### Phonics

Use Twinkl phonics weekly powerpoints to keep your child up-to-date with our phonics learning. There are 5 daily sessions per week, each with a powerpoint which takes the children through the phonics sounds in a story, which the children enjoy.

Type "Level 3 Week 1" into Twinkl search bar

w/c 28<sup>th</sup> March (Week 2) - sounds y, z, zz, qu and ch
