Yes, a minister's life may be full of deadlines and demands, but how is that different from any ministry for anyone?

Friends, on this dawning of spring, can you and I give thanks for where God has each of us on the journey? True, not everything's worked out or making sense, or even fully defined. And here's sad news. It never will be.

When Jesus' disciples entered Jerusalem, they knew what might happen, but not how things would look. When the Israelites left their homeland, they were hoping they would be led to freedom, but they weren't exactly sure how and if it would happen. And when Jesus knew he was to be put to death, I'm sure even he wasn't sure how painful the events would be or how the crowd, some being his strongest supporters, would respond.

Yet all those persons overcame the uncertainties and gave thanks to God. They all found a sense of joy on the other side of sorrow. They all remembered God made them special, and their struggle was absolutely supposed to happen defining their journey further entrenching themselves close to God!

And so, we too are drawn into that relationship. Another life may be easier, less risks involved for sure. But it's not as rewarding or filling. So where are you and I in our life and faith? Are we grateful for where God has us? Are we grateful for who we are? Do we know God has our back no matter what, and will we not try to be anyone or anything else? To God let's just be us and let the rest in his hands. Everything will be all right! To God be the glory
