

SHARING OUR FAITH AS BLACK ROCK

Either way friends, let's bring our kingdom alive by proclaiming what our Lord Jesus means to us! Who knows who we might bless by our words? Perhaps someone who hears your story will feel a light of Christ working and touching them they otherwise may not. A signup sheet at church, plus an Email invitation will go out. Please feel free to let the office know you'd be willing to be on the list to share on a Sunday morning and we will work those sharing into our service. Names will be collected from now through December 20 as we plan our first three months of the year. For each month thereafter, we'd like to have your names by the fourth Sunday so we can plug you into services, either in person or via video. For the Journey, the same deadline will apply as per normal Journey newsletter articles each month. If you don't feel comfortable going up front, you can certainly share from your seat . Also, if you'd like your story shared but don't feel comfortable sharing it verbally yourself, feel free to have it written down and we will have someone read the words for you in our theworship service. The hope is we will have at least one sharing each Sunday throughout the year.

Let's follow Jesus in 2021. I'm so excited to hear what he's been doing for all of us. I'm excited to hear stories about how our Lord is blessing us in the past, as well as right now. Be well dear friends' and may he always mean the world to us. After all, he is our world!
