

Growing Lavender

Provence Lavender needs FULL Sun, Well Drained Soil, and not alot of Water. (Lavender does not like rich soil so forget Miracle Grow, just plain sandy loam mix will do fine mixed with the soil from the area where you're planting your Lavender)

In the Ground:

Dig your forever home about 12 inches in diameter and 12 -15 inches deep. Do a water test by filling your freshly dug hole with water, let it drain 10 - 12 minutes, if water dissipates you are good to grow. If not, fill the bottom of the hole with gravel 3 or 4 inched deep then plant. Using gravel will help with drainage. Now fill with dirt and plant in a mound, and dress with mulch!

Keep the soil moist but not wet until the plant has time to establish roots, then ease back on the water. Multiple Plants should be 3 feet apart.

In a flower pot or Container:

You'll need a large container at least 12 wide x 18 deep filled with 3 or 4 inches of gravel. Use a sandy loam mix to put on top of the gravel and around the plant. Dress the top of the plant with much or gravel.

Keep plants moist but not wet for 4-6 weeks!

Trim in the fall.
