	<p><u>Reading</u> Please continue to read as much as possible and keep a log of your reading in your reading record or on paper if necessary.</p> <p>Please read at the right level for you. 	<p><u>Writing</u> Why not try some writing during your time at home. This could be related to any of our school topics or it could just be something you are interested in or writing for a specific purpose. For example, write a letter to a friend or write a book review.</p> <p>Keep using and practising the Year 5 objectives we have been learning such as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Expanded noun phrases</li><li>Parenthesis</li><li>Relative clauses</li><li>Modal verbs</li></ul> <p>Especially useful for grammar and punctuation is: Espresso Key Stage 2 English Grammar &amp; Punctuation (folder is 2<sup>nd</sup> row down). There are videos and activities here which children are familiar with.</p>
	<p><u>Maths</u> -Login to RM EasiMaths This is a new school resource for this home learning. We hope it will be useful to help keep children on track with their maths. Information on how to log in has already been sent home. Mrs Turner's class is working on fractions while Mrs Stanford's class is working on decimals. However, please use the resources for practise on any area of maths.</p>

	<p><u>Science</u>  Go to Espresso KS2 Science and look for the Earth and Space folder as this topic is next for Year 5. There are videos to watch, interactive videos and fact files to read. There is a worksheet on the phases of the moon. It would be great if Year 5 could all do this.</p>
	<p><u>History</u>  Our next topic will be Ancient Greece. We particularly look at how this civilisation has affected many areas of how we live today. Find out about this on the Espresso website.  The Ancient Greeks told stories through myths and legends. These include their own gods who lived on Mount Olympus plus a bogging array of mythical creatures – enjoy!</p>
	<p><u>PE</u>  There are some great videos on YouTube called 'Cosmic Kids' These are fun and engaging yoga sessions taught through different children's stories. You could also use gonoodle.com for short, fun movement and mindfulness videos. Also try BBC Super Movers.</p>
