I love the song; day by day from the musical God Spell. Day by Day, the words say, dear Lord of thee three things I pray. To see thee more clearly, love thee more dearly, follow thee more nearly, day by day. The words are few, yet they say much. And isn't our recipe for being the church to ourselves and others as simple as constantly offering this prayer in our hearts to God as we follow Jesus?

I think of Luke 11 where Jesus reminds the disciples to pray the familiar Lord's prayer, it's in Matthew 6 as well. But in Luke eleven's account, Jesus expands on this prayer. While the words again are so familiar, they help us see God, love God, and follow Jesus more clearly. I love some of the phrases, lead us not into temptation, deliver us from evil, give us this day our daily bread. And then one phrase we've added over the years, thine is the power and the glory forever!

Dear friends, let's make sure day by day we look for ways to remember. God could stop things at a moment's notice. We're promised squat, except for one thing, God will never leave us or anyone. Shall we see him, love him, and follow him more nearly, so he will be visible to us and the world more clearly, day by day?

Outreach 2021 Clean up Buckets

The Outreach team will be collecting items from mid-January to mid-March. 2021
The estimated cost of a complete kit is \$75.

If you cannot afford to purchase an entire kit, you may donate any of the listed items or if you prefer, monetary donations.

Church World Services said Clean-up buckets are their greatest need right now.



Here is the list.

- 1. One 5 gallon bucket with resealable lid -(lid sold separately) (Can be purchased at Lowes or Walmart)
- 2. Four scouring pads
- 3. Seven sponges, including one large one
- 4. One scrub brush
- Eighteen reusable, lightweight dry cleaning towels (example -Handi-wipes)
- 6. One 50 oz. or two 25 oz. bottle of liquid laundry detergent
- 7. One 16-28 oz. bottle of liquid disinfectant dish soap
- 8. One 12-16 oz. bottle of household cleaner that can be mixed with water (no spray bottles)
- 9. One pack of 48 to 50 clothespins
- 10. Clothesline, two 50 ft. or one 100 ft.
- 11. Five dust masks
- 12. Two pairs of heavy-duty, waterproof dishwashing gloves (latex- free and non-surgical)
- 13. One pair of work gloves (cotton with leather palms or all leather)
- 14. 24-28 heavy duty or contractor type 30-45 gallon trash bags on a roll
- 15. One 6-9 oz. bottle of non-aerosol insect repellent

All items must be new.

All liquid items must be capped and securely tightened.
