kumeyaay may consider a piece of land, not accessible by vehicle, as the Primary HQ of The Lambert Foundation. The land and it's use, we'll within the written language of the Conservancy Act and steps ahead in terms of a carbon free footprint and in spirit, returning honor and tradition to the Kumeyaay people.

I admit, Eric, that I wrote far more than originally intended, but I guess my passion for making this come to fruition, is the best of me. I'll pause here and await your response.
