In Year 1, we hope to take the children on 3 school trips.


In previous years we have visited Brooklands Transport museum, Whipsnade Zoo and Kew Gardens.







## **Phonics**

#### Phase 4

- · Consolidates phase 2 and 3 sounds.
- Teaches children to read and spell words with adjacent consonants (ccvc) e.g. 'Stop' (cvcc) e.g. 'Tent' (cvcc)
- They then begin to apply this to their own reading and writing.

## Phonics



This teaches children that the same sound can be spelt in different ways i.e. 'rain' and 'day' and that the same spelling can represent different sounds i.e. 'Meat' and 'bread' or 'cow' and 'low'.


Children separate words into syllables and can read and spell decodable two/three syllable words. They recognise an increasing number of high frequency words automatically.

# Reading

- o Identify which words appear again and again.
- Relate reading to own experiences.
- Re-read if reading does not make sense.
- Re-tell with considerable accuracy.
- Discuss significance of title & events.
- Make predictions on basis of what has been read.
- Make inferences on basis of what is being said & done.
- Read with pace & expression, i.e. pause at full stop; raise voice for question
- Know difference between fiction and non-fiction texts.

## Reading

Children's phonics knowledge will help with their reading. To support their reading at home you could use the reading record. This include all of the sounds.



## Homework

Given Tuesday - new homework and new reading books

Due Monday - reading records, books, homework

Daily reading - 5 times per week for a respect token

**Spelling** - please practise throughout the week. These match our phonics in school. The children are tested in schools on Mondays.

1 piece of Homework - Maths or English in blue homework folder will be given out weekly. Homework is designed to consolidate what the children have been learning in class.

**Brainbuilder** - There is 1 activity every half term. These are creative, engaging, child led. The children present/share their work with the class. We will try to offer suggestions and ideas for the learning.
