- 3. One wide tooth comb removed from packaging
- 4. One fingernail or toenail clipper removed from the package
- 5. One bath size bar of soap in the original package
- 6. ONE toothbrush in the original package
- 7. Ten standard size Band-Aids

All items get packed in a One Gallon Zip Lock Bag. No toothpaste needed. CWS adds that when shipping. Once again, we thank you in advance for your never ending generosity for those in need.
