Phonics

Remember to sing lots of nursery rhymes and play rhyming games with your children as this helps to develop the early stages of phonics.

For children starting Reception in September

Use Twinkl phonics weekly PowerPoints to keep your child up-to-date with our phonics learning. There are 5 daily sessions per week, each with a PowerPoint which takes the children through the phonics sounds in a story, which the children enjoy.


