### Look Who Just Came In My Door by Vivian Ziegler—

- The life of Anna N. Buckwalter. At age 94 Anna remembers growing up in the 1900, struggling through the Great Depression, working with Lancaster County, PA. Fresh Air program for 32 years, guiding tourists through "Amish Country" for 36 years, taxiing the Amish for 16 years and much, much more.
- <u>One- Sided Christianity by Ronald J. Sider—</u>The author talks about uniting the church to heal a lost and broken world.
- <u>Lonely No More by Karen Burton Mains</u> A woman's journey to personal, marital, and spiritual healing.
- <u>Papa, My Father by Leo Buscaglia</u>— A celebration of Dad's. The author describes his father as man who never acquired fame of fortune but who achieved great success as a husband and father.
- Tramp For the Lord by Corrie Ten Boom—The author served time in a German concentration camp for hiding persecuted Jews. After her release from the concentration camp she set out traveling around the world at the direction of God, proclaiming His message. She shares in this book what she learned during these travels.
- What Good Is God? By Philip Yancey The author travels the globe in search of an answer to his question. He meets with leaders of the underground church in China, with prostitutes, alcoholics, Bible college students in the U.S. and many others in search of the answer to this question.
- The Poisonwood Bible by Barbara Kingsolver—This novel is a story by the wife and four daughters of a fierce, evangelical Baptist who takes his family and mission to the Belgian Congo in 1959.
- <u>The Invention of Wings by Sue Monk Kidd</u>—This story is set in motion on Sarah's eleventh birthday in 1803, when she is given ownership of ten-year-old Handful, who is to be her handmaid.




