The time is ours? By Pastor Brandon

I'll never forget the congregational business meeting we held here in April of 2022. That day, two

remarkably interesting items were on the table. One of those we solved pretty unanimously and that was the property in not selling the lot across the street. But the one I focus on was our Worship and Fellowship team motion of changing the timing for worship. I was so fascinated in that discussion. I felt, as people shared their opinions, a true sense not just of love, but of genuine care everyone had different slants. People expressed not just their own interest but taking those opposing opinions into account.

As we eventually ratified the new summer schedule for the months, and are now back to our normal 10:15 time, this thought of time has stuck with me. No matter when we gather at church, early or later or even on a different day, the time is ours to come as we are, to experience God's love, to go out like Christ as our recent sermon series talked about. The time is ours to embody the words of Romans 12:1, to offer our bodies as living sacrifices to God in our spiritual act of worship as our late July series described. And as the fall hits, the time is ours as we readjust to our previous time of worship, while maintaining that love and care we have for one another preparing for our vote at the congregational business meeting in October as to how we will move forward with our timing for our worship and Sunday school.

Our Lord and his disciples also knew a sense of time as they journeyed through Jerusalem, as they ministered to people, as they met with crowds, as they gathered in the upper room, as they prayed together, as they were separated from each other, and eventually as they were locked in a room together after Jesus had been crucified. No matter the earthly time in those moments, the time was frozen, insignificant. It was theirs to do something with. It was theirs to honor and glorify God. It was theirs to meet together, pray together, worship together, serve together. No matter the time, God gave them opportunities to change the world around them.

And the same is true for our time. No matter our decision on the current issue facing our church of staying with our traditional time or moving permanently to the trial time from our summer schedule, one thing is sure. No matter the time, it's our time! It's our time given by God to do with what we can to continually form and be Black Rock Church. So let's make the most of it!

The Outreach Team is excited to announce our September 2022 project!

We have decided to do a "Blanket Sunday" for the entire month of September! We are so excited!

Each Sunday we will be using a small portion of the worship service to learn about CWS's Blanket program.

There will be envelopes for your special Blanket Offering in your bulletin and in a basket at the back of the sanctuary. You may put your name or envelope number on these if you want credit for taxes. We will collect the money and send it to Church World Service to purchase Blankets which they distribute as needed. Last year, CWS distributed 68,760 blankets to displaced and homeless persons, refugees, and disaster victims.

\$10 provides a blanket to a person in need.

\$50 blankets an entire family.

\$250 stocks shelters in preparation for freezing weather.

If you would like to give an offering in honor of someone (perhaps a shut in or a loved one), we have greeting cards that can be sent to that person to tell them you've given money in their honor so they can help **blanket the world in love**. We would also love to do a list naming anyone you want to give money in honor of or in memory of. We would have that list published as an insert in an October bulletin so others can see who you've honored or remembered.

Take a look at the Narthex Display, check out the posters on the doors, read your bulletin inserts, listen to the words as we share about the project, watch and listen to the videos about the blankets, and then listen to your heart. Listen to what God is asking each of us to do.
