

In P.E, we were working on our quick reactions when catching a ball. Keep practising throwing and catching the ball quickly. Well done Reception!


In Computing this week, we have continued working on our coding skills. The children are becoming much more confident with this and they are getting better at knowing their left and right!





In Literacy, we have finished our work based on "I will never not ever eat a tomato" by Lauren Child. The children have been using their imaginations and creating new names for fruit and vegetables just like Charlie and Lola did. We have used this to publish our own fruit covers and blurbs just like Lauren Child. They all look amazing. The children's writing is really improving, so please keep working on this at home.

In Maths, we have been learning all about 3D shapes. At the beginning of the week, we recalled our knowledge of 2D shapes and have been looking for 2D shapes within 3D shapes. We have also been sorting shapes based on their faces, edges and vertices. At home, you could try to spot 3D shapes in the environment. At school, we managed to find a dice (cube), toilet roll holder (cylinder) and a ball (sphere). If you find any at home, please upload them to Tapestry.



Phonics:



This week, we have been recapping our phase 3 trigraphs – air, ure, ear and igh. We have been encouraging the children to find these sounds in words and read them as the trigraph. When the children are reading phonics books, encourage them to find the sounds that they know rather than sounding out each letter.

In topic, we have continued our learning about Minibeasts. The children were very excited when we got our very own caterpillars. We have learned about their life cycle and can't wait to see them turn into butterflies in the next few weeks. We have also learned about ladybirds, worms and bees this week.



Home Learning:

Last week, we sent home a worksheet for the children to complete ahead of Science Week. Please return it to school by Monday 25th March.

This task is a whole school engineering competition and it would be brilliant if all the children had a go at completing this. Everyone who does will be recognised and rewarded with a Respect Token and sticker.

The children have been asked the following question – If you were an engineer, what would you do?

Please encourage the children to draw the design independently and feel free to help them label/annotate.
