

Anglo-Saxons in Britain

- They will have found out about how the Anglo-Saxons came to rule Britain and the different lifestyle and customs that they brought with them.

Anglo-Saxons in Britain

- At Ufton Court, the children will have the opportunity to enhance their learning by taking part in lots of different activities.
- They will create Anglo-Saxon artefacts, explore the grounds of Ufton and put themselves in the shoes of people from the time that they have been learning about.

- Wake up, wash, dress

Dining facilities

- Fully catered 3 meals daily.
- Nutritious home cooked food.
- Special diets catered for if notified in advance.





Bedrooms

- Dormitory bedrooms sleep 3-10
- Staff bedrooms adjacent. Night lights in rooms and corridors.
- All bedding provided beds need to be made up on arrival.





Children's Kit list

- Suitable waterproof coat
- Wellies/boots + indoor trainers
- Slippers
- Gloves/hats
- Black tights + shoes for Feast girls AND boys
- Disposable camera NAMED
- Medication labelled
- Teddy!

Useful tips

- Make sure all articles are named especially disposable cameras, which all look very similar.
- Do not bring valuable items, mobile phones, or money.
- Ensure your child's bag is not too big/heavy and try to avoid suitcases on wheels – hard to get over the gravel and up stairs!
- Remember indoor shoes (with grip, NOT smooth soles,) and boots/wellies.
- Bring suitable clothing not 'best'.
- Spare carrier bags are useful for taking home muddy shoes/boots.
- No food items please, unless by arrangement for special diets, which should be notified well in advance of visit.
