In Literacy this week, we have been reading the book 'The Snail and the Whale'. We have introduced the children to a new concept of 'Wow' words (adjectives) and how adjectives are describing words. The children have had a go at writing some super sentences about mini-beasts that include adjectives as well as remembering to use capital letters and full stops. Fantastic Reception, we are so impressed.
